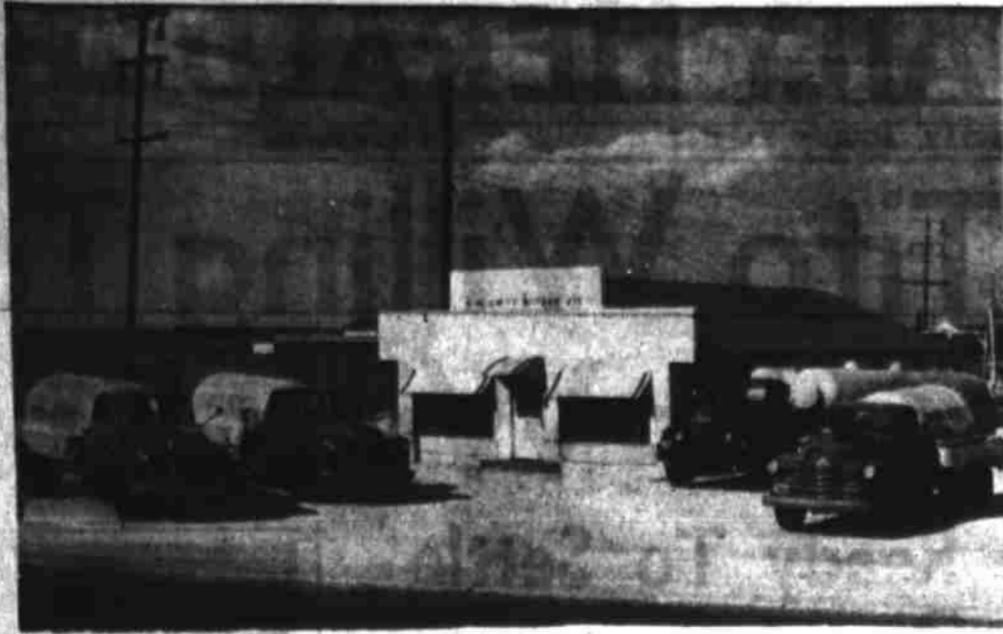

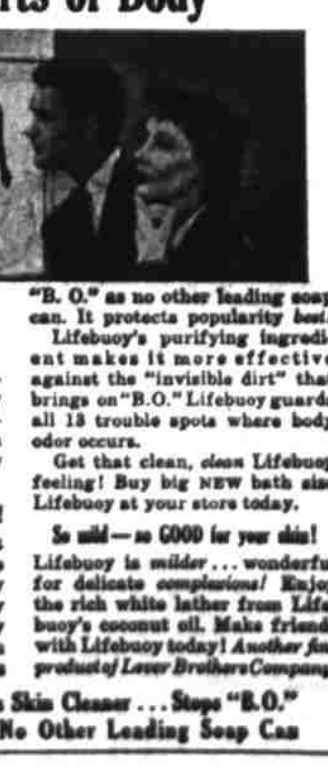

FLOOD CONTROL, HARBORS
House Puts OK On Texas Projects

WASHINGTON, Aug. 28. (AP)—Fifteen Texas flood control and water navigation projects are included in a House bill authorizing \$1,114,000,000 federal expenditures.

The measure passed yesterday, 202 to 1. Senate action this session is doubtful.

The Texas projects and the amount of authorization in each case include:

Texas — Sabine-Neches Waterway, vicinity of Port Arthur bridge, \$900,270, including \$441,000 for dredging and \$108,270 for field office changes; Galveston Harbor and Channel (sea wall) \$5,550,000; Gulf Interoceanic Waterway in South Galveston Bay \$300,000; Chocolate and Bastrop Bayous, no funds required; Freeport Harbor \$308,000; Little Bay \$29,800; Brazos Island Harbor \$5,060,000 including \$2,970,000 for channel and \$80,000 for small boat basin; Trinity River at Dallas \$2,100,000.

Flood control.

Projects, together with authorization amount, and in parentheses amount or previous authorization, if any:

Rio Grande Basin, comprehensive plan, \$34,000,000 (\$3,500,000).

Flood control surveys:

Texas—streams and larger tributaries flowing through the Austin-Washington, the Bastrop-Fayette, and Calhoun-Victories, the Middle Guadalupe Basin, and Navasota and the Copano Bay soil conservation districts.

LOCAL FIREMEN SEEK A PATENT ON NEW GARBAGE CAN HOLDER

Two local firemen have filed application for a patent on a sanitary garbage can holder.

Fire Chief H. V. Crocker and Fireman H. A. Moore submitted plans and specifications for the device to a Washington patent attorney Monday.

Identified as the Crockmore Garbage Can Holder, the new device consists of a revolving arm mounted to an upright post. The garbage can lid is attached to the arm which clamps it firmly in place on top of the can. Pressure on an automatic release causes the lid to rise and swing to one side away from the can. When locked, the holder clamps the can firmly to a recessed base.

Advantages of the device, as outlined by the inventors in the patent application, include protection of health by keeping the lid closed, stopping the breeding of flies and other germ carrying insects.

The device keeps garbage cans in an upright position as the container cannot be moved until the lock is released by hand. Dogs and cats cannot overturn or enter the container.

Cans are kept in proper places on property lines with both container and lid being protected from wind and storm damage. The device is neat and easily operated, the inventors say.

The two firemen first constructed the holder for personal use, but decided to seek a patent at the suggestion of friends. The first Crockmore holder is set up in the City hall fire station.

Govt. Offers Mediation In Hawaii Strike

WASHINGTON, Aug. 28. (AP)—The government has asked representatives of opposing sides in the 114-day old Hawaiian dock strike to come to Washington or New York for mediation talks.

Cyrus S. Ching, director of the U. S. Conciliation Service, called the striking union and Hawaiian stevedoring negotiating committee in Honolulu that he would "be happy" to meet with them in either city.

Ching said the pressure of other labor disputes makes it impossible for him to go to Hawaii now as union and management negotiations had asked.

Ching asked participants in the negotiations to make a new try at settling the dispute on their own in Hawaii.

He said if they are again unsuccessful at reaching an agreement they could come to the states and meet with him and other government mediators any time they choose.

Socialists To Be Ignored In New German Regime

RHEINFELD, Germany, Aug. 28. (AP)—Germany's conservatives, victorious in last week's elections, will spurn any co-operation with socialism.

Leaders of the first-place Christian Democrats said they were "obligated to abide" by the voters' "clear endorsement of the free economy."

The Social Democrats (Socialists), second in the voting, will be the main opposition party.

The Christian Democrats, who lack a clear majority, probably will combine with the right wing free Democrats to form a cabinet.

Leaders of the party met here Monday at the home of their chief, Dr. Konrad Adenauer, probable chancellor (premier) of the new cabinet.

LAREDO, Aug. 28. (AP)—The Laredo Times, in an editorial, said Latin America should have a Marshall Plan immediately.

"All of the money under the plan should be earmarked for at least 150 TVA projects throughout Latin America," the editorial said.

"This would develop agriculture, transportation, industry and mining. As a result of these projects, our factories would have a natural market, which would develop for the next 50 to 100 years.

"That growth would eliminate billions of dollars in needless over-stuffed armament installations. As a result, the taxpayers would save billions by the lessening of their tax load. The saving would allow us to put our energies into a more abundant life for all democratic nations and people."

The editorial also stated that: "In the event of a third world war, our greatest strength, outside of our own country, will come from the Latin American nations."
