

Are the South Plains Mall and the Civic Center cross town rivals or are they actually carrying on a long-distance love affair?

Examining the two facilities, you can find situations suggesting the two compete. Examine again, it appears the facilities are entirely different.

Both provide entertainment. The mall offers trade, art and sports shows. But so does the Civic Center.

While the attractions are the same, the means for attracting crowds are different. The mall uses entertainment to attract shoppers to buy, not so much the tradesman's goods, but the goods of its tenant stores. The Civic Center uses entertainment to attract people interested in buying what the trade show has to sell.

While there seems to be some simularities between the two, Mickey Yerger, executive director of the Civic Center, explained that the two cannot be compared. "The Civic Center is a public facility while the mall is privately owned."

On the other hand, general manager for the South Plains Mall, Richard Colby said he sees both facilities as entertainment centers, with a bit of qualification. "It's unlikely that the Civic Center will take away the entertainment at the mall."

If you're just out to see a trade

show, you'll probably find basically the same things at both places. The main difference is at the mall, what you see is free. At the Civic Center you pay an admission price, you'll probably get to see more of what you came

to see and you'll have a chance at a visitor. door prize.

If you're the tradeshow dealer. the differences are more obvious.

"When people come to the Civic Center to look at a trade show, they're likely to get a better deal because the dealer knows they are there to buy," Yerger argued. Dealers can expect to see less people than they would at the mall - but the ones they do see are more likely to buy.

While there is a small admission charge for trade shows, that charge is agreed upon by the dealers that sponsor the show, said Yerger. The dealer pays rent for the Civic Center and that in turn is passed to the Civic Center

At the mall, the dealer pays only to defray advertising costs. The relatively small cost allows dealers to sell products on the mall. "There is no cost to the dealer for air conditioning and maintaining the mall area, because we have to do it anyway," said Colby.

It costs the consumer nothing and for the tradesman there is wide exposure. On a weekend the mall attracts approximately 200,000 people while the Civic Center has drawn 100,000 people during the two months it has been open.

EMS, Hospital Not **On Same Wavelength**

Lubbock County Hospital District Officials are chafing at

Methodist Hospital's reluctance to work in a two-way communication system between LCHD ambulances and the Methodist Emergency Room.

But George Brewer, administrator of the private hospital says that such a system could leave the Hospital prey to staggering lawsuits.

The two-way radio link between ambulances and emergency rooms is part of a new communication package for the district-owned Emergency Medical System ambulances. St. Mary's hospital will implement two-way link-up in about 60 days, EMS administrator Stuart Haggard said.

LCHD higher-ups say that Methodist's reluctance has nothing to do with ambulance service or legal problems-they suggest that Methodist is biding its time to see "who will run the district" after the LCHD Board of Managers tentatively hired a outside management firm to run the district's financially-frustrated teaching hospital, being built in conjunction with the Texas Med School.

"That has nothing to do with it," Brewer said. The hospital administrator said that legal objections to the system were raised as early as last fall, in a meeting with then-LCHD executive director Harold Coston. who resigned under fire in February of this year.

"We told (Coston) the problems with a private hospital involving itself in legal liability by instructing ambulance drivers and attendants in the care of patients," Brewer said.

Brewer said that the two-way link takes on "heroic" proportions when considered in light of a television program called "Emergency"-which, interestingly enough, often crops up in LCHD discussion of the communications system.

But he distinguished the legal realities and the television fiction.

"There you have residents and interns and trained paramedics



working for a public hospital to answer questions and advice."

As a private hospital, Methodist would be more prey to liability for instructions radioed to EMS attendants-whether the instructions were erroneous or were erroneously carried out, Brewer argued.

"We do not have any control over EMS," the administrator declared, "We're not going to jump into this, no matter how heroic it may sound."

Privately, LCHD officials are concerned that Methodist-the city's largest hospital and the hospital that handles a great number of the very critical head injuries-may be dragging its feet, and hope that public reaction will push the private hospital to join the system.

The officials point to Methodist's Poison Control Center which allows the public to phone in for antidotes to poisons.

"That has been approved by the Lubbock-Crosby-Garza County Medical Society," Brewer distinquished, "It is a reading service, not an advisory service.

Brwer said that the topic of emergency room-to-ambulance communication would probably be discussed at a Methodist board of Directors meeting later this month, but declined to speculate whether any decision might be reached.

Until then, the hospital is studying the law and "will not change its direction or course." Brewer said. He did note that Methodist's financial contribution is not a major consideration, as previously published elsewhere.

We could raise the \$5,000. That's no problem," Brewer said,

Research Near Completion Studies Could Pull the Plug on Carter Plan

Mike Chovanec is walking across campus, muttering to himself.

He holds a copy of Federal Power Commission rulings he has checked out of the regional collection at the Tech library. They are not up to date, and like all third-year law students, like even lowly first-year law students, Chovanec knows the importance of up-to-date law.

Chovanec, a handy man with a pool cue and who has been known to lift a few waiting his turn at the table, knows he may have to seek current rulings elsewhere, because his report is not just for a class paper-it's for the governor.

Texas Gov. Dolph Briscoe, an ardent foe of President Carter's energy policy, requested reports on the presidential plan from the four major State universities-Texas Tech, the University of Texas, Texas A&M and the University of Houston.

"If any of these statements I've been making are inaccurate, I want to know about it," Briscoe told a press conference this week, as he dedicated building for Texas Tech's med school.

Briscoe said he wanted to utilize "The talent and brains" the academicans have to analyze the energy policy, particularly the controversial provisions regarding federal allocation of intrastate gas-natural gas produced in Texas for consumption in Texas, but which the Carter energy plans wants to put under federal authority.


He requested the presidents of the four universities order research into the plan as they see Twenty Texas Tech fit. professors were asked to participate in the project and have completed their preliminary draft.

The draft has been sent to the Governor's Energy Advisory Council, according to George Meenaghan, Tech dean or research, and is expected to be printed next week.


"It's in the process of finishing up," Meenaghan said of the general research, but he noted that Prof. Richard Hemingway at the law school, with whom Chovanec and other law students are working, is expected to complete his paper early next week.

Research into energy law raised the possiblity that Briscoe may try a court suit to stop implementation of what he considers anti-Texas portions of the president's plan. Briscoe, who said that copies of all research are being sent to the Texas delegation in Washington, refused to rule out a suit over the energy plan.

"I'm not going to rule out anything that we might have to do." the governor, who is expected to seek a third term in 1978, said.

As of tonight, the legislature has refused to clear eight-million dollars in start-up funds, because too many legislators remembered the promise that the Lubbock Hospital would not cost the state. At the same time, the Lubbock area taxpayers, who were told they would not be burdened by heavy taxes to pay for the hospital, are already being taxed up to the legal limits of the law by the Hospital District. The pipe dream when this hospital was being promoted was that the federal government would pay the bill. We have already accepted the reality of no help from Washington. But another pipe dream lives on. It is that somehow the, people of this area can support that hospital with their taxes. We must realize that the tax base to keep that dollar-eating monster is not here ... and will not be here in this century. The fallacy that we must have the Teaching Hospital to keep the Medical School, and that we must have the Medical School to keep Lubbock, must be dropped. If we admit that we cannot afford the hospital, it does not mean the automatic loss of the Medical School. Agreements for medical teaching can be worked out with other hospitals here and in other cities. For that matter, if we were to lose the Medical School, that does not mean that Lubbock would dry up and blow away. The Medical School is just one of dozens of major employers here.





Computers Clicking on Capitol Hill

WASHINGTON — Congress, an 18th century institution confronted with 20th century problems, is turning with increasing frequency to computers to help it cope with a burgeoning work load.

From the electronic voting machines on the House floor to the computerized mailing operations of the Senate to the instant information systems of the Library of Congress, computers are reshaping the way business is done on Capitol Hill.

But Congress' interest in computers goes beyond its work load. The machines have enormous potential to help members get re-elected.

Members are using computers to answer mail from constituents and, more significantly, to write unsolicited letters to voters throughout their districts and states.

'Targeted' Mail

The computers permit members to "target" letters to specific groups of voters. One mail expert hired by a senator devised a system for targeting letters to airline pilots on what the senator was doing for aviation and to policemen on what he was doing for law enforcement.

The political impact of such computerized mailings is so great that the self-styled citizens lobby, Common Cause, has challenged its legality in court.

The lawsuit is directed at Congress' free-mailing privilege, but computers are a key ingredient of the complaint. Common Cause charges that the free congressional mail, particularly when targeted by computers, gives an incumbent an unfair advantage over a challenger—at taxpayers' expense.

Electronic Revolution

The computer revolution came late to Congress—beginning only about a decade ago. But the machines have caught on quickly. Last year Congress spent \$25-million on its computer services.

Those responsible for planning the future use of computers in Congress believe that the machines can revolutionize the operations of the legislative branch.

"I can foresee a day when in the office of the future a member is equipped with a telephone, televised hookups to the House floor and other offices and two or three computers and will be able to make instantaneous decisions based on accurate, up-to-date information," says Rep. Charlie Rose (D N.C.), chairman of the House Computer Policy Group and a leading apostle of computer use in Congress.

Some Capitol Hill offices already have a jump on Rose's vision of the future. Using part of his official funds provided to hire staff workers, Rep. Dave Stockman (R Mich.) has leased a mini-computer in his office.

The machine now handles about 40 per cent of the congressman's mail, assembling pre-written paragraphs to produce "personalized" responses to constituents who write in asking for Stockman's views on a variety of issues.

Printing

A computerized printing system now being tested will make printed hearings available three weeks after the hearings are held. The process now takes three months. In addition to saving time, the new system will cut Congress' printing costs by about \$10-million a year.

And Rose has been talking with administration officials about linking the executive branch computers with those in Congress so that every time an executive branch agency spent or collected money, issued a regulation or took any other action, it would be noted immediately in the congressional computer.

The result would give Congress an unprecedented ability to monitor and oversee actions of the executive branch.

Rose said that he tried out his idea on officials in the Ford administration last year and "they were fairly horrified." But he says that he will push the idea in the Carter administration, and he predicted that eventually it will become a reality.

Obstacles

The technology to make a reality of this and dozens of other schemes for using computers in Congress now exists. Most of the plans on the drawing boards can be handled by the computers now installed in the Senate Computer Center, the House Information System or the Library of Congress.

But several human and political obstacles remain to the expanded use of computers in Congress. Among them:

-Charges that the computers, particularly in the Senate, are being used to store political information and to generate mail to voting groups.

-Continued difficulties in training large numbers of congressional aides, mostly non-technical people, in using the machines efficiently.


-Persistent doubts among some members and aides about the wisdom of turning over to machines duties traditionally performed by people.


-The inability of the House and Senate so far to agree on a common structure to oversee the use of congressional computers -a failure that has resulted in quite different computer systems on the two sides of Congress.

Terminals

But despite these obstacles, the trend toward increased use of computers in Congress is clearly established and not likely to be reversed. Nearly all senators' offices and about half of the House members' offices are equipped with computer terminals.



room for both facilities, because, noted Yerger, "they appeal to different audiences."

The mall has been around five years while the Civic Center is enjoying a kind of honeymoon one that Yerger expects to last.

So far the first big trade show to appear at the Civic Center was highly successful, Yerger explained. That success may be because the Civic Center is equipped to offer more room than the mall ever can.

On the other hand, the mall is a

commercial venture, and while a little competition never hurt anyone, a few less trade shows at the mall, may slow business down, and although the mall may not be keeping up with the Civic Center in size, it is offering events more often.

That may be one reason why trade shows are scheduled on a bi-monthly basis, while the Civic Center is dependent more on people's and trade dealer's interest.

Aside from trade shows, there's no doubt that the mall attracts crowds, while the center attracts people for a specific event.

While the mall and the Civic Center may remain on opposite ends of town there must be at the heart of it all - two facilities who aren't yanking, but maybe tugging at each other just a bit.

The Civic Center is bringing people back to the downtown area, noted Yerger. The mall was pulling them away. It may not be competition, but it is at least a peaceful coexistence.





> The school will finally get permanent home in the fall of 1978, when it moves into the old West Texas Hospital Building. The building was donated to South Plains College by the American Medical International, Co. to provide local businesses and industries with qualified workers. The stipulation was that money be raised to pay off the remaining \$160,000 owed on the mortgage.

A fund drive initiated by the Lubbock Chamber of Commerce among local businesses paid off the note, and a \$2 million grant was awarded the college earlier this year by the Economic Development Administration.

B.P. Robinson, a rather dapper man serving as dean of the college, says the program offered

is "unique. Almost anyone can come in for training in a variety of fields."

Admittance to the school is pretty loose, and students range from high school dropouts wanting to learn a profession to industry employees sent by their bosses to take supplementary courses.

The school offers a certificate of proficiency for a one-year program an associate of applied science degree for a two-year program. Robinson said the certificates are recognized by employers and other colleges and universities.

The courses range from respiratory therapy to real estate management, with a broad spectrum of classes in between.



Teachers are mostly local people who work part-time. Robinson said most of the teachers are professionals in the fields taught-for instance, real estate is taught by a real estate broker.

None of the teachers are full-time, but Robinson hopes to have a permanent staff when the college is moved to the new building, when the college finds a home.

Canadian Brass To Play Tech


The Canadian Brass, a popular Canadian concert attraction, will perform at Texas Tech University Center June 16.
