# Rosvln M. Brock BROCK YOUNGEST EVER. FOURTH WOMAN TO SERVE

AS NAACP BOARD CHAIR NEW YORK, NY - The NAACP named Roslyn M. Brock as Chair of the Board of

Directors at its Annual Board
Meeting on February 20 at the
New York Hilton.

Brock, 44, became the
youngest ever and fourth woman youngesteve as Chair of the NAACP's Board of Directors. A highly qualified candidate, her NAACP resumé boasts more NAACP resumé boasts more than 25 years of service to the NAACP in many capacities, including as a youth board member, Youth and College State Conference President, board member, and Vice Chair to the Board of Directors. Brock also created the annual NAACP Leadership 500 Summit, and has served as Chair of the Board Convention Planning Commit-

Convention Planning Commit-"As the NAACP ushers in a new generation, it is a great honor to be elected Chairman of honor to be elected Chairman of the Board of this esteemed As-sociation," said NAACP Chair-man Roslyn M. Brock. "We are blessed with the opportunity to lead the fight for civil and human rights into another cen-tury, and I am honored to help the NAACP issue the clarion call while ensuring the future legacy of this great organiza-

"We're looking at a genera-tional shift in our communities," continued Brock. "We have a 48 continued Brock. "We have a 48 year old President in the White House, an NAACP President who was 35 at the time of his election, and a 44 year old Board Chair. The wisdom of those who stood the test of time got us to this point, and the youth will lead the future success of our movement."

She officially announced her candidacy last August after her predecessor Julian Bond de-clared his retirement from the Chairman position. Bond en-dorsed Brock's candidacy, citing her experience in many facets of the Association as well as her youth as assets she will bring to the Chair position.

From the Desk of Parson D.A. Smith "Justice Clarence Thomas"

attorney friends is very fond of Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas. She reminded me in a conversation that African-Amer-icans should not be negative about Justice Thomas because he stands out as a great Amerabout visitee from as because he stands out as a great Ameri-can and for justice for all Amer-icans. My response was "we as humans have our own opinion and as African Americans we may perceive life differently as justice relates to African-Amer-

Jay Reeve wrote: Clarence Thomas, the justice long known as the silent member of the colleagues Friday (October 23, 2009) for badgering attorneys rather than letting them speak during oral arguments. Thomas – who hasn't asked a lawyer a always know where they stand on a case by reading legal briefs

on a case by reading regal oriers before oral arguments.

"So why do you beat up on people if you already know? I don't know, because I don't beat up on 'em. I refuse to participate. I don't like it, so I don't do it," Thomas said during an appate. I don't like it, so I don't do it," Thomas said during an ap-pearance before law students at the University of Alabama. Thomas didn't name names,

but fellow conservative Justice Antonin Scalia is generally con-sidered the court's most aggressive questioner during oral arguments. President Barack Obama's lone nominee so far, Justice Sonia Sotomayor, isn't afraid to ask questions either. Thomas scoffed at the idea that

Thomas scoffed at the idea that the justices try to use questions to influence the opinions of fellow member of the court. "All nine of us are in the same building," he said. "If we want to sway each other we know where we are. We don't need oral arguments to do that. It doesn't make any sense to me."

any sense to me."

Reeves noted that Thomas compared Senate confirmation to selecting the referees for a college football game in hopes

of getting favorable calls for one team or the other. "That's all based on a particular outcome you want. That is the antithesis of judging. You're corrupting your process. I think the conformation process is both unnecessary, it's uniformed with respect. sary, it's uniformed with respect to what the court actually does and it's very dangerous."

Thomas also noted "the court

is too dominated by Ivy League lawyers and lacks regional di-versity. People constantly worry about racial, gender and ethnic diversity and home states matter.

I am happy to know that parts of Justice Thomas are liken to brass. When he apply his thoughts to action (and quit acting like he is afraid of white males) black women may respect him and he just might becomeanother Thurgood Marshall
