## Emmy-Winning Singer Eartha Kitt Dies At 81 of Colon Cancer

NEW YORK (AP)
Eartha Kitt, the self-proclaimed
"sex kitten" whose sultry voice
and catlike puri attracted fans
even as she neared 80, has died.
The singer, dancer and actress
was 81.
Famile

January 1, 2009

was 81.
Family spokesman Andrew
Freedman said Kitt, who was
recently treated at Columbia
Presbyterian Hospital, died
Thursday in Connecticut of

colon cancer.

Dubbed the "most exciting woman in the world" by Orson Welles, Kitf's career spanned six decades, from her start as a dancer with the famed Katherine Dunham troupe to cabarets and acting and singing on stage, in movies and on television. She wom two Emmys.

and was also nominated for sev-eral Tonys and two Grammys. Kitt was featured on the cover of her 2001 book, "Rejuvenate," a guide to staying

"Rejuvenate," a guide to staying physically fit, in a long, curve-hugging black dress with a figure that some 20-year-old women would envy She also wrote three autobiographies.

She persevered through an unhappy childhood as a mixed-race daughter of the South, and made headlines in the 1960s for denouncing the Vietnam Warduring a visit to the White House.

House.

Her first album, "RCA Victor
Presents Eartha Kitt," was
released in 1954. It featured
songs such as "I Want to Be
Evil," "C'est Si Bon" and the

songs such as "I Want to Be Evil," "C'est Si Bon" and the saucy gold digger's theme song, "Santa Baby," which is revived on radio each Christmas.

The following year, the record company released "That Bad Eartha," which featured "Lef's Do It," "Smoke Gets in Your Eyes" and "My Heart Belongs to Daddy."

After becoming a hit singing "Monotonous" in the Broadway revue "New Faces of 1952." Kirt appeared in "Mrs. Patterson" in 1954-55. (Some references say she earned a Tony nomination for "Mrs. Patterson," but only winners were publicly announced at that time.) She also made appearances in "Shuribone Alley" and "The Owl and the Pussycat."

washinction - The num-ber of young black men and teenagers who either killed or were killed in shootings has risen at an alarming rate since 2000, a new study shows. The study, to be released Monday by criminologists at Northeastern University in Boston, comes as PBI data is showing that mur-ders have leveled off nation-wide.

ders have leveled off nation-wide.

Not so for black teens, the youngest of whom saw dramatic increases in shooting deaths, the Northeastern report concluded Last year, for example, 426 black males between the ages of 14 and 17 were killed in gun crimes, the study shows. That marked a 40 percent increase from 2000.

Nationwide, the number of murders and violent crimes overall dropped last year after increasing in 2005 and 2006, according to annual data com-piled by the FBI. Overall, how-ever, murders have risen by about 8 percent between 2000 and 2007.

The FBI reported 10,067

The FBI reported 10,067 arrests in murder and non-negligent manslaughter cases in 2007. Half of the people arrested 5,078 - were black Almost 10 percent of black people arrested for murder were under age 18, the FBI data show.

The number of young white men who committed gun-related homicides also rose over the same period, the Northeastern cludy showed, but not as dramatically in 2007, an estimated 384 white males age 14 to 17 shot someone to ideath, up from 368 in 2000.

The numbers of homicides committed by women and

committed by women and teenage mris - whether black or white - were relatively few, the Northeastern study found.

Several days ago Israeli war-planes took flight from the countries military bases and dropped more than 100 tons of bombs on security installations in Gaza. More than 400 people in the Hamas-ruled Gaza Strip were wounded and at least 230

were wounded and at least 230 people lost their lives.

Black smoked covered the landscape as Israeli missiles struck in densely populated areas. The strikes occurred at a time school children were going home. Frantic mothers went looking for their children. The bodies of more than a dozen uniformed Hamas police were found dead in Gaza City's in cars and other means of trans-portation to hospitals because there were not enough ambu-lances to transport the dead and

At Shifa Hospital, Nurse Ahmed Abdel Salaam reported There are heads without bod-ies. There's blood in the corn-dors. People are weeping, women are crying, doctors are

shouting." Istaeli Defense Minister Israeli Defense Minister Ehud Barak, vowing to expand the operation if necessary said. So in synagogues and com-munity centers, on blogs and in countless conversations, many Jews are beating their chests-not out of contrition, as they do on Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, but because they say Mr. Madoff has brought shame on their people in addi-tional to financial ruin and shak-

tion to theft, the Torah discusses another kind of stealing, gener-vat da'at, the Hebrew term for mind. "In the rabbinic mind-set, he's guilty of two sins, one is theft, and the other is decep-tion," Said Burton L. Visotzky, a tion," Said Burton L. Visotzky, a professor at the Jewish Theologial Seminary. The fact that he (Bernard L. Madoff) stole from Jewish charities puts him in a special circle of hell. He really undermined the fabric of the Jewish community, because it's built on trust."

We as human beings (Jew or Gentile) in God's world should check ourselves and pray for strength to enable us not to yield to the dark side of humanity.

Rice, who left segregated Alabama to eventually become the first African-American female to be secretary of state, warned that the United States still has problems with race.
"But I do think we've gotten to the place that we don't see a person and say. That's a black person, therefore they must be..." And that's an enormous step forward."

Rice, who was Bush's national security adviser when the U.S. invaded Iraq and then became secretary of state in Bush's second term, said the opportunities that are available in the United States still draw people from around the world to

"People, even in difficult economic times, still admire, maybe even envy a little bit, the maybe even envy a little bit, the entrepreneurship of this country and its capacity to be productive," Rice said. "But what really draws people to this country is that anybody can come here and go from modest circumstances to extraordinary achievement."

achievement."

Americans aren't "united by nationality," she added. "We're not united by religion. You can be African-American or Mexican-American or Korean-American, and still be American You can be Jewish or Presbyterian or Muslim or noth-ing at all, and still be American But there are very few Americans who don't really believe that it doesn't matter where you came from, it matters where you're going And that's what unites us, and that's also what people worldwide find so remarkable."

Rice said she plans to write at least two books when she gets back to Stanford, one about for-eign policy and one about her
