Scores of Lubbock and South Plains citizens were in attendance of the opening of the newest Head Start Center-- Eddie Richardson Center -- on Thursday morning, October 13, 2011. The new center is located at 1110 40th Street. W. D. Powell, Jr., Executive Director of the South Plains Community Action Association -- the sponsor of the head start center -- served as master of ceremonies.

Powell reminded those in attendance of the many works of Eddie Richardson which have been achieved for the benefits for Lubbock citizens and other areas.

Mr. Richardson, who passed away December 19, 2010, was the co-publisher and editor of the Southwest Digest. He served for many years as a member of

the Policy Council of the Head Start Centers of the South Plains of Texas.

This new facility is currently serving 214 children and their families. It has the capacity to serve many more should the resources become available, according to Mr. Powell.

This new location has playgrounds and outdoor areas provide many opportunities for implementing varied learning experiences and family focused events.

According to Mr. Powell, Mr. Richardson always talked about the many possibilities for this center and for the young people attending classes.

"Mr. Richardson was a believer in children starting early to learn as much they can especially when there are opportuni-

ties available for them.

Head Start program efforts, according to Mr. Powell, are targeted to getting children ready for success in public schools. Currently, the South Plains Community Action Association, through their Head Start & Early Head Start, partner with the YWCA in Lubbock and with 15 other public school systems in the surrounding area. These partnerships join state and federal resources for the benefit of children in rural communities.

Mr. Richardson always enjoyed visiting with the late Dr. L. S. Graves, founder and operator of the Mary & Mac Private School, about how she was able to get young children to read at a very early age. "It was just amazing," said Mr. Richardson.

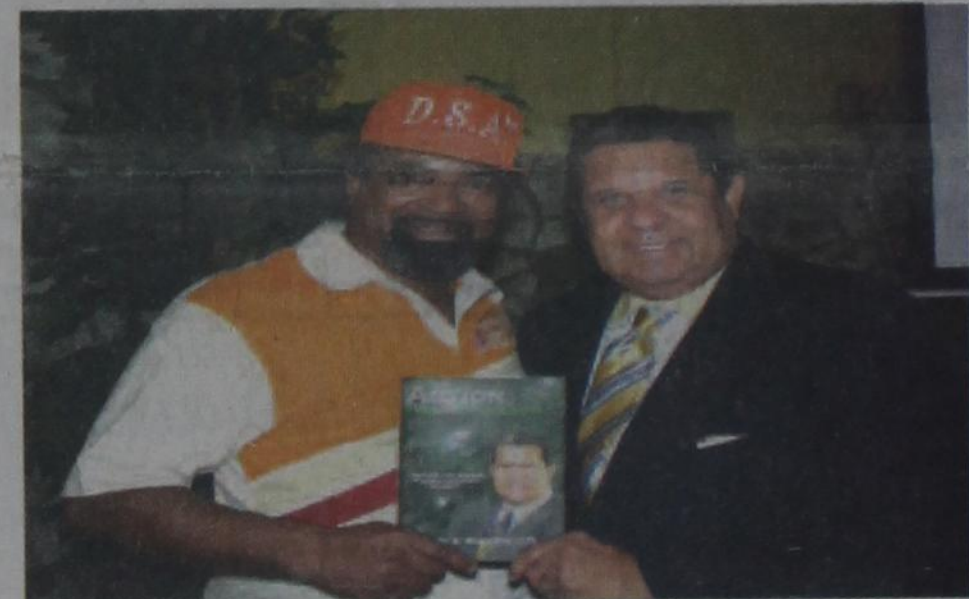

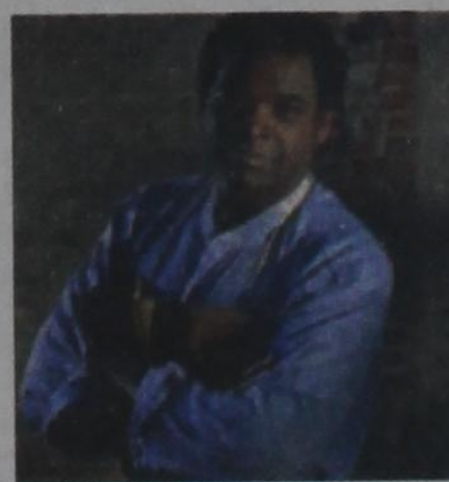
The T.J. Patterson Arts Roast will be held on Sunday, October 23rd at 7:00 PM in the Lubbock Memorial Civic Center. Eric Strong, a Roast Steering Committee representative said, "This will be the first time since Lubbock's 100th Year Anniversary in 2009, that entertainers of this magnitude will share the same stage on the same night. They're coming in from the Dallas Area, New York and even Berlin, Germany. It's going to be a magical night."

Among the list performers to be featured at the roast will be international saxophone virtuoso, Tom Braxton, international operatic baritone Terry Cook, American Idol's top-ten finalist Jerome Bell, renowned dancer and ballerina Natalia Johnson, and famed 1960's Doo Wop Era crooner Virgil Johnson (Patterson's college roommate). Some of these performers' talents have been featured in such places as the White House.

Among the local celebrities who will be helping to roast TJ Patterson will be Irasema Velasquez, president of the Lubbock Chamber of Commerce, West Texas business leader Phil Price, CEO of the Price Group in Lubbock and Texas Tech Chan-



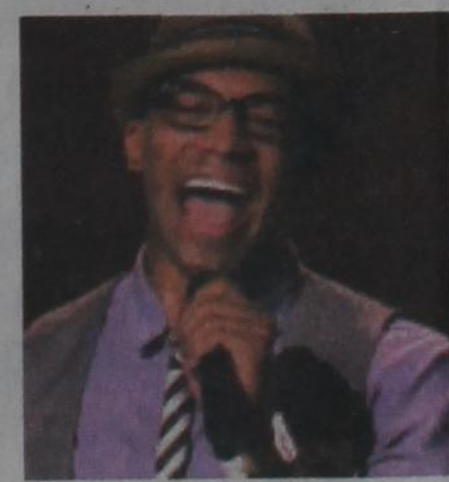

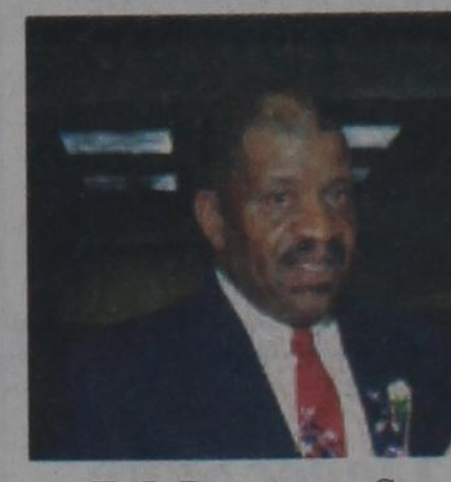

cellor Kent Hance, who'll provide his roast in a special video presentation. Joining with the local celebrities will be Congressman Emanuel Cleaver, former Kansas City Mayor and chairman of the Congressional Black Caucus, Candida Johnson, executive director of the National Girl's Self-Esteem Program, and Fort Worth city councilman Frank Moss, president of the Texas Association of Black City Council Persons.

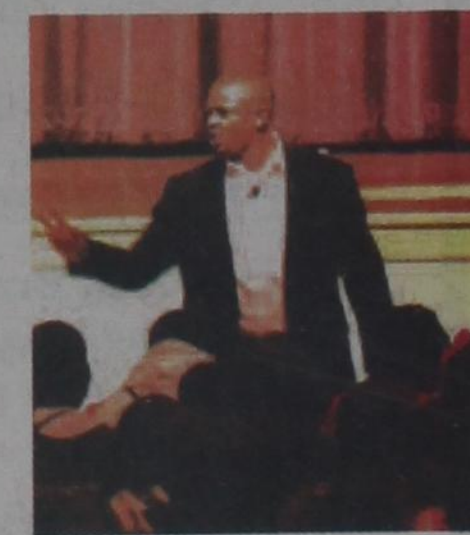
The roast speakers will pay poke fun and pay tribute to T.J. Patterson, Lubbock's longest-serving councilperson, a former president of the Texas Municipal

League, and the founding president of the Texas Association of Black City Councilmen. Patterson, the editor and publisher of the Southwest Digest Newspaper, led over 75 marches to protest illegal drugs and visits inmates in jail every Christmas. "It going to be a tear-jerker and a side-splitter," added Strong.

Organizers say the event is titled an "Arts Roast" because nationally and internationally celebrated performing artists, as well as visual artists are a key component of the roast. Selected pieces from the Black Creativity on the Plains Exhibit will be on display. The exhibit

includes works by Smithsonian artist sculptor Eddie Dixon, potter James Watkins and photographer Tony Gleaton, as well as Texas featured artist sculptress Vivian Cooke and folk artist Betty Jenkins. We want to showcase many of the incredibly talented performers and visual artists that come from the African American community of West Texas," said Strong.

Proceeds from the event will go to the TJ and Bobbie Patterson Scholarship Endowment, established in 2007 by TTU Chancellor Kent Hance and to the Cavie! African American

**High On Spice - Synthetic Cannabinoids**

Just when you think things couldn't get any crazier.... A different drug is on the horizon in the United States, a product known as K2 - or "Spice," Genie" and "Zohai." - This drug is commonly sold in head shops as incense. Produced in China and Korea, the mixture of herbs and spices is sprayed with a synthetic compound chemically similar to THC, the psychoactive ingredient in marijuana. Users roll it up in joints or inhale it from pipes, just like the real thing.

Currently, it's not regulated in the United States, a urine test cannot detect these synthetic compounds and a child can walk

in to a head shop and buy it. This product has been banned in Missouri and Kansas and all branches of the Military have banned the substance as well. Other states have pending legislation.

Side effects include delusions, hallucinations, loss of consciousness, paranoia, increased aggravation, panic attacks, dilated pupils, elevated blood pressure, heart rate and vomiting.

Currently, it is being sold in head shops, smoke shops and online but the US Customs Service has placed a ban on the importation of "Spice" products.

## From the Desk of Parson D.A. Smith "The Castration of a Liar"

I am a male offspring of the Biblical Ham and Japheth and what I see happening in America doesn't spell well for its future as a great nation.

Not only am I aware of what's happening my fellow Japhetic cousins including Jim Hightower who's column is distributed by Creators Syndicate wrote the following: Perry spreads tall tales of Texas Jobs, omitting they are low-pay, too few.

Mr. Hightower wrote: "Presidential wannabe Rick Perry is flitting all around the country—hither, thither and yon—spreading little "Perry Tales about himself and the many wonders he has worked as governor of Texas.

His top Perry Tale is a creationist story about what he has modestly branded "The Texas Miracle." While the rest of the country is mired in joblessness, says the miracle worker, his state has added 1.2 million jobs during his 10-year tenure.

I've built "a job-creating machine," the governor gushed during one of his recent flits across Iowa, and a Perry PR aid smugly added, "The governor's job creation record speaks for itself."

Actually, it doesn't. Far from having the best unemployment rate in the nation, the Lone Star State ranks a middling 26th behind New York, Massachusetts and other states whose "liberal" governments he

routinely mocks.

Even more damning, Perry's Texas is not creating nearly enough jobs to keep up with its fast-growing population. Those 1.2 million new positions are 629,000 short of the jobs needed just to bring the state's employment level back to where it was in 2007. Some miracle,

Worse, probe even a millimeter into the million-job number he is sprinkling about like fairy dust and you'll learn that Perry's jobs are mostly "jobettes" that can't sustain a family. They come with very low pay, no health care or pension, and no employment security, labor rights or upward mobility—many are only part-time and/or temporary positions.

Here's a particularly revealing stat the Perry pixies don't want us to see: On his watch as governor, Texas added more minimum wage jobs than all the other 49 states combined. More than half a million Texans now work for \$7.25 an hour or less.

He can brag he's brought Texans down into a tie with Mississippi for the highest percentage of workers reduced to poverty pay.

Spreading even more fairy dust, Perry claims his Texas Miracle is the result of him keeping the government out of the private sector's way. But peek behind that ideological curtain, and you'll find this startling fact: During Perry's decade, the greatest job growth by far has come

from the public sector, which has more than doubled the number of new jobs created by the private sector.

One out of six employed Texans are now teachers, police officers, highway engineers, military personnel or other government workers—and many of these jobs were created with the federal money Perry-the-candidate now loudly denounces. Indeed, he's running around ranting about President Obama's stimulus program, but he gladly accepted the third highest amount of stimulus funds taken by the 50 states. There's his miracle.

Interesting, even his tea-partyish hatred—nay, loathing!—of big government's intrusion into the lives of ordinary citizens turns out to be just another Perry Tale. In fact, there would be no Rick Perry without the steady "intrusion" of government into his life.

Local taxpayers in Haskell County put him through their public school system—for free. He and his family were dry land cotton farmers, and federal taxpayers helped support them with thousands of dollars in crop subsidies—Perry personally took \$80,000 in farm payments.

State and federal taxpayers financed his college education at Texas A&M, even giving him the extracurricular opportunity to be a "cheerleader." Upon graduation, he spent four years on the federal payroll. More Next Issue.



## Black America Remembers Civil Rights Leader, Rev. Fred L. Shuttlesworth

Birmingham, AL -- The Rev. Fred L. Shuttlesworth, who was bombed, beaten and repeatedly arrested in the fight for civil rights and hailed by the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. for his courage and energy, has died. He was 89.

Princeton Baptist Medical Center spokeswoman Jennifer Dodd confirmed he died at the Birmingham hospital Wednesday morning.

Shuttlesworth, a former truck driver who studied religion at night, became pastor of Bethel Baptist Church in Birmingham, Ala., in 1953 and soon was an outspoken leader in the fight for racial equality.

"My church was a beehive," Shuttlesworth once said. "I made the movement. I made the challenge. Birmingham was the citadel of segregation, and the people wanted to march."

In his 1963 book "Why We Can't Wait," King called Shuttlesworth "one of the nation's most courageous freedom fighters ... a wiry, energetic and indomitable man."

He survived a 1956 bombing, an assault during a 1957 demonstration, chest injuries when Birmingham authorities turned fire hoses on demonstrators in 1963, and countless arrests.

"I went to jail 30 or 40 times, not for fighting or stealing or drugs," Shuttlesworth told grade school students in 1997. "I went

to jail for a good thing, trying to make a difference."

He visited frequently and remained active in the movement in Alabama even after moving in 1961 to Cincinnati, where he was a pastor for most of the next 47 years. He moved back to Birmingham in February 2008 for rehabilitation after a mild stroke. That summer, the once-segregated city honored him with a four-day tribute and named its airport after him; his statue stands outside the Birmingham Civil Rights Institute.

And in November 2008, Shuttlesworth watched from a hospital bed as Sen. Barack Obama was elected the nation's first African-American president. The year before, Obama had pushed Shuttlesworth's wheelchair across the Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma during a commemoration of the Selma-to-Montgomery voting rights march.

In the early 1960s, Shuttlesworth had invited King back to Birmingham. Televised scenes of police dogs and fire hoses being turned on black marchers, including children, in spring 1963 helped the rest of the nation grasp the depth of racial animosity in the Deep South.

"He marched into the jaws of death every day in Birmingham before we got there," Andrew Young, the former Atlanta

mayor and U.N. ambassador who was an aide to King, said Wednesday.

Young said it was Shuttlesworth's fearlessness that persuaded King to take the fight for equality to Birmingham.

"We shouldn't have been strong enough to take on Birmingham ... But God had a plan that was far better than our plan," Young said. "Fred didn't invite us to come to Birmingham. He told us we had to come."

# In Cinque

It has been a very long time since I have been to a theatre and sat and watched a movie on the big screen. I believe that the last time I went to a movie was to see Color Purple. We know that was a long time ago. My daughter decided to treat me to a movie for my birthday.



Going to the movies took me back to my childhood days when I seldom missed a Saturday night 'shoot 'em up' and the cliffhanging series that preceded the movie. Living in town meant that you attended the 6:00 P.M. movie because the matinee at 3:00 P.M. was mostly attended by children from the rural area who had to be back home by 6:00 P.M. Since I was 'colored' in those days, I had to ascend the stairs in the theatre because colored people sat in the balcony while the first floor was for 'whites only.' That did not bother me because I could see the film better in the balcony and did not have to be concerned about popcorn, gum or peanuts falling on my head.

Of course, the theatre in my hometown had a ticket booth which was located between the two doors for entry. One door led upstairs and one door led downward to the first floor. It was not until I attended a movie in another town to learn that you did not go in the front door if you were colored; you went around the side of the building to a set of rickety stairs which led to the balcony. I was insulted because I could not go in a front door, but I wanted badly to see The Bells of Saint Mary's.

Ironically, the movie which my daughter took me to see was The Help; a movie set in Mississippi circa the nineteen fifties. The early scenery showed a theatre in the capital city where the stairway on the outside led to the balcony where colored people sat. There were also scenes wherein the colored people sat in

the back of the city buses, especially the maids on their way to and from their jobs as 'Help.'

This film not only shows the segregated lifestyles of the black and white people in this setting, but how the maids raised and loved white children as a part of their jobs. The sad part of this scenario deals with how some of the white families could not see that the colored help were really flesh and blood human beings with feelings and some of the same needs and desires as their white employers. Though set in Mississippi, this film rings true for most of the southern states which used colored help. It is focused on household maids and their duties, but the attitudes and social life of all colored help had the essence of the prevailing Jim Crow era.

For many young people of all ethnic persuasion, this is a history lesson to take note. It gets to the inner workings of some of the things that took place, though were never really expressed in any textbooks, including many books on African American history. Let us get 'in cinque' and become aware of what we need to know about racial relationships and how to avoid the pitfalls of the past.

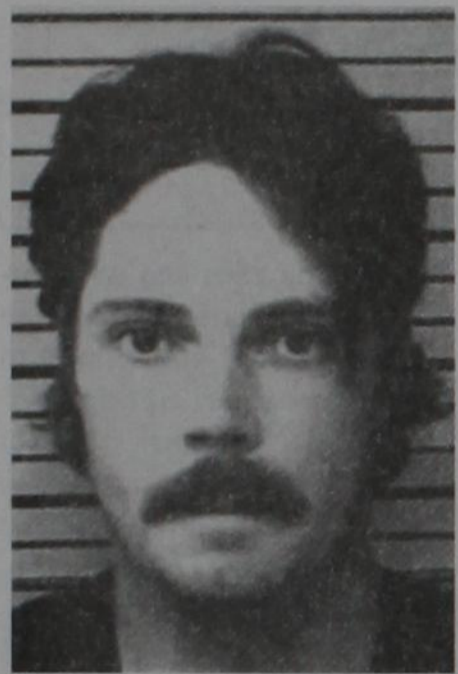

## Rev. Shuttlesworth Rites Held

Referring to the city's notoriously racist safety commissioner, Shuttlesworth would tell followers, "We're telling ol' 'Bull' Connor right here tonight that we're on the march and we're not going to stop marching until we get our rights."

According to a May 1963 New York Times profile of Shuttlesworth, Connor responded to the word Shuttlesworth had been injured by the spray of fire hoses by saying: "I'm sorry I missed it. ... I wish they'd carried him away in a hearse."

Fellow civil rights pioneer the Rev. Joseph Lowery said Shuttlesworth a courageous and determined leader.

"When God made Bull Connor, one of the real negative forces in this country, He was sure to make Fred Shuttlesworth," Lowery said Wednesday.

While King went on to international fame, Shuttlesworth was relatively little known outside Alabama. But he was a key figure in Spike Lee's 1997 documentary, "4 Little Girls," about the September 1963 Birmingham church bombing that killed four black children.

He also gained attention in Diane McWhorter's book "Carry Me Home: Birmingham, Alabama: The Climactic Battle of the Civil Rights Revolution," which won a Pulitzer Prize in 2002.

Shuttlesworth was born March 18, 1922, near Montgomery and grew up in Birmingham.

As a child, he knew he would either be a minister or a doctor and by 1943, he decided to enter the ministry. He began taking theological courses at night while working as a truck driver and cement worker during the day. He was licensed to preach in 1944 and ordained in 1948.

It was 1954 when King, then a pastor in Montgomery, came to Birmingham to give a speech and asked to stop by Bethel Baptist and meet Shuttlesworth. Shuttlesworth already knew the Rev. Ralph Abernathy, who became a key aide to King, as they both attended Alabama State College, later known as Selma University.

Meanwhile, in Montgomery,

Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat on a city bus in late 1955, prompting the boycott led by King that gave new life to the civil rights movement.

In January 1956, King's Montgomery home was bombed while he attended a rally. Eleven months later, on Christmas night 1956, 16 sticks of dynamite were detonated outside Shuttlesworth's bedroom as he slept at the Bethel Baptist parsonage. No one was injured in either

bombing, although shards of glass and wood pierced Shuttlesworth's coat and hat, which were hanging on a hook.

The next day, Shuttlesworth led 250 people in a protest of segregation on buses in Birmingham.

In 1957, he was beaten by a mob when he tried to enroll two of his children in an all-white school in Birmingham.

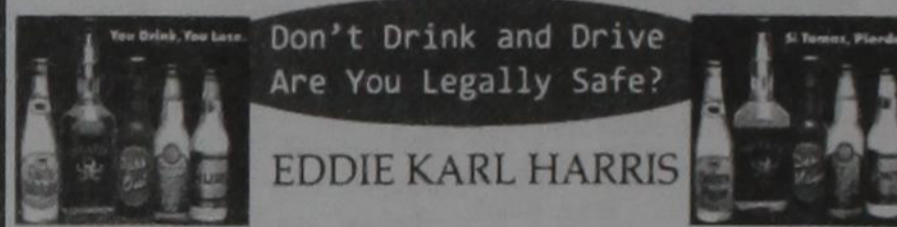

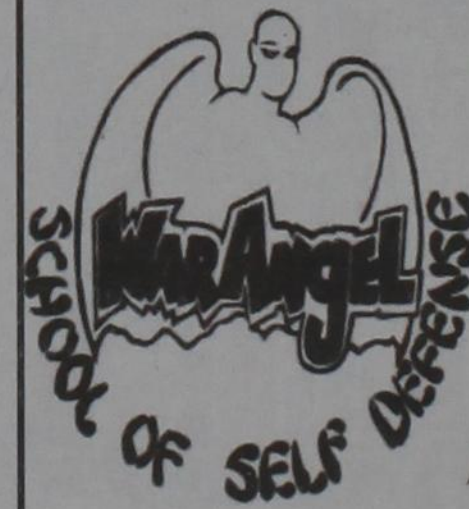
