M & M Service Was Born In 1975 To Take Care of Motoring Needs

March 22, 1975, Rufus Martinez and Glynn Morgan -- M & M Service - opened its doors for business on the corner of 15th Street and Avenue L.

M & M Service was born to take care of the motoring needs of the city of Lubbock and the South Plains of Texas Area.

Mitch Morgan was born in 1967. At the age of eight, Mitch started coming to work with his dad, Glynn. With the exception of a brief period of time, Mitch's work has continued at 15th & Avenue L to this day.

In 1990, Rufus turned 65 years of age and decided it was time to retire. Glynn brought Rufus out and Mitch took Rufus' place as a partner in M & M Service -- "Martinez and Morgan" was now "Morgan & Morgan."

In 1993, Glynn decided he wanted to explore the political scene. Since he lived in District 2, his chosen opponent for a city council spot was incumbent Mr. T. J. Patterson. In the months preceding to the May election,

Glynn met many people he would not have otherwise met and acquired a knowledge and appreciation of the City of Lubbock and District 2 he would not have otherwise acquired.

Glynn also acquired an appreciation of Mr. Patterson's character and dedication to public service that he also had not known before.

The election was fairly close, which was a salve to the ego of

the novice politician. T. J. Patterson faced 4 more years of meetings. Glynn got to go

The Local and Jurisdictional Homegoing Celebration of Bishop William Henry Watson, II were held Thursday evening, March 8 at LakeRidge United Methodist Church. . The National Homegoing Celebration was held Friday, March 9, 2012, at LakeRidge United Methodist Church,

Interment followed in City of Lubbock Cemetery under the Direction of Griffin Mortuary & Funeral Home of Lubbock.

Bishop Watson II, 68, of Lubbock passed away Tuesday, February 29, 2012.

Bishop William Henry Watson II, the son of Deacon William L. Watson Sr. and Juanita Maxine (Morris), was born on May 17, 1943, in Arkansas City, Kan. His mother passed when he was three years old and he was reared by his large extended family in his grandmother's, Mother Lovie Watson, home. He graduated from Arkansas City High School in 1961. He learned to play the saxophone at an early age and became an avid student of music. In 1963, he graduated from Cowley County Community College with an Associate of Arts Degree. He left Arkansas City and headed for the metropolis of Wichita, Kan., where he enrolled at Wichita State Univer-


In 1967, he graduated with a Bachelor of Science in music education. In 2005, he received his Master of Theology from Oakland University. Bishop Watson accepted his call to ministry in the 1960s at his home church under the tutelage of his uncles and his father. He was an extraordinary and demonstrative preacher of the gospel. His first message was Weeping May Endure for A Night. His second message was Take Another Dip. Another memorable sermon he preached at home was Lord, I killed my lion and I killed my bear, help me to kill my Giant. Bishop Watson was an exceptional musician. His principle instrument was the tenor saxophone. His father was a perfectionist and expected his son to perform at a high level. Bishop Watson not only mastered his instrument, he taught his cousins, Melvin Watson and Bryne Donaldson, to play saxophone as well. They formed a group called the Soul Searches, which played at churches for services and musicals all over the Midwest. Many young men, Continue on Page 7





From the Desk of Parson D.A. Smith "The Assault On Women In America"



Donald Payne Dead: New Jersey Congressman Dies After Battle With Cancer



Congressman Donald Payne

Democratic Rep. Donald M. Payne, the first black congressman to represent New Jersey in Washington, has died, NBC New York has confirmed. He was 77.

Payne died early Tuesday morning, February 6, 2012, in Essex County after a brief battle with colon cancer, according to a member of his staff.

The Newark-born politician announced last month that he had colon cancer. He had been undergoing treatment in Washington and returned to New Jersey on Friday as his condition worsened.

President Barack Obama said in a statement Tuesday, February 6, 2012, that he and first lady Michelle Obama were "saddened" by the news of Payne's death.

"In Washington, he made it his mission to fight for working families, increase the minimum wage, ensure worker safety, guarantee affordable health care and improve the educational system... Don will be missed, and our thoughts and prayers go out to his family and friends during this difficult time.

Payne was a 12-term Democrat active in foreign affairs policy. He is a former chairman of the Congressional Black Caucus and served New Jersey's 10th congressional district, which includes most of Newark, parts of Jersey City and Elizabeth and some suburban areas in Essex and Union counties.

There was a moment of silence for him Tuesday afternoon, February 6th, on the House floor.

Dr. Clement Price, professor of history at Rutgers-Newark, called Payne a "class act" and a "diamond in the rough."

"His most important legacy was the extraordinary insight and concern he had over African issues, especially warfare, famine and civil unrest," Price

Payne had served as chairman of the House subcommittee on Africa, and had traveled many times to the continent on foreign affairs matters.

During an April 2009, mortar shells were fired toward Mogadishu airport as a plane carrying Payne took off safely from the Somali capital. Officials at the time said 19 civilians were injured in residential areas. Payne had met with Somalia's president and prime minister during his one-day visit to Mogadishu to discuss piracy, security and cooperation between Somalia and the United States.

Payne had been a congressional delegate to the United Nations. He also was a member of the Newark City Council from 1982 until 1988 and was a teacher in Newark for 15 years. He also served as president of the national YMCA. He earned a bachelor's degree from Seton Hall University in 1957.

A leading education advocate, Payne played crucial roles in the passage of key legislation, including the National Service Act, and helped secure funding for Head Start and Pell Grants, among other initiatives.

Payne was remembered by his congressional colleagues for his work on human rights and on behalf of the poor.

"Congressman Payne spoke out on behalf of suffering people in some of the most difficult situations around the world: from Rwanda to Sudan to the peace process in Northern Ireland," said House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi, D-Calif.

New Jersey Rep. Bill Pascrell, Jr., whose district to the north of Newark bordered Payne's, called him a "champion for education and civil rights who sought to combat injustice all over the world."

Payne was a widower with three children and four grandchildren. His son, Donald Payne Jr., is a Newark city councilman.

including the now famed Vernard Johnson, would come to Ark City to learn from Bishop Watson. When he matured, Bishop Watson served his local church, Arkansas City Church of God in Christ, as the choir director of the Youth Choir. With his sisters, Marcia and Barbara, on the keyboards, the Ark City Youth Choir had a sound that was renowned throughout the church. While most gospel choirs were singing three-part harmony, Bishop Watson's choirs often had five or six parts. He would split the sopranos (1st and 2nd) and altos (1st and 2nd), adding the tenors and the bases. He was stacking music long before they were doing it on the coasts. He was demonstrative but precise choir director. Every move of his body had significance, and woe unto the person who missed a note or a beat. Bishop Watson was always an avid competitor, a sports enthusiasts and fast car aficionado. When he was young, he had a sports car that he raced. Because the saints were not allowed to play sports on Sundays, he would have a driver enter his car, while he went to church. The driver was then responsible for bringing Bishop his winnings or leaving his money in a cup on the porch. If you played him checkers, dominos or any game at home, you had to play until he beat you. While he was in college, he met and married the love of his life, Arneda Walton, from Texas. He was a devoted and protective husband to his bride. Sister Watson had been well-trained in the ways of the Lord and worked tirelessly side from then until now. To this gram for the U.S. Department of

union, two children were born, William Henry Watson III and LeGena M. (Watson) Collins.

After Bishop Watson graduated from college, he began his career in education. He started out as the junior high school band and vocal music instructor in Arkansas City from 1968-1970. He was not a stranger to work, so at the same time, he worked as a vocal instructor at Cowley County Community College. In 1970, Bishop Watson left Arkansas City to take a position in a smaller Kansas town, Dexter, Kan., where he was the junior and senior high bands and vocal music instructor. Who can forget when Bishop Watson scored the music to James Brown's anthem, I'm Black and I am Proud, and taught it to an all-white marching band. So, Bishop Watson left south-central Kansas and moved to Kansas City, Kan., where he taught high school band at Kansas City's Wyandotte High School.

While in Kansas City, he was ordained as an Elder in the Church of God in Christ by the late Bishop John Owen, Jurisdictional Prelate, Kansas East. After he was ordained, he heard a clarion call of the Lord and obeyed the direction of the late Bishop J.E. Alexander to come to Texas. Like Abraham, he left the land of his fathers and headed to Texas with his wife, two small children, a small car and his faith. When he got to Texas, he could not find a job in his profession immediately. So, he found work as an assistant planner for the City of Lubbock, Texas. He then worked as a coand quietly by her husband's ordinator On-Job Training Pro-

Labor from 1974 through 1978. The Lord blessed, and he then returned to his love of music as the band director at Estacado High School and Alderson Jr. High School from 1978-1980. After a short period of time, Bishop Watson was appointed Pastor of Greater Prayer House Church of God in Christ, Lamesa. He served that congregation until 1984. In 1977, Bishop Watson was appointed district superintendent of the Lubbock District in Texas Northwest Jurisdiction.


Later, he was appointed as executive secretary and then the 1st Administrative Assistant to Bishop J.E. Alexander. Bishop Watson also served the national church in this season of his life. At the direction of Bishop J.O. Patterson Sr., Bishop Watson organized and directed the first orchestra of the Church of God in Christ. He gathered young people from across the nation to play during national meetings. He scored popular gospel music for various instruments, before you could purchase this music in the stores.

In 1983, Bishop J.O. Patterson Sr. consecrated Bishop William H. Watson II as the Jurisdictional Prelate, Texas Northwest Jurisdiction. At this time, he was one of the youngest persons to be consecrated as a bishop. He was also appointed as the Pastor of Ford Memorial Church of God in Christ. In 1993, the church relocated and was renamed Agape Temple Church of God in Christ. He served that local congregation until 2010, when he relinquished the pastorate of the congregation, and appointed his son-inlaw, Pastor Daryl Collins, to continue his work there. Bishop Watson also pastored Holy Temple Church of God in Christ in Levelland.

Bishop Watson continued to pursue his education. Bishop Watson also served his community. He was a member of the Texas State Board of Examiners of Marriage and Family Therapist, and he served on the Chancellor of Texas Tech University's Minority Community Advisory Council and the Texas State Governors' Juvenile Justice Advisory Board. Not only did Bishop Watson serve the local congregation, the community, and his jurisdiction, he served the national church in variety of capacities. In 1984, Bishop L.T. Walker appointed Bishop Watson as the corresponding secretary to the Board of Bishops. He faithfully served in this capacity until 2004. In 2004, Bishop Watson was elected as the 1st Vice Chairman of the Board of Bishops, Church of God in Christ, Inc. He served in this capacity until his passing.

Bishop William H. Watson II was preceded in death by his mother, Juanita Maxine (Morris) Watson; his father, Deacon William L. Watson; stepmother, District Missionary Hortence (McBee) Watson; brother, Frederick Nicholson; and sister,

Willa Mae (Watson) Slaughter . He leaves to cherish his memory his devoted wife, Lady Arneda (Walton) Watson; son, Administrative Assistant William H. Watson III (Stacy);






