All major religions support organ, eye and tissue donation, as a final act of kindness and generosity. Regardless of their specific religion, the public is encouraged to register as donors by visiting www.donatelifetexas.org

"While religions differ, one of the common points about donation is positive, inspiring messaging. Messaging that provides hope from one family to another," said Schawnte' Williams-Taylor, managing director for LifeGift, the organization which recovers organs and tissues for people needing transplants in 109 counties across Southeast,

North and West Texas.

Across the country, more than 115,000 men, women and children are waiting for lifesaving transplants and nearly 13,000 of them are from Texas. Of those 13,000, nearly 3,000 are African-Americans due in part to the high prevalence of diabetes, heart disease and hypertension. Every day, 18 people die in this country because of the lack of available organs for

As a community, we have the power to donate life! Today it may not be you; but tomorrow it could be you or someone you love. Although it is possible for someone needing an organ to match a donor from another racial or ethnic group, transplant success rates increase when organs are matched between members of the same ethnic background. Consequently, a lack of organs donated by multicultural populations can contribute to longer waiting periods for transplantation.


Vandals Destroy Democrat Signs By Kenney Kenter - Lubbock Democrat Chairman

Lubbock Area Clients Council Held Workshop: "Community Partnership, Working Together"

On Saturday, October 20, 2012, the Lubbock Area Clients' Council, in conjunction with Legal Aid of NorthWest Texas (LANWT), held a community education workshop, "Community Partnership, Working Together," designed to address the needs and concerns of low-income Texans. The workshop

brought together Lubbock-area citizens and legal professionals to participate in an open dialogue about issues including access to justice, federal tax filing requirements, and citizens' rights to utility services. The Saturday workshop drew more than 25 attendees.

Jonathan Vickery, associate

director of the Texas Access to Justice Foundation, Austin, spoke about access to justice initiatives. He also discussed the implications of the increasing demand for legal aid services at a time when funding for these programs is both decreasing and in jeopardy of further reduction. Randy Chapman, executive

director of the Texas Legal Services Center (TLSC), Austin, informed attendees about the variety of economic programs available to low-income Texans, including help with obtaining low-cost utility services. Three students from the Texas Tech University School of Law Tax Clinic discussed the importance of filing income taxes and shared information on the resources available to help people with tax questions.

Bruce Bower, deputy director, TLSC, spoke about the rise in non-traditional families, the important of "Kincare Authorization Agreements," and how the Texas Kincare Project works to provide caregivers with the legal tools and advice to help them navigate the healthcare, human services, and school systems for minor children in their care. Joel Howard, an assistant city attorney, Lubbock, explained the procedures involved for dealing with municipal court citations





it as evidence (and rightfully so) at the scene of the crime. The memory card was retrieved from the LPD property room on Thursday.

There is a chunk of video missing immediately after the camera is hit. We're not sure why it is missing, but our best guess is that the impact of the punch on the camera stopped the recording temporarily. Our volunteer was still on the 911 call during this time; the audio from that call could be used to fill in the gap to provide a complete sequence of events.

Our volunteer operating the camera was staking out the location of three large signs (his initiative, but I fully support it) for two reasons: to find out who was destroying and stealing our signs, and to disprove the lie, told by the Chair of the Lubbock County Republican Party, that we were destroying our own

At this time (Friday 10/26/2012) the Lubbock Police Department investigation into the incident is ongoing, case number 12-38175. The Lubbock County Democratic Party appreciates the fast response of the officers on Wednesday and the professional manner in which they are conducting their investigation.

From the Desk of Parson D.A. Smith Racism Is Alive and Well In Lubbock, Texas

Elliott, managing attorney, also of LANWT, discussed the history of legal services and the importance of client councils. Elliott also spoke about the various self-help initiatives being implemented throughout Texas, including Lubbock, to assist people who are trying to file their own court cases without the assistance of an attorney.

Once a taboo subject, donation steadily has become more accepted in general society. Regardless of this acceptance, there are still some strongly-held myths out there that we must continue to shatter:

MYTH: Only the rich or those with celebrity status receive organ transplants.

TRUTH: When you are on the waiting list for an organ, what really counts is the severity of your illness, the time spent waiting, blood type and other important medical information – not your financial or celebrity status.

MYTH: Donation will mutiliate the body.

TRUTH: An open casket funeral is possible for organ, eye and tissue donors. Through the entire donation process the body is treated with care, respect and dignity.

MYTH: M y religion does not support dona-

FACT: All major religions in the United States support organ, eye and tissue donation and see it as the final act of love and generosity toward others.

MYTH: If I'm in an accident, the doctors and nurses won't work as hard to save my life if I'm a registered donor.

TRUTH: If you are sick or injured and admitted to the hospital, the number one priority is to save your life. Organ, eye and tissue donation can only be considered after you are deceased.

MYTH: My family will incur a cost if I'm a donor.

TRUTH: There is no cost to the donor or their family for organ or tissue donation.

Brazilian man appears very much alive at his own funeral

SAO PAULO - A 41-year-old car washer shocked his family when he interrupted a funeral being held for him at his mother's home in the town of Alagoinhas in northeastern Brazil, police said Tuesday.

Police inspector Roberto Lima said by telephone that on Sunday Jose Marcos Araujo identified a body at the city morgue as being that of his brother, Gilberto.

Lima said that Jose Marcos took the body to his mother's home where a wake was held.

"The confusion started when news started circulating that a car washer had been shot dead," Jose Marcos' wife, Ana Paula, told the UOL Internet news portal. "Police called my husband and told him that his brother had been killed and his body was at the morgue."

Lima said the confusion was "understandable."

"The two men closely resem-

bled each other and both worked as car washers," Lima said adding that the man whose body was in the morgue was named Genivaldo Santos Gama. He said further information on Gama was not immediately available.

A few hours before the Monday burial "a friend of Gilberto's saw him walking down the street and told him that his family was mourning him," he said.

"So he went to his mother's home to let everyone know he was very much alive."

When Araujo showed up at his wake "some people fainted and others were so scared they ran away. It was a big shock," family friend Maria Menezes told the G1 online news site.

Gilberto's mother Marina Santana told reporters "I am overjoyed. What mother wouldn't be after being told that her son is dead and then sees him alive."
