## Meet Estacado High School Regional Cross Country Winners



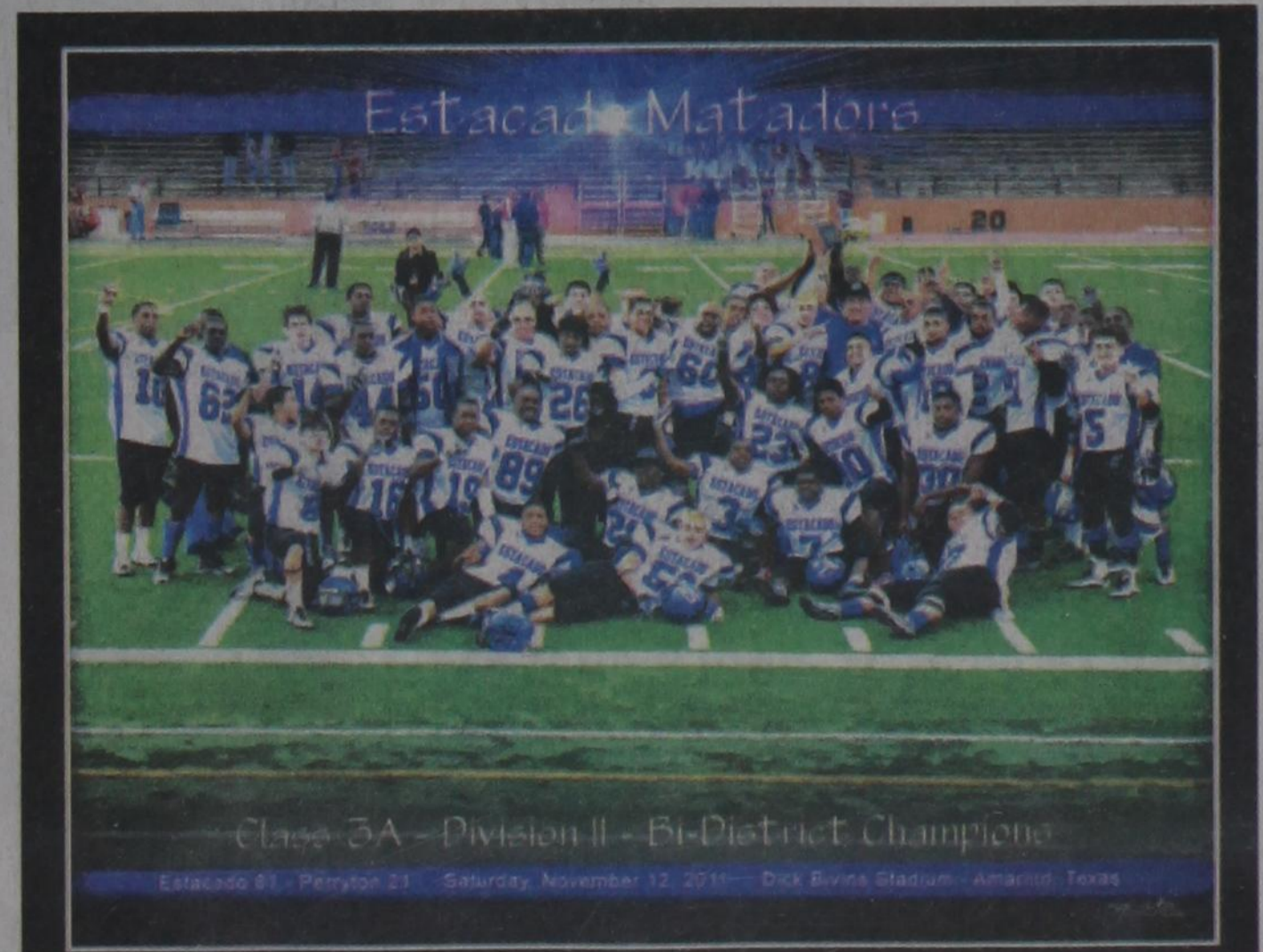

## "Standing By Her Man: Gloria Cain"

One of the things that have been used by white men to destroy black men is to accuse them of having an affair with a white woman.

Ceasing criticism: In far too many churches, critical and complaining spirits are destroying the vitality and effectiveness of those churches. Just as great nations and empires often implode from within rather than be conquered by outside forces, a

number of churches are dying because of what is going on inside the church more than what is happening in the culture surrounding them.

The Lord inspired Paul to see the potentially harmful impact that critical, judgmental actions would have on his church. As a result, Paul's injunction to the church at Rome and to us today is clear: "Therefore, let us no longer criticize one another" (v. 13). Instead we are to be consumed with the love of Christ, a love that led Christ to sacrifice for us and one that will lead us

to sacrifice for our brothers and sisters in Christ. As we live for Christ, we are called to desire what is best for others and to avoid any attitude or action that would cause another believer to stumble.

## The champ is dead: Former heavyweight boxer Smokin' Joe Frazier - the first man to beat Muhammed Ali - loses battle with liver cancer

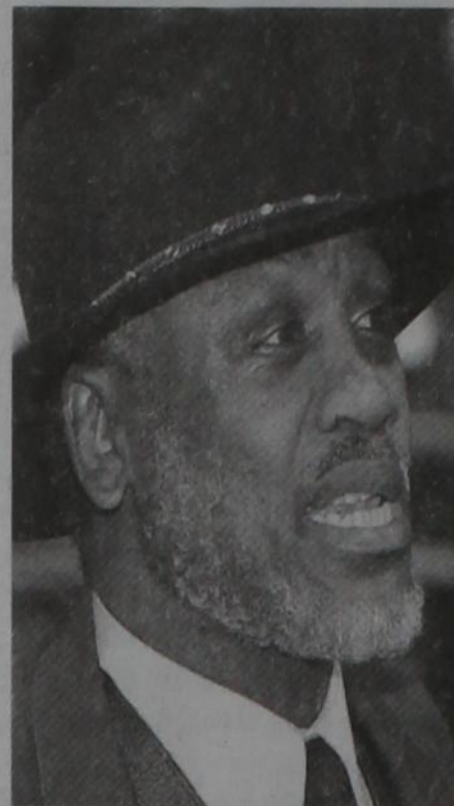
Joe Frazier, the former heavyweight champion who handed Muhammad Ali his first defeat yet had to live forever in his shadow, has died after a brief fight with liver cancer. He was 67.

The family issued a release confirming the boxer's death. Frazier, who took on Ali in three momentous fights in the 1970s - including the epic 'Thrilla in Manila' - had been under home hospice care in his Philadelphia home after being diagnosed just weeks ago with the cancer that took his life.

'I will always remember Joe with respect and admiration,' Ali said in a statement about the death of his great rival. 'My sympathy goes out to his family and loved ones.'

The 1970s rivalries of Frazier, Ali and George Foreman will always be remembered as a golden age of heavyweight boxing.

Boxing promoter Don King



called Frazier a giant among men.

'Smokin' Joe', as he became known, was a small yet ferocious fighter who smothered his opponents with punches, including a devastating left hook he used to end many of his fights early.

It was the left hook that dropped Ali in the 15th round at Madison Square Garden in 1971 to seal a win in the so-called 'Fight of the Century.'

Though he beat Ali in that fight, Frazier lost the two other bouts between the men and for many years was bitter about the role Ali forced him to play as his foil.

'You can't mention Ali without mentioning Joe Frazier,' said former AP boxing writer Ed Schuyler Jr. 'He beat Ali, don't forget that.'

They fought three times, twice in the heart of New York City and once in the morning in a steamy arena in the Philippines.

They went 41 rounds together, with neither giving an inch and both giving it their all. In their last fight in Manila in 1975, they traded punches with a fervor that seemed unimaginable among heavyweights.

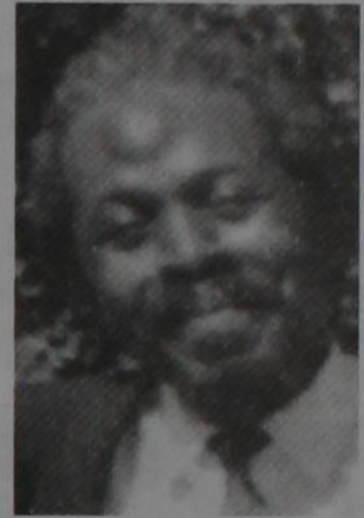

In some instances, if we look around us we can see the realization of what politics can do.

Do we find it strange when individuals who come from humble beginnings get elected to government positions and stay in those positions for a couple of terms, that when you take inventory, it appears that they have become well-to-do overnight, so to speak. When elected, they had little or no real estate and when they leave office they are landlords. Then you wonder just how much did the job pay. Did they earn enough in office to secure all of the worldly goods that they possess after being in office for a few years? Is there something about 'economic politics' that the average voter has no knowledge of?

There needs to be an instrument with which to measure the effectiveness of elected officials as it relates to the end product. Public employees who must meet certain educational requirements who are employed by boards of education, city, county and state offices are generally evaluated with some type of instrument which determines if they should maintain their positions. There needs to be such an instrument with which to evaluate elected officials, many whom are not required to have any qualification except age, desire to be elected and civil rights. These elected officials generally are in control of vast amounts of finances and earn huge salaries. They are not accountable, but should be. When the governmental unit in which they have a voice is in trouble, they pass the buck and it keeps on rolling until the community suffers. It is time now, to get 'in cinque' and develop an instrument to evaluate elected officials on a regular basis and not have to wait until the next election to replace them if they do not come up to par.
