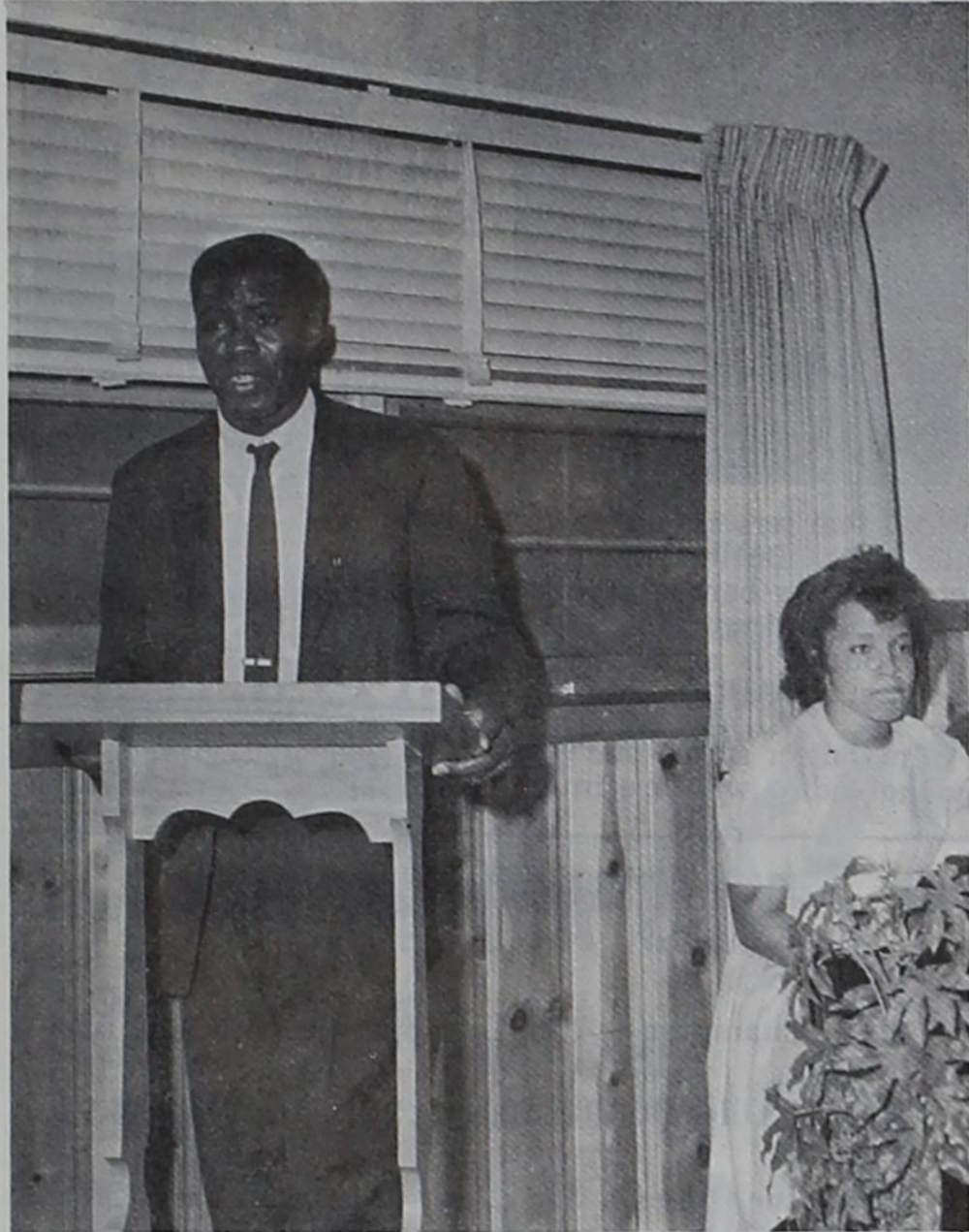


### Speaker Highlights Mary & Mac Graduation

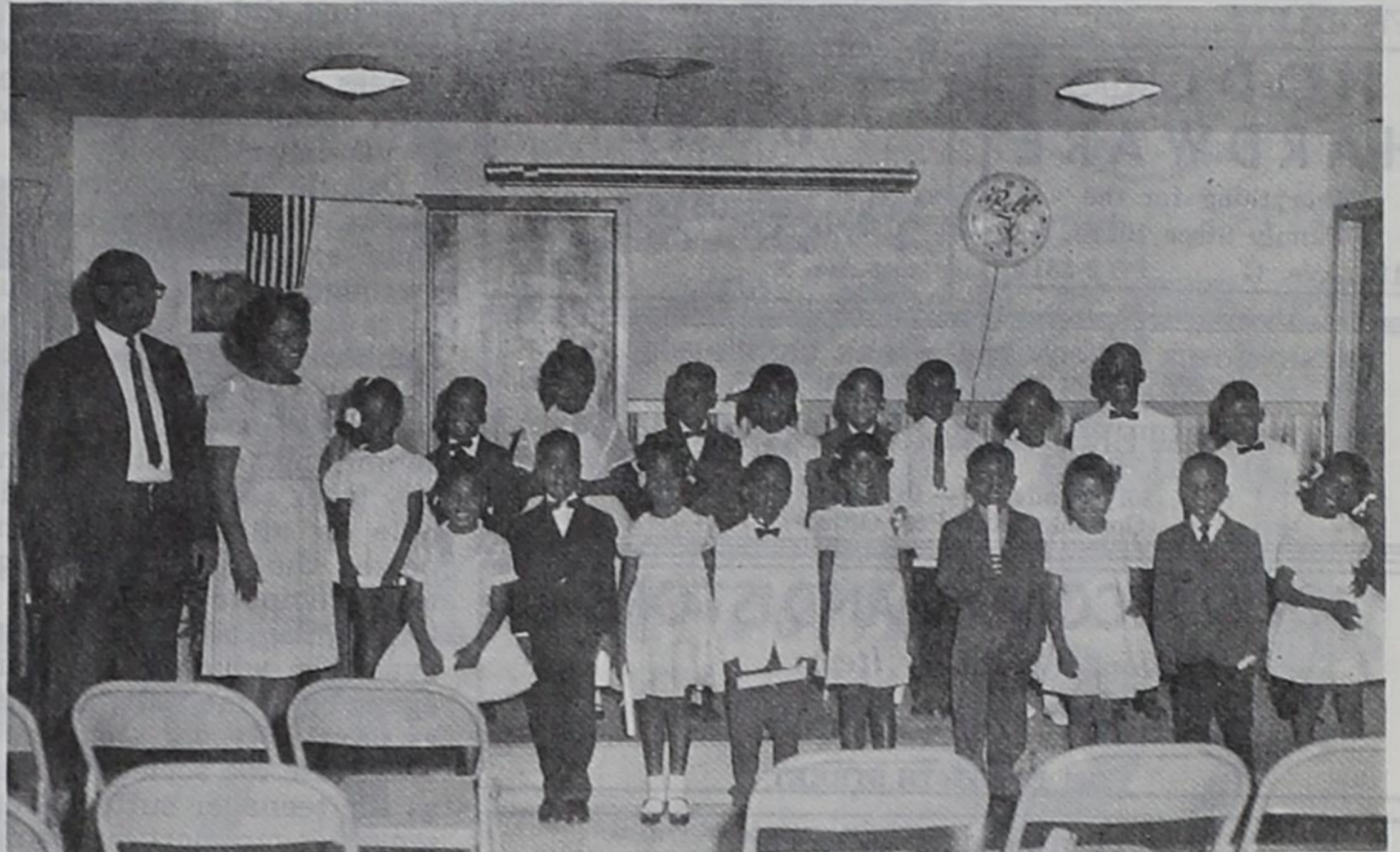
visit in the Crescent City, New Orleans.

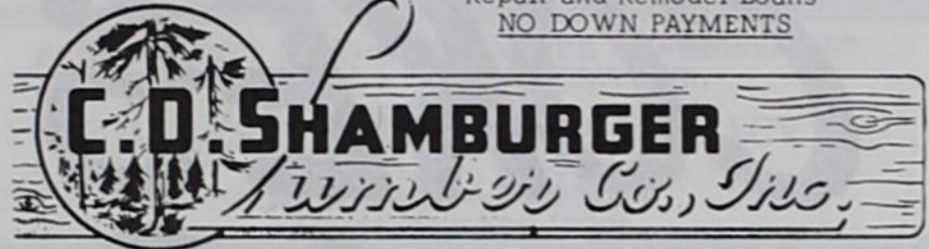

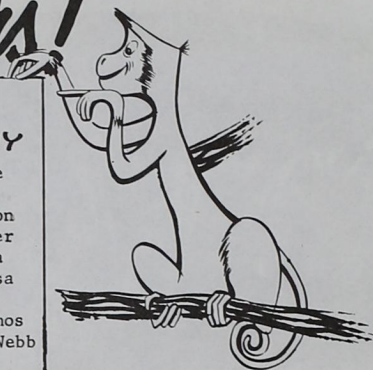
