TAX MAN SAM SEZ

The Internal Revenue Service reminds taxpayers to be sure to include their Social Security Numbers when filing income tax returns. There's a place for these numbers on both the 1040 and 10 40A Forms.

Taxpayers without a Social Security Number can get one by writing to any local Social Security Office. Or, your Internal Revenue Office can provide the form needed to apply for a number.

If you receive ten dollars or more in interest on a savings account, your bank or savings institute will also need to know your Scoial Security Number. These institutions will report all such interest payments to Internal Revenue.

Don't forget that the maximum Social Security Tax for 1963 is \$174.
