There will be an executive committee of 32 people (8 from each of the above listed groups) and out of these 32, there will be a chairman elected from each group.

These 8 representatives in each group will not all be professional people, but people from all walks of life. So as to allow the problems shared by one or the other can be expressed openly, and working together for a common solution, (whereas a professional man may have a problem that a common man may not be aware of, or perhaps just the opposite).

This group has found that sticking together that more can be accomplished than on an individual basis. This is a political and continuous community project of the present and future.

The committees are not complete, and would appeal to the community of the people of Lubbock for their complete cooperation in this endeavor.

Out of the last meeting a group of candidates was endorsed. They are as follows; Rev. A. W. Wilson, City Councilman Place #4; Olen Bush, City Councilman Place #2; & Walter J. Allison, School Trustee Place #6. The group did not endorse anyone for Mayor, but left this to the better judgement of the citizens of Lubbock.

The selection of these particular candidates is not by random choice. Each was screened by questions and answers, examined as to political views, their ability to contribute to city government, and their willingness to show equalization toward all groups.

The time has now come that the leadership has to be effected, unified, and efficient. It must stand together in all concerns as solidly as the Rock of Gibraltar.

CITY MAN INJURED IN FREAK ACCIDENT

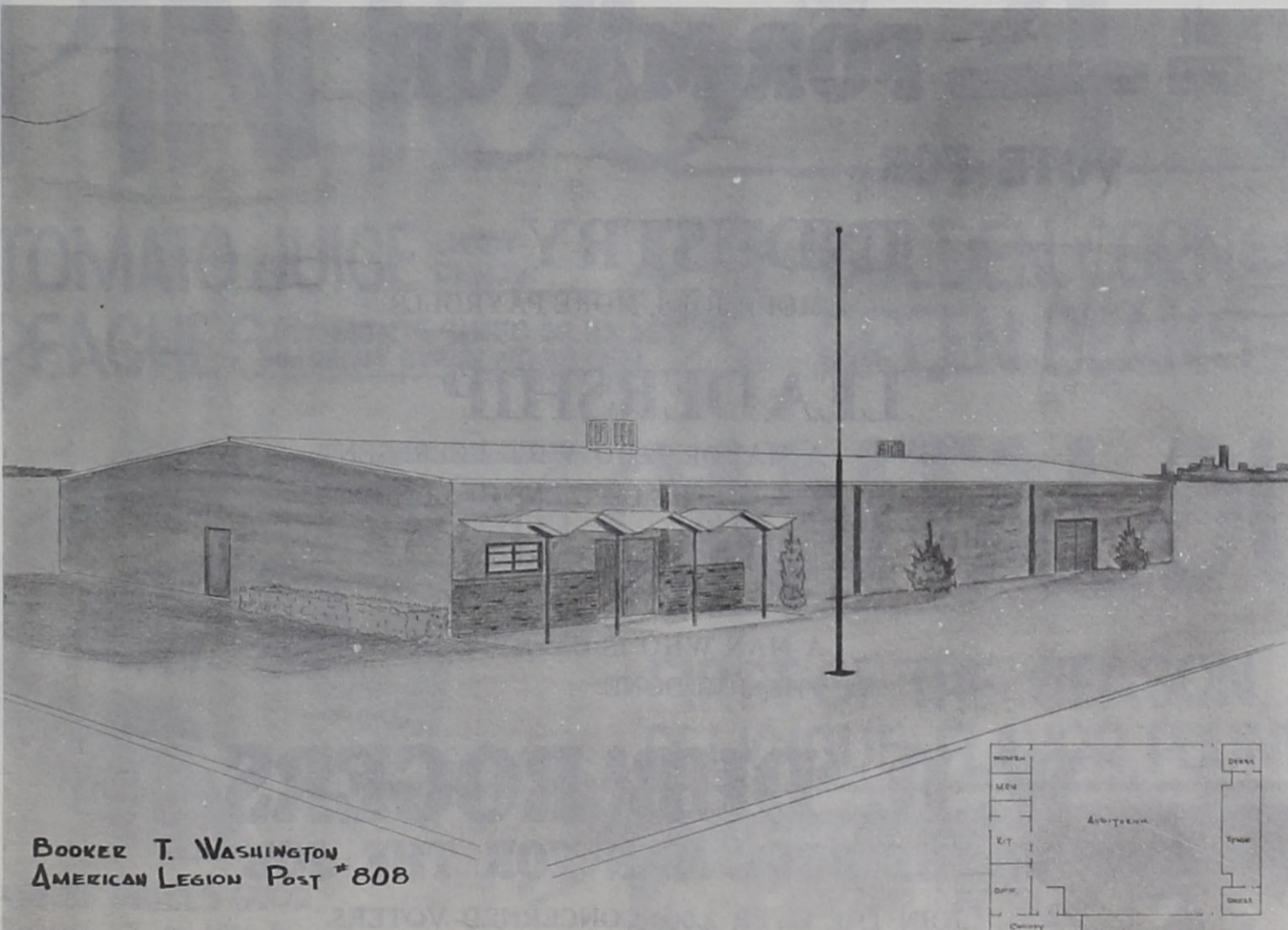
