CAMP LEJEUNE, N.C.— Declaring "I have come to speak to you about how the war in Iraq will end," President Barack will end," President Barack
Obama on Friday moved to fulfill the defining promise of his
campaign, saying all U.S. combat troops will be withdrawn by
the end of August 2010.
But in the same speech

the end of August 2010.
But in the same speech before Marines and military leadership here, he announced that the vast majority of those involved in the pullcut will not leave this year. Obama also said that tens of thousands of U.S. personnel will remain behind afterward.
"The most important deci-

afterward.

"The most important decisions that have to be made about Iraq's future must now be made by Iraqis," the president said at the sprawling Camp Lejeune, N.C., base, which is about to deploy thousands of troops to the U.S's other war front, in A Chamiston.

Senior Obama administration officials had said earlier that of the roughly 100,000 U.S. combat troops to be pulled out of Iraq over the next 18 months, most will remain in the war zone through at least the end of this year to ensure national elections there go smoothly. The pace of withdrawal means that although Obama's promised pullout will Obama's promised pullout will start soon, at will be backloaded, with most troops remining in the last few months of the time

And even after the draw-down, a sizable U.S. force of 35,000 to 50,000 U.S. troops will stay in Iraq under a new mission of training, civilian pro-tection and counterterrorism.

pollsters they believe the long, costly, divisive war was a mistake and more than 4,250 Americans killed there, the Aug. 31, 2010 end date for Iraq war combat operations is slower than Obarna had promised voters as a candidate. The timetable he pledged then would have seen combat end in May 2010.

Regardless, it is a hastened

Regardless, it is a hastened exit, something Obama called a necessity, both for the future of Iraq and to allow the U.S. to refocus its attention more firmly

refocus its attention more firmly on Afghanistan.

"America can no longer afford to see Iraq in isolation from other priorities we face the challenge of refocusing on Afghanistan and Pakistan, of relieving the burden on our military, and of rebuilding our struggling economy and these

itary, and of rebuilding our struggling economy and these are challenges that we will meet," he said.

Obama applaused the mili-tary for its role in an improved situation in Iraq, where violence is down significantly in Baghdad and most of Iraq and U.S. military deaths have plunged.

He also acknowledged that He also acknowledged that many problems remain in the country and said "there will be difficult days ahead." Those include violence that will remain "a part of life," political instability and fundamental unresolved questions, a large displaced and destitute citizenry, tepid support for Iraq's fragile government in the neighborgovernment in the neighbor-hoods and the stress of declining

oil revenues.

But, the president said the U.S. cannot continue to try to solve all Iraq's problems.

"We cannot rid Iraq of all who oppose America or sympathize with our adversaries," he said. "We cannot police Iraq's streets until they are completely safe, nor stay until Iraq's unson is perfected. We cannot sussain indefinitely a commitment that has put a strain on our military, and will cost the American people nearly a trillion dollars."

He emphasized that an end to the war does not mean the U.S. plans to withdraw from its interests in the region. He promised intensified diplomatic and humanitarian efforts.

The end of the war in Iraq will enable a new era of American leadership and engagement in the Middle East," Obama said.



Kirk also agreed to make changes in his accounting of charitable deductions, including reducing the claimed value of a donated television from \$3,000 to \$1,500.







LONDON (AP) - Michael Jackson is making his first live appearance in years, but will it still be a thriller? The King of Pop is due to

meet the press at a London concert arena this week to announce the mother of all comebacks - a string of concerts that organizers hope will net the financially troubled star millions

But after years of erratic behavior, health fears, child-abuse allegations and money woes, is the once-golden Jackson brand tarnished beyond

"Because of what's happened to him and how he's lived his life over the last 20 years, he's made it very difficult for people to out themselves as Michael Jackson fans," British music writer and broadcaster John Aizlewood said Wednesday. "These concerts are a huge opportunity for rehabilitation."

Jackson, 50, flew into London by private jet Tuesday ahead of a "special announcement" Thursday afternoon at the city's O2 Arena. It is widely expected he will announce a

expected he will announce a string of up to 30 dates at the domed arena beside the River Thames, which holds up to 20,000 people It has become a venue of choice for big-name

Britney Spears is due to play there for eight nights in June, Prince did a 21-day series of shows at the arena in 2007, and

shows at the arena in 2007, and Led Zeppelin played a one-off reunion gig there the same year. If organizers hope to see a return of the fan frenzy that once followed Jackson everywhere, they may be disappointed. Only a handful of people joined the packs of press photographers and camera crews Wednesday outside Jackson's London hottel-and several of those said they were seeking autographs to sell on eBay.

One of the best-selling artists of all time, Jackson has sold more than 750 million albums and won 13 Grammy awards. "Thriller," released in 1982, is still the best-selling album of all time.


The lawmakers — all Democrats — said the reception was a welcome change from the

Lawmakers said they presented Obama with a wish-list covering a broad range of topics, many of them economic issues affecting their districts.


