

GOP walks fine line on opposing Sotomayor

WASHINGTON (CNN) — The Republican Party risks fur-ther alternation from Hispanics by challenging the nomination of Sinia Sotomayor, who would become the first Hispanic, and third woman, on the Supreme

third woman, on the Supreme Court.
On Tuesday, President Obama nominated 54-year-old Sotomayor — who is of Puerto Rican descent — to replace the retiring Justice David Souter.
Sotomayor is a judge on the 2nd U.S. Crimut Court of Appeals, named to that post by President Bill Clinton when she was a U.S. District Court judge, nominated by President George H.W. Bush in 1992.

The barbed comments about Sotomayor began almost as soon as the announcement was made at the White House on Tuesday.

ity Rush Limbaugh called Sotomayor a "reverse racist" on his show Limbaugh, who is known for stirring up controver-sy, said be hapes Obania's asim-

ny, and he hopes Obama's cominec fails.

"Do I want her to fail to get on
the court? Yes. She'd be a disaster on the court," he said. "Do I
still want to Obama to fail as
president? Yeah. He's going to
fail anyway, but the sounce the



Settlement Made in James Brown Estate Case



The long suffering saga of who gets what from James Brown's estate was finally set-tled on Tuesday, with nearly half going to his charitable trust, a quarter to his wife and young son, and the rest to Brown's adult children, reports the Associated Press.

The settlement decisions flew in the face of instructions that were outlined in Brown's will and trust following his death on Christmas Day 2006. Some of Brown's adult children contested the bequest, claiming their father's estate was mismanared by trustees.

"I find that the settlement is just and reasonable and provides a just and reasonable result for the charitable beneficiaries," Judge Jack Early wrote. "From the perspective of the charitable beneficiaries, the risks of not approving the settlement agreent are substantial.

ment are substantial."

The exact value of Brown's assets has not been made public. However, during numerous court hearings since the Godfather of Soul's death, there Godfather of Soul's death, there have been claims of unpaid debts, inadequate accounting and misappropriated money. Some of the soul singer's possessions were auctioned for \$850,000, partly to pay debt.

The settlement establishes that Tomi Rae Hynie Brown is the surveyor stores of the lare.

the surviving spouse of the late entertainer and her son is James Brown's child. James Brown II will not be required to take a DNA test.

I am so relieved and happy that the court has approved this settlement," Brown's widow said in a statement to the AP. ly over."
