Lubbock Man, T. J. Patterson in Viet Nam for Service


Cpl. T. J. Patterson has been sent to Viet Nam for duties in services of the U.S.A.



Before 1910 there were two organizations intended to interest boys in wholesome things. One was Ernest Thompson Seton's "Woodcraft Indians" and the other was Dan C. Beard's "Sons of Daniel Boone." These the Boy Scouts of Amera broader foundation.

Boys from twelve to eligible for membership and on admission they take the Scout oath. There are three, or possibly four classes of scouts, tenderfoot, second class and first class. The possible fourth comprises the Eagle Scouts who are those who have won twenty-one merit badges. The Scout law requir es a boy to be trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean and reverent.
