Panthers Topple Carver For Homecoming Crowd

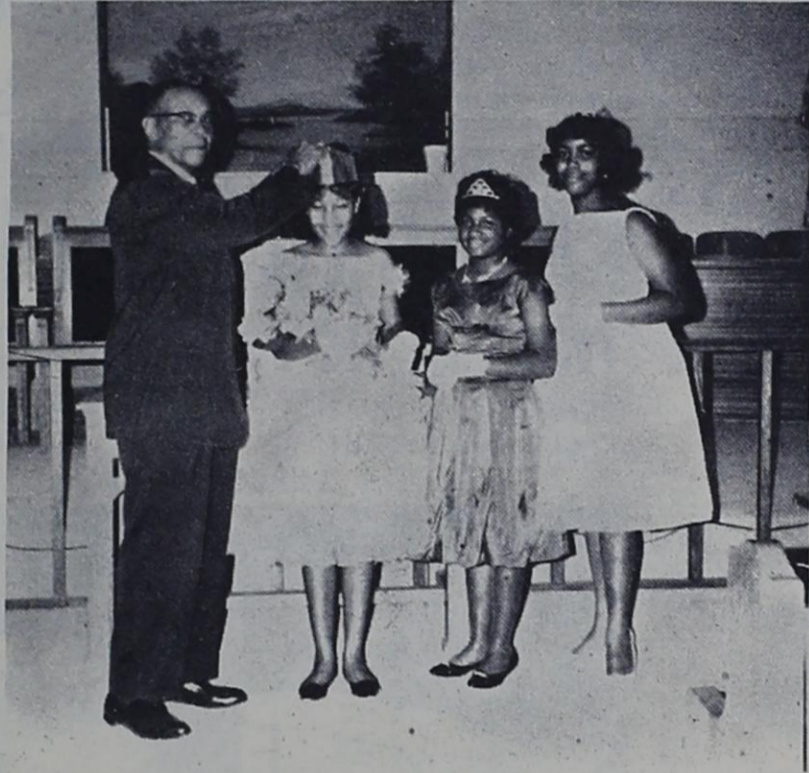
Jo Long Named Miss Mount Gilead

The contest was of considerable significance to the Panthers, and marked their second win in district play. Thus far this season the Panthers have a two win and two tied record in district play. With this game concluding their season of regular district play, they are eagerly awaiting the outcome of the other games between, Amarillo, Odessa, and Midland. The Panthers still have great chances of receiving the district title.
