

Let the light of history enable us to see that "enough of good there is sweeten life; enough of evil in the highest to check presumption; enough there is of both in all estates to bind us in compassionate brotherhood, to teach us impressively that we are one dying and one immortal family." Let truth destroy the dividing prejudices of nationality and teach love without distinction of race, merit or rank.
