Obama: This isn't your 'run-of-the-mill recession'

(CNN) — President Obams appeared before a national audience Monday night to make the case for his economic stamulus plan, saying this is not your "nan-of-the-mill receasion."

The president stressed the urgency of passing the roughly \$838 billion measure, which his administration and Democratic leaders say will help pull the U.S. economy out of its current stead.

'My bottom line is to make

"My bottom line is to make sure that we are saving or creating 4 million jobs, we are making sure that the financial system is working again, that homeowners are getting some relief," he said to his first prime time news conference.

Obuma's remarks came the day before the Senate votes on its version of the stimulus bill. The House passed its version of the stimulus bill nearly two weeks ago — without a single Republican vote. If the measure jusses the Senate, the two chambers will have to reconcile the differences between the two

chambers will have to reconcile the differences between the two bills. See what's in the bills in Ohama urged Congress "to act without delay," saying that only the federal government can break the "vicious cycle" gripping the U.S. occonumy.

"It is absolutely true that we cannot depend on government alone to create jobs or communication to create jobs or communication.

Racist can change his spots, get old as well **Dawn Turner Trice**



By now you've probably heard about the meeting that Wilson, a former member of the KKK who lives in Rock Hill. ICKR who lives in Rock Hill, S.C., had earlier this week with U.S. Rep. John Lewis (D-Ga.) It began this way: Last month, Wilson, 72, read a story in his lower's newspaper about a group of students from the local black coilege who decades ago had faced an angry white mob. They were trying to integrate a dimestore hunch counter.

Wilson was part of that angry mob and another that attacked the congressman, leaving him bloodled.

So, after years of wanting to

So, after years of wanting to make amends. Wilson apologized to the former students. (He's shown in a grainy photograph reveling in having cracked an egg over the head of a young tlack man.) Then, this week. Witson traveled to Washington D.C. to apologize to Lowis for heating him up at a Rock Hill hus depot. Lewis got off the bus in May, 1961, determined to enter a "white only" walfing room. That was when Wilson grabbed Lewis.

During a telephone interview.

During a telephane interview that I had with Wilson—which lasted just over an hour with an old grandfather clock chirung twice in the background—I asked him if he remembered that

"I'm not proud of it," he told

"I'm not proud of it," he fold me.

"Do you remember what you felt after it happened?"

"Well, at the time, it felt, ...! felt like somebody going to play golf and getting a hole in one." he said "I'm ashamed to say that's what I remember feeling. That's how good it felt."

Wilson was born in racially segregated Rock Hill in 1936. His father ran a service station on Main Storet, a stone's throw from McCrory's drine sture where, in the 1960s, the Friendship Junior College students would stage sit-ins at the lunch counter During WHI, Wilson's father handed out rutton tickets to blacks so they

could get sugar. Hour and eggs.
Wilson said that his father
would have been ashaned of the
son's behavior. "I have never would have been ashanced of the son's behavior. "I have never known my father to matrear a black person m'my life," Wilson told me. "So you ask me why I tamed out this way I'd say it was the crowd. My fither used to say, bads of a leather flock together. Nothing iruer than that. I was angry I thought blacks were trying to know more than is; be higher than us."

Long before Wilson and his

Long before Wilson and his friends met Lews at that bus station. Wilson had been involved in other hate crimes. "We used to catch filecks tate at night, we'd catch them walking down the sidewalks and throw cantaloupes at them." he said "Or, we'd get out the car and beat them and a wouldn't be four or five jumping on one. We'd make it one on one and the others would watch."

Wilson said he and his friends made a sport out of it. "There were many incidents of as stopping people. I'm not bragging about it. I'm advanted of it. I wish I could take steps backwards but I'm taking steps forwards."

So, why the transformation? This was a story that Wilson could have sat on. At 72 years old, he could have gone to his grave hiding what he said occurred back when he was 19 to 25 years old His wife of 50 years never lonew. His son dain't know Wilson said his son cred tike a haby as the details streed to come out this week in the congressman's office.

take a haby as the details started to come out this week in the congressman's office.

"A friend said to me, "If you died right now do you know where you'd go?" I said. To hell." I just had a lot on my shoulders and in my heart," Wilson said. "I just wanted to get right with people. It took me years to know what I did was wrong. "He said when he finally left Rock Hill, he was in the air force in Biloxi, Mississippi, and he began to associate with black airmen in the harracks.

Former Klu Klux Klan Member Apologizes!

Representative John Lewis who he beat nearly 50 years ago at a South Carolina bus station.

The written report is Elwin Wilson was an unabashed racist, the sort who once hung a black doll from a noose outside his home, John Lewis was a young civil rights leader bent on changing laws, if not hearts and minds, even if it cost him his life.

They faced each other at a South Carolina bus station during a protest in 1961. Wilson-joined a white gang that jeered Lewis, attacked him and left him bloodied on the ground. Forty-eight years later, the men met again-this time so Wilson could apologize to Lewis and express regret for his hatred. Lewis, now a congress-

Lewis and express regret for his hatred Lewis, now a congress-man from Atlanta, Georgia greefed his former tormentor at his Capitol Hill office. "I just told him that I was sorry," Wilson, 72, said in a tele-

he travel home to Rock Hill, S.C. For years, he said, he tried to block the sneident out of his mind "and couldn't do it."

Lewis said Wilson is the first person involved in the dozens of attacks against him during the civil rights era to step forward and apologize. When they met Tuesday (February 3, 2009), Lewis offered forgiveness with-

'I was moved," said Lewis. "I was moved," said Lewis.
"He was very, very sincere, and I think it takes a lot of raw courage to be willing to come forward the way he did.

I think it will lead to a great deal of healing."

Wilson said he had felt an urge to voice his remorse for years. He talked about his past activities. I few weeks, are with

activities a few weeks ago with a friend, and the friend asked him where he thought he might go if he died.

"I said probably hell,
"Wilson said. "He said, Well,
you don't have to."

The paper aired their comments and documented an emotional meeting with the local activists at a former whites-only lunch counter in downtown Rock Hill, where Wilson had antagonized demonstrators durated with the counter of the cou

After meeting with the local activists. Wilson realized that Lewis must have been the young black man he had attacked at the bust station that same year, when a bust carrying two

Freedom Riders rolled into town. The riders were Lewis, who is black, and the late Albert Bigelow, who was white. Neither pressed charges over the

This writer watched on CNN the former Klansman Elwin Wilson apologize to the "whole world" for beating Rep. John Lewis more than 50 years ago. His demeanor and action spoke of a 72 year-old-man who was deeply troubled by his past behavior. Here was a man who had spoken with his friend who did not want to die and go to hell for hating someone who did not look like him. His action demonstrates the capacity of people to change. This writer watched on CNN

John, a slave trader, was on his way from the coast of Africa with slaves when he ran into a violent storm. He recorded in his journal that when all seemed lost and the ship would surely sink, he exclaimed "Lord, have mercy upon us." Later in his cabin he reflected on what he had said and began to believe that God had addressed him through the storm and that erace had began storm and that grace had begun

His pursuit for a college degree led him to the University of Chicago. Woodson earned his bachelor's degree in 1907 and masters in 1908. His thrist for knowledge continued and he became the second African American to earn a Ph.D. from Harvard University in 1912 after W. E. B. Du Bots. Woodson furthured his studies at the Sorbonne in Paris and spoke fluent French. He also studied in the Philippines and Africa.

In 1915, Woodson founded the Association for the study of Negro Life. This organigation is still alive almost a centry later as the Association for the Study of Afro-American Life and History (ASALH).
