A hospital spokesman said doctors believed Cole could leave the hospital in baout ten days and return for treatment every other week. However, the velvet-voiced singer waa advised to cancel all professional engagements for the next few months "to allow for full recuperation."

The hospital announcement said doctors hoped to reduce the size of the tumor through Coblat treatments.

Cole, whose records sell more than seven million copies each year, collapsed during a Las Vegas, Nevada, nig htclub appearance and he originally was suffering from exhaustion and a virus.
