

## Paul Quinn College Loses AccreditationLast Month

Quinn College has lost its accreditation because of finan-cial and academic problems, officials said Thursday, June 25, 2009 – a devastating blow that jeopardizes the future of the tiny liberal arts college in southern Dallas.

other colleges
It ultimately could force Paul
Quinn's 440 students to find
another school.

They had made progress but they ran out of time before they could come into compliance on everything, said Belle Wheelan, president of the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

Paul Quinn, one of eight historically black colleges in Texas, was put on probation two years ago it still fell short in three areas financial resources, financial stability and institutional effectiveness—essentially a college's ability to teach students what they need to know.

"They didn't have enough money. They were in debt," Wheelan said.

President Michael Sorrell said he was disappointed by the

President Michael Sorrell said he was disappointed by the

decision.

We're absolutely going to file an appeal," he said. "One of the issues folks need to understand is that we made a phenom-

For instance, he said the college expects to have a surplus of more than \$200,000 at the end of this fiscal year.

Paul Quinn had failed a federal test of financial responsibility, based on last fiscal year. Colleges in that situation face extra federal scrutiny and must post letters of credit so they can continue to receive and award federal student aid.

lose accreditation. Wheelan said
the last time that happened with
her agency was in 2007, with St.
Andrews Presbyterian College
in North Carolina, also because
of financial problems. Later,
however, a federal judge
ordered the accrediting agency
to reinstate the school's accreditation.

Sorreli is Paul Quion's fifth college president since 2001. A businessman, lawyer and political consultant. Sorrell was widely considered the best shot at turning around the long-struggling school.

In two years, he has instituted a number of changes, including a business-casual dress code, tougher academic standards and more aggressive recruiting.

"He made great progress He just didn't make enough progress," Wheelan said.

With classes in summer rocess, the 130-acre campus was mostly vacant Thursday. A guard at the front gate denied access to anyone without an Sorrell is Paul Ouinn's fifth

education major, said he strug-gled with college in Muskegon, Mich., and followed two family members to Paul Quinn. He said the Dallas school has served him

"It's a school where you are identified by name, not just number. Anytime I needed anything they were there. It's very family-oriented. The president was always walking around. shaking hands, checking on stu-dents," he said. "He always had an open-door policy." Sorrell said he did not want

to speculate on what loss of accreditation means for faculty

accreditation means for faculty and students.

"I want to stop short of rendering opinions on things like that until we've exhausted the appeal process," he said.

Dallas ISD trustee Ron Price is a Paul Quinn graduate. He said he was disappointed that the campus lost accreditation, and he noted that it often leads to a college's closing.

400-plus students who put their time, energy and resources into the college," he said.

Baker, 21, last year's sophomore class president, said he will transfer if future classes won't count toward a degree.
"But I'm going to continue to believe I'll come back here in September," he said. "Even though we are struggling, i believe it will turn around."

calling an attempted robbery.
Atlanta police Sgt. Lisa
Keyes said in an e-mail Sunday
that the 38-year-old Forrest was
shot several times in the back
late Saturday night on a street





#### Beware of First-Time Homebuyer Credit Fraud

DALLAS — The Internal Revenue Service today announced its first successful prosecution related to fraud involving the first-time homeinvolving the first-time home-buyer credit, and warned tax-payers to beware of this type of scheme. On Thursday July 23, 2009, a Jacksonville, Fla.-tax preparer, James Otto Price III, pled guilty to falsely claiming the first-time homebuyer credit on a federal tax return. Price faces the possibility of up to three years in jail, a fine of as much as \$250,000, or both. To date, the IRS has executed seven-search warrants and cur-rently has 24 open criminal investigations in pursuit of potential instances of fraud involving the credit. The agency has a number of sophisticated

has a number of sophisticated computer screening tools to quickly identify returns that may contain fraudulent claims for the first-time homebuyer

credit.
"We will vigorously pursue anyone who falsely tries to claim this or any other tax credit or deduction," saud Eileen Mayer, Chief, IRS Criminal Investigation. "The penalties for tax fraud are steep. Taxpayers should be wary of anyone who promises to see

Taxpayers should be wary of anyone who promises to get them a big refund."

Whether a taxpayer prepares his or her own return or uses the services of a paid preparer, it is the taxpayer who is ultimately responsible for the accuracy of the return. Fraudulent returns may result not only in the required payment of back taxes but also in penalties and interest. penalties and interest.

#### First-Time

Credit
The First-Time Homebuyer The First-Time Homebuyer Credit, originally passed in 2008 and modified in 2009, provides up to \$8,000 for first-time homebuyers. The purchaser, however, must qualify as a first-time homebuyer, which for purposes of this credit means someposes of this credit means someone who has not owned a primary residence in the past three years. If the taxpayer is married, this requirement also applies to the taxpayer's spouse. The home purchase must close before Dec. 1, 2009, to qualify, and the credit may not be claimed on the purchaser's tax return until after the taxpayer closes and has purchased the home.

Different rules apply for homes bought in 2008.



NEW YORK (AP) -Michael Vick is back in the NFL Now all he needs is a team

NFL Now all ne needs is a team to play for.

Vick, free after serving 18 months in prison for running a dogfighting ring, was reinstated with conditions by NFL commissioner Roger Goodell on July 27. He could participate in resular-season games as early as regular-season games as early as

October.

Vick can immediately take part in preseason practices, workouts and meetings and can play in the final two preseason games — if he can find a team that will sign him. A number of teams have already said they

Once the season begins, Vick may participate in all team activities except games, and Goodell said he would consider Vick for full reinstatement by Week 6 (Oct. 18-19) at the lat-

est.
Goodell suspended Vick indefinitely in August 2007 after the former Atlanta Falcons quarterback admitted bankrolling a dogfighting operation on his property in Virginia. At the time, Goodell said Vick must show remorse before he would consider remissions.

"I accept that you are sincere when you say that you want to, and will, turn your life around, and that you intend to be a posi-

tive role model for others," Goodell said in his letter to Vick. "I am prepared to offer you that opportunity. Whether you succeed is entirely in your hands."

"Needless to say, your mar-gin for error is extremely limit-ed," the letter said. "I urge you to take full advantage of the resources available to support you and to dedicate yourself to rebuilding your life and your career. If you do this, the NFL will support you." Vick, once the highest-paid player in the league, said he was grateful for a second chance.

player in the league, said he was grateful for a second chance.

"I would like to express my sincere gratitude and appreciation to commissioner Goodell for allowing me to be readmitted to the National Football League," Vick said in a statement released by his agent, Joel Segal. "I fully understand that playing football in the NFL is a privilege, not a right, and I am truly thankful for the opportunity I have been given. ty I have been given.

two years have given me time to rwo years have given me time to reevaluate my life, mature as an individual and fully understand the terrible mistakes I have made in the past and what type of life I must lead moving for-

The announcement came after a busy first week of free-dom for Vick, who met with union leaders and Goodell on consecutive days last week. His 23-month federal sentence ended when an electronic monitor was removed from his ankle early on July 20 at his home in Hampton, Va.

He met with DeMaurice Smith, executive director of the

Smith, executive director of the NFL Players Association, last Tuesday and, on Wednesday, he sat down with Goodell at a security firm in Allendale, N.J. Goodell suggested that preventing Vick from playing at the start of the regular season wasn't a punishment but an opportunity for the quarterback to gradually make a transition back into ually make a transition back into

ually make a transition back into the league.
"I have thought about every alternative, but I think this gives him the best chance for suc-cess," Goodell said. "We are not looking for failure here. We are looking to see a young man suc-ceed."

But Vick's issues are far from But vick's issues are far from over and he needs a team to call his own. Already, the owners of the New York Giants and New York Jets said they have no interest in the 29-year-old quarterback, who was officially released by the Falcons last roomh.







The conflict began with a march by about 100 mostly black activists who avoided a designated "protest zone" near Paris' courthouse and walked to the town square to chants of "Black Power!" and "No Justice, no peace!"

"We're going to be boxed in!" said protest leader Jimmy Blackwell of the Tarrant

Once at the town square, the crowd ballooned to about 200 mostly black people on one side of a street. Across the street were about a dozen white supremacists, including four skinheads holding Nari swasti-ka flags. About 30 other white

Some of the signs at the protest read, "Friends don't drag friends under pickop frucks," and "Who killed Brandon McClelland?" Another sign referred to the district attorney as a "Weapon of Mass Destruction." Destruction '

The protest was led by members of the Houston chapters of the Nation of Islam and the New Black Panther Party, which the Southern Poverty Law Center considers black separatist and bate groups.

Things grew tense early on when a member of the Panthers walked into the protest zone set up for white supremacists and stood inches away from a skin-head. The skinhead screamed at

the black man to go home as the two stood inches apart.

"We're not here for con-frontation. We are peaceful peo-ple, but if necessary we are prepared." Blackwell said.
