On Monday evening August 31, 2009, at the main offices of City Bank, the 100 Black Men of West Texas, Inc. awarded scholarships to two outstanding local youth. City Bank served as the host of the 2009 Scholarship Reception of the 100 Black Men organization.

This year's scholarship recipients are Jennifer McGrew and Robert Sage Floyd. Jennifer McGrew is a 2009 graduate of Estacado High School in Lubbock, Texas who finished number two (2) in her class, serving as the class salutatorian. Jennifer will be attending the prestigious Dartmouth College next month on a full scholarship. Jennifer will major in Pre-med and Psychology. Ms. Rogers further impressed the attendees by reporting that her career goal is to become a general surgeon. Robert Sage Floyd is a 2009 graduate of Monterey High School in Lubbock, Texas and he finished in the top five (5) percent of his class. Because Robert received 42 hours of college credit while in high school, he impressively entered Texas Tech University last week as a sophomore and is majoring in International Business Finance. In addition to both recipients obtaining top scores on their qualifying scholarship essays for the 100 Black Men scholarship program, both students proved that they are very well rounded displaying diverse

extra curricular activities and significant community involvement.

Monday's program featured a keynote address by the 100 Black Men of West Texas' esteemed Vice President, Dr. Charles Henry, Ph.D. better known as "Prof." Dr. Henry challenged the scholarship recipients to continuously seek and achieve their highest aspirations and to remember that their "attitude, and their aptitude will help determine their altitude." Additionally, Monday's audience was roused by inspirational songs delivered by Lubbock City Councilman and 100 member, Floyd Price; storytelling by Eric Strong, and a dramatic reading by the young Mr. Royce Harris. Motivational remarks were given by Education Chairman and program emcee J. Leon Williams. The organization's Media and Public Relations Liaison, Calvin Davis, provided an historical inspired account of the 100 Black Men organization. Mr. Davis stated that the 100 is living up to the National mandate for all of the 120 chapters worldwide which is to "Place Education on the Front Line in 2 0 0 9."

Mr. Davis pointed out that the fruit of our labor from this mandate is being evidenced by the current scholarship awards and by the 100's perpetual scholarship program

as well as by the implementation of the 100's "Commendable Program" at the Lubbock Independent School District. The Commendable Program provides cash awards for students who achieve a commendable score on the Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS) examination. After short but impressive acceptance remarks by both scholarship recipients, Jennifer McGrew and Robert Sage Floyd, 100 Black Men of West Texas President, Greg Ricks, provided closing remarks wherein he reassured the attendees of the 100's mandate to Place Education on the Front Line. After acknowledging the good work of the men of the 100, in a divinely inspired moment, President Ricks invited all in attendance to touch or to reach out to the scholarship recipients as he prayed a prayer of success, protection, love, peace, and prosperity on these young recipients and for all students and their families.

The 100 Black Men of West Texas commends future leaders Jennifer McGrew and Robert Sage Floyd for their achievements and we proclaim ourselves as stakeholders in their future success.

Clergy Warned After Pastor's 'Horroric' Slaying

ANADARKO, Okla. (AP) — Authorities warned pastors in a town where a preacher was brutally killed inside her own church that they should take precautions at their buildings, even as police refused to say exactly what happened.

District Attorney Bret Burns, who described the killing as "horrific," held a closed-door session with about two dozen pastors, along with members of law enforcement. Several pastors

who were there said authorities did not discuss any facts of the case.

"We talked about security issues within their churches and their congregations," Burns said. "We asked them to remain vigilant and be aware of their surroundings and their church locations."

He did not say why the meeting was held just with pastors rather than the community at large, or what kind of a threat the clergy might face.

"You want your church to be accessible, but you also are aware of what the world is like and you're aware of the people you minister to and take precautions."

Ben Sullivan, executive director of the Christian Center of Anadarko, which runs a soup kitchen and food pantry, said he's not fearful of another attack but plans to tighten security at his facility a few blocks away from where the killing happened. He said the center will probably close before dark and volunteers will work in pairs.

"We're always keeping our eyes open because of the work we do. We deal with people that aren't in the best of situations," he said.

Daniels, who lived in Oklahoma City, made the 60-mile drive to Anadarko every week, even though the small, weather-beaten church had no regular congregation. On Wednesday, a makeshift memorial of stuffed animals, flowers and a candle stood at the front door of the church, where a sign with Daniels' name read: "God Loves You!"

Randalyn Holder, whose mother lives nearby, rode by the church on her bicycle and stopped to prop a small, wooden cross against the door.

"I never knew her or met her, but I think about the faith she had to come down here every week," she said.
