HAUPTMANN AT HOME DURING KIDNAPING

Says in Attempt To Halt Extradition To New Jersey

NEW YORK, Oct. 15.—Bruno Richard Hauptmann, trying to escape extradition to New Jersey to face trial on a charge of slaying the kidnaped Lindbergh baby, testified in the Bronx supreme court today he was at his Bronx home on the night of March 1, 1932, when the baby was abducted.

His wife, Anna, testified in support to Hauptmann's alibi. Hauptmann claimed he took his wife home from a Bronx luncheon where she worked that night, had supper and stayed home all night.

Hauptmann was calm and off-hand in his manner.

5-Year Extension Is Given by RFC

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15.—A five-year extension, where possible and desired, was decreed today by the Reconstruction corporation for all outstanding loans.

Jesse H. Jones, chairman of the corporation, released a note sent to managers of RFC agencies. "I wish to emphasize," he said, "that it is the desire of the directors of this corporation that leniency be granted all borrowers, and where our security will not suffer by giving extensions that they be granted where desired for as much as five years from next January 31."

"Partial payments are preferable, but forced liquidation is not in the interest of recovery. "We wish to be as helpful as possible to our borrowers in meeting their obligations of citizenship, as well as paying their debts to the corporation."

The fire broke out shortly after 2 o'clock and continued nearly two hours before being extinguished. The fire started a considerable distance northwest of the livestock exchange building and swept toward and across the Kansas state line. The exchange building and packing plants were not endangered. Livestock exchange officials estimated the damage at \$8,000.
