## SHOWERS LAST NIGHT REACH HALF INCH

### Rains General Over Territory, Light In Most Places

A washout on a creek running into the Canadian river last night delayed traffic on the Fort Worth and Denver railroad for a few hours today. Although a running schedule was soon worked out, officials stated it would be a day or two before traffic became normal again.

Another shower during the early hours yesterday evening brought the total of precipitation in the Memphis territory to approximately half an inch. A heavy shower fell in Memphis at about 9:30, lasting only a few minutes, and adding .25 inch to the total of about the same period that fell here early yesterday morning.

The showers last night covered the entire territory, extending from Amarillo south to Childress, according to Fort Worth and Denver dispatchers. The weather here today continued slightly cloudy.

## Alcatraz Guardsmen Fire on Speed Boats

San FRANCISCO, Oct. 18.—Twice in the last two weeks guards on Alcatraz Island, new federal prison for incorrigibles, have fired on speed boats that cruised within the 300-yard deadline.

This was disclosed by Warden James A. Johnson, who added: "We mean business."

"The occupants might have been either persons attempting to communicate with prisoners, or they may have been someone trying to find out what would happen," he said.

## YOUTH CHARGED WITH FELONY THEFT

### Bond Set at \$1,000 In Burglary of Pierce Home

Donnie Jones, 21, was charged in district court this morning with a felony theft following an arrest Saturday night by members of the sheriff's department. Jones is charged with the theft of clothing in excess of \$50 from the home of L. D. Pierce Friday night.

Jones has been held in county jail since his arrest Saturday night, and his bond was set this morning at \$1,000. The Pierce home in the southwest portion of Memphis was burglarized during the early hours Friday evening while Mr. Pierce and family were away from home.

After Jones makes bond he will be bound over to the district grand jury for investigation during the February term of court.

## OVER 60 WOMEN ATTEND SCHOOL

### Free Canning Demonstration Here Yesterday Afternoon Is Decided Success

More than 60 women from Memphis and surrounding territory attended a free canning demonstration given here yesterday by Mrs. Ima C. Hensarling, canning expert who is working through the Extension department of A & M college.

The canning of black-eyed peas and apples featured a three-hour demonstration in the W. H. Craven building at 605 Main street. The peas were chosen as the vegetable to be canned and the apples as the fruit. The preparation and serving of a "canned meal" was also explained by Mrs. Hensarling during the interesting class held here.

The class began at 2:30 o'clock with an explanation by Mrs. Hensarling on the best and newest methods of canning food stuff with the least amount of spoilage.

Classes here were arranged by County Agent James A. Jackson. Mrs. Hensarling will give a demonstration today in Clarendon and tomorrow at Claude.

## Acrobat Dies in Plunge to Stage

NEW YORK, Oct. 18.—Mary Larkin, 20-year-old acrobat plunged to her death last night on the stage of the Roxy Theatre, crashing to the floor at the feet of her husband, Charles, as he responded with bows and smiles to the applause of the audience.

A moment of silence, then shrill screams of women patrons as many half rose from their seats in horror. Six women fainted and were carried unconscious to the theatre's emergency hospital.

Larkin bent over and lifted his wife's broken body in his arms as stage hands hurriedly dropped the curtains. She had fallen 40 feet from a tight wire on which she rode a unicycle.

## ALLEGED MASTER MIND IN ASSASSINATION OF ALEXANDER ARRESTED

TURIN, Italy, Oct. 18.—Dr. Ante Pavelich and Egon Kvaternik, alleged by French police to be the master minds behind the assassinations of King Alexander of Yugoslavia and Foreign Minister Louis Barthou of France, were arrested here today at the request of France.

Both denied complicity in the assassinations but they were held in jail awaiting the arrival of French police.

BERLIN, Oct. 18.—Elaborate civilian air defense plans calling for the construction of gas and bomb proof cellars in every Berlin building, was announced today by Emil Van Loeper, air defense league leader.

Superannuated buildings are to be raised and subterranean "safety islands" be built on main traffic centers.

## YOUTH IS GIVEN 10 YEARS IN FORD CASE

### Attempted Extortion Ends in Indictment And Sentence

DETROIT, Oct. 18.—A youth of 20, who admitted in federal court he had written Edsel B. Ford that "you are on the spot and if you want to live it will cost you \$5,000," was indicted, arraigned, pleaded guilty and sentenced to 10 years in the federal penitentiary at Leavenworth in one of the speediest cases in United States district court records here.

The youth, Edward Lickwala, was arrested yesterday, but the fact was kept secret until yesterday morning, when Williamson Larson, chief of the department of justice investigation bureau here, announced he had confessed after his handwriting had been found to correspond with that in the extortion trial.

The sentence imposed by Federal Judge Edward J. Moinet, was under the recently amended "Lindbergh law," and was just one-half the maximum provided by that state.

Although Lickwala told Larson that "I never meant to kill him; I just wanted to scare him; he's got lots of money and I wanted some of it," he received his sentence in federal court with an air of bravado. He boasted to the court of previous offenses, mainly charges of tampering with automobiles, and when sentence was passed, he turned to the audience in the courtroom with a smirk. He was to be taken to the federal detention farm at Milan tonight to await transfer to Leavenworth.

## NEGRO FINED

Jack Coats, negro, was fined \$5 and court costs in Justice of Peace court yesterday on charges of disturbing the peace. He is being held in county jail.

LOUISVILLE, Oct. 18.—A special grand jury to inquire into the kidnaping of Mrs. Alice Stoll was ordered impanelled Saturday by Federal Judge Charles Dawson.

The order was issued on a motion by United States District Attorney Thomas Sparks who announced yesterday he would demand the death penalty for Thomas Robinson, Jr., lunatic sought as the man who abducted the young society matron and held her for six days for \$50,000 ransom.

A possible clue to the whereabouts of Robinson was seen in a report from Hopkinsville, Ky., that one of the \$10 bills had been found there.

Mrs. Frances Robinson, charged jointly with her husband, refused to eat breakfast in jail today and sent a note demanding counsel "as my right."

The note was referred to the district attorney.

The man who drove the car spent the night in a Springfield rooming house but fled before officers arrived.

LOUISVILLE, Oct. 18.—Earl Connelly, of the department of justice, today announced that a typewriter found in an Indianapolis apartment where Alice Speed Stoll was held captive, was the one used to type the note demanding \$50,000 for the woman's release.

He said the identification was made in the department of justice laboratory in Washington.

## Man, Clinging to Rope, Saves Life

NEW YORK, Oct. 18.—Clinging grimly to a rope with one hand 150 feet above street level and holding on to a sixty-pound bucket of water-proofing material with the other, Perry Fast, building trades worker, narrowly escaped death Wednesday. His companion, Joseph Alampi, 35, plunged to his death when the scaffold collapsed. While horrified spectators watched, the 21-year-old workman was hauled to safety by two workmen in a fifteenth floor apartment.

## Colorful Career Closed by Death

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif., Oct. 18.—Asa Keys, 57, whose colorful career for many years as the ace court prosecutor in the district attorney's office and later as district attorney, led to prison for bribery, died today following a paralytic stroke.

## YOUTH CHARGED AFTER FATAL AFFRAY AT DANCE

ANTLERS, Okla., Oct. 18.—A warrant charging murder was issued against Bascom Colley, 20, Rattan, Okla., in the death late Tuesday night of Ernest Wooten, 27, of the same community. Officers said witnesses told them Wooten shot Colley at a community dance after alleged ill feelings between the young men for some time.

# Cyclone Ready To Meet Miami Chiefs Tomorrow Night

## WRITER PICKS MEMPHIS BY 13 POINTS

### Invaders Touted as Strong Club After Clarendon Win

Believing that they have at least found some stiff competition, the Memphis Cyclone goes against the Miami Warriors under the floodlights of Fair Park stadium here tomorrow night at 8 o'clock.

The squad eases down today, prepared to again open their accurate aerial attack and varied running machine against the invaders. Except for a few minor bruises, following a week of intensive drills, the men of Coach Chesty Walker are ready for the Clash.

#### Norman To Be Ready

Although Co-Captain Jack Norman seemed to be in the way of the injury jinx this week, as well as one or two other squadmen, every member of the team is expected to be ready to go tomorrow night.

Local fans are still a bit uncertain about the actual strength of the opponent. It is known that Miami defeated Clarendon by a couple of touchdowns and came in less than two yards of making three more, but how these touchdowns were made, who made them, where the power lies and what type of attack the Chiefs will remain to be determined tomorrow night.

#### Comparative Scores

It is accepted that Clarendon is not so powerful as the Bronco club has been in recent years and that it probably will not play a single game in which it battles as it will against the Cyclone here in a few weeks.

By comparative scores, Memphis is some 90 points above the Bronco eleven, but certainly that is not likely to be accepted by anyone who knows the history of Memphis-Clarendon football.

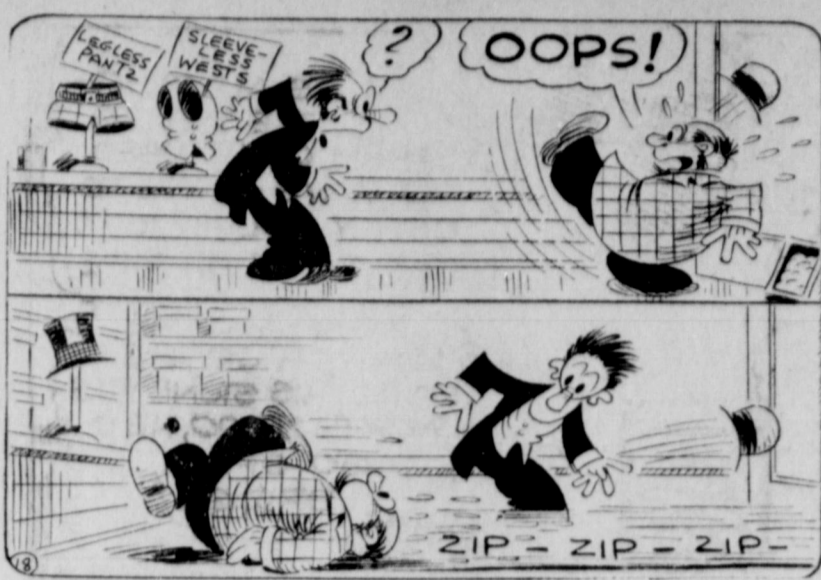

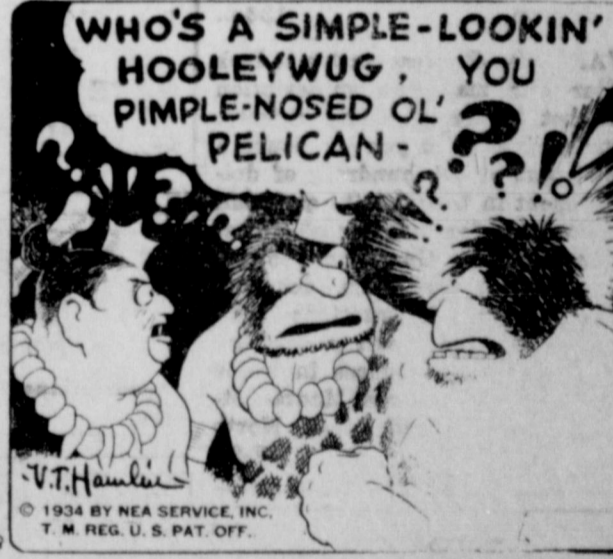

# Cyclone Ready To Meet Miami Chiefs Tomorrow Night

## WRITER PICKS MEMPHIS BY 13 POINTS

### Invaders Touted as Strong Club After Clarendon Win

Believing that they have at least found some stiff competition, the Memphis Cyclone goes against the Miami Warriors under the floodlights of Fair Park stadium here tomorrow night at 8 o'clock.

The squad eases down today, prepared to again open their accurate aerial attack and varied running machine against the invaders. Except for a few minor bruises, following a week of intensive drills, the men of Coach Chesty Walker are ready for the Clash.

#### Norman To Be Ready

Although Co-Captain Jack Norman seemed to be in the way of the injury jinx this week, as well as one or two other squadmen, every member of the team is expected to be ready to go tomorrow night.

Local fans are still a bit uncertain about the actual strength of the opponent. It is known that Miami defeated Clarendon by a couple of touchdowns and came in less than two yards of making three more, but how these touchdowns were made, who made them, where the power lies and what type of attack the Chiefs have still remain to be determined tomorrow night.

#### Comparative Scores

It is accepted that Clarendon is not so powerful as the Bronco club has been in recent years and that it probably will not play a single game in which it battles as it will against the Cyclone here in a few weeks. By comparative scores, Memphis is some 90 points above the Bronco eleven, but certainly that is not likely to be accepted by anyone who knows the history of Memphis-Clarendon football.
