d'Orient is produced, and it is with this essence that imitation pearls are manufactured.

The blay is described as "a small fish, a green back and a white belly," and the essence is obtained exclusively from the white scales which are covered with a pigment of metallic appearance. They are first treated with ammoria and then with a fish glue, a powder being first obtained and then a paste which can be easily spread on glass.

In the early stages of manu facture, about 1656, this essence d'Orient was applied to little balls of plaster, but the temperature and the damp heat of the human body modified the adhesive qualities of the pearly matter and caused changes of color. It was in 1680 that a Parisian, named crease over 1912 of \$137,000. Jacquin, invented a method of covering small glass balls with Steve Snyder, Peter Snyder the same essence d'Orient, thus producing the first practical arti ficial pearls.


