Open Fire Door Is Believed Cause Of Disaster

CLEVELAND, May 16 (AP)—The fire door leading from the x-ray room in the Cleveland Clinic where the first explosion occurred yesterday had been left open, state fire warden investigating the tragedy announced today.

BLOOD TESTS
CLEVELAND, O., May 16 (AP)—Coroner A. J. Pease announced blood tests of victims of the Cleveland Clinic explosion showed death was caused by inhalation of hydrocyanic acid gas and bromine gas, both of which were present in large quantities.

DO NOT AGREE
CLEVELAND, May 16 (AP)—Physicians of the Cleveland Clinic rocked by two explosions of gas which killed more than 100 persons, were unable to agree with authorities and other doctors interested in the calamity upon which worked their way in the building.

ROBISON'S POLICY IS

AUSTIN, May 16 (AP)—The "one cent per acre fund" created by assessments against purchasers of state lands was at all times a public fund and all the money which remained unexpended by the land commissioner in the actual administration of the 1925 reappraisal act is the property of the state, the joint legislative committee which investigated the land office, concluded, it told both houses in its report today.

The acceptance of gifts and gratuities as practiced by the land commissioner, if carried on by officials of a democratic form of government to any extent, is calculated to destroy the confidence of the citizenship in the government, and finally to wreck and destroy the same, the report said.

SAN FELIPE, Cal., May 16.—Coming to the defense of her fiancé, Jerry Ogden, accused of murdering his father, Lucy Peebles has launched an independent inquiry into the slaying. The girl was frantic when she learned of the accusation, but with her uncle, John Peebles, who discovered the killing, insists that the police evidence is incomplete and shields the real murderer.

The body of Andrew Ogden, wealthy civic leader, was found slumped over a desk in the library of his home, a dagger in his neck. Peebles had rushed to his neighbor's home in answer to an urgent telephone call from Ogden and discovered the sensational crime. Police investigating the case announced a few hours later that a strong net of circumstantial evidence points to the fugitive Jerry as the slayer.

Microscope Helps Solve Chicago Murders

By JOE LOVE NEA Service Writer CHICAGO, May 14.—Everybody is familiar with the detective story sleuth, who solves murders by twiddling microscopes and picking up specks of dust with tweezers.

In "real life" such "detectives" aren't so common. The average police force would shoot a sleuth of that nature on sight.

Major Goddard is known as the foremost ballistic expert in America. His method of operation, briefly, is this: every gun makes characteristic scratches on its bullets—marks that no other gun can duplicate.

"There is no more chance of two guns leaving identical marks on bullets or shells than there is of two persons having an identical set of finger prints," says Major Goddard.
