Worship service each Lord's day at 10:55 a.m. The sermon topic this Lord's day will be, "Is Conscience a Safe Guide?"

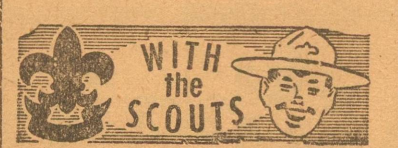
The Herald of Truth can be heard each Sunday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock over the San Angelo station.

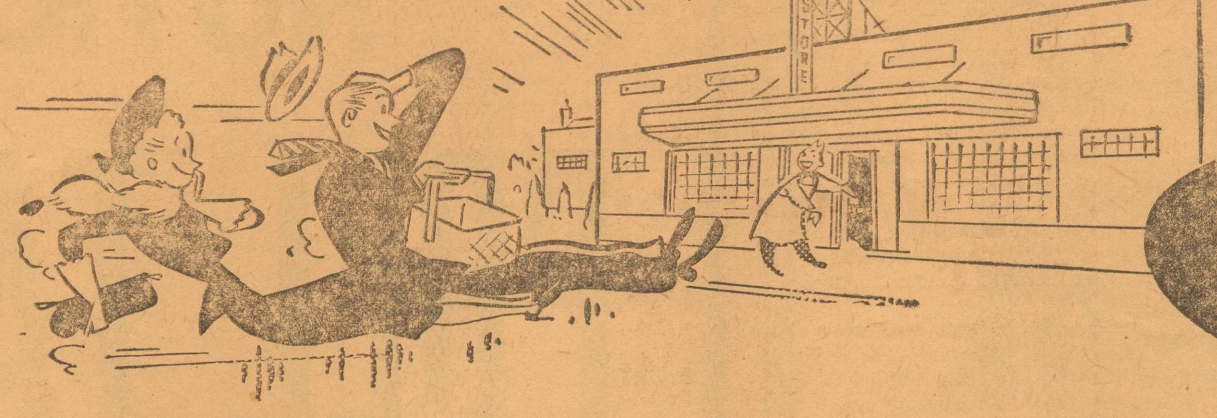

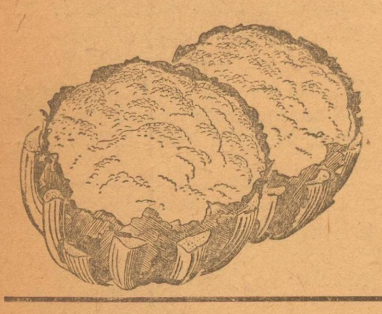

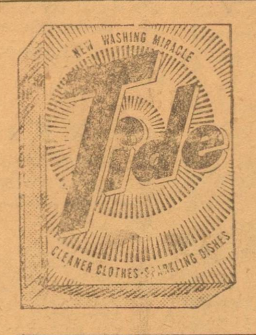
