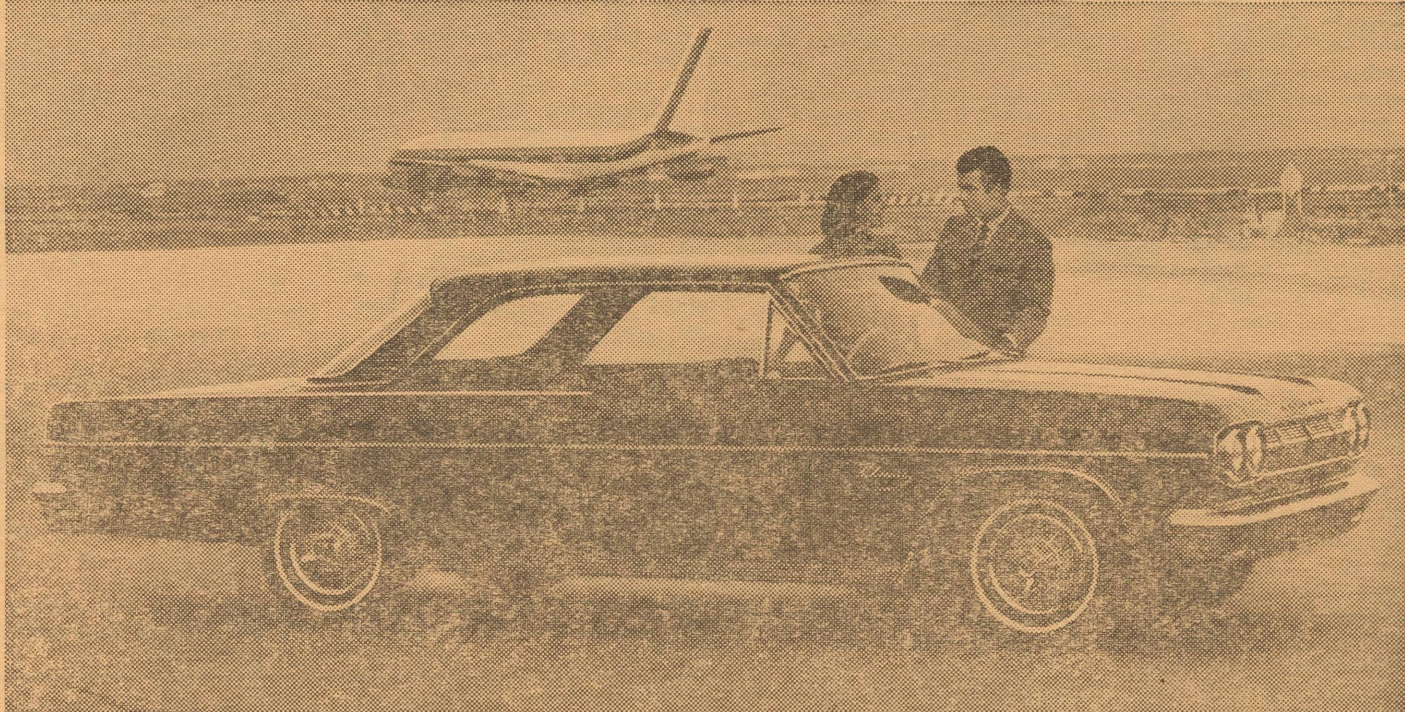

Home Demonstration Agent's Column
By MRS. VIDA KREKLOW

Wash the furniture? That's what they say. Never heard of it? I haven't either, but just listen to this—

"Too much wax, oil and polish can actually dim the beauty of wood finishes, says Mrs. Wanda Meyer, Extension Service home management specialist at Texas A&M University.

Furniture manufacturers themselves point this out. The best cleaning care, according to the American Walnut Manufacturers Association, is to wash furniture with suds and water.

Wash it once or twice with a cloth wrung out of warm soap or detergent suds, then wipe all surfaces with a clean damp cloth and rub dry. All wood pieces—modern or antique—thrive on this basic cleaning, as the suds remove various types of soil which are not affected by simply applying another coat of oil, polish or wax.

When all surfaces are thoroughly clean, use any preferred type of finishing touch.

Polish or waxes applied too often tend to build up a film which reduces the beauty of the original finish. Authorities recommend that most furniture be waxed only once or twice a year."

Did you read the last sentence carefully? They said, "Wax furniture once or twice a year."

This trick will make that discolored aluminum pot shine like they do in the TV ads. Boil some water and cream of tartar in it. Use 1 teaspoon to 2 tablespoons cream of tartar per quart of water, depending on how dark the pot is.

And another slick trick that works—

To restore garments, especially cottons, that have lost their crisp newness, prepare this solution: Add one tablespoon Elmer's glue to one gallon warm water and dip the piece of clothing in the mixture. Of course if you have a lot of clothes to treat just increase the amount of the solution. Works especially well on blue jeans.

Just about the time I need an especially good recipe some one tells me of a brand new one. This comes from Mrs. Travis Perry of San Angelo, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Watson of Eldorado.

It's simple, it's good, it's loaded with calories and its called—

Lemonade Pie

Whip: 1 cup (small container) whipping cream
Add: 1 can Eagle Brand milk
Add: 1 small can frozen lemon-

"Whoa," Evelyn called out. I stopped, real easy like. In the car we were both real brave.

Evelyn took aim, and dumped out last shot: She didn't miss. The poor snake never knew what hit him.
