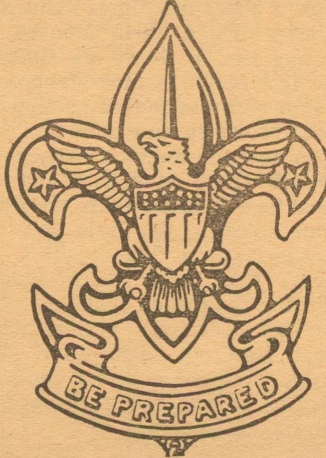
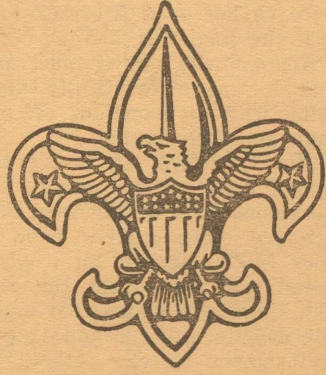
OVER TWO MILLION VISITED BOY SCOUT EXHIBIT AT FAIR

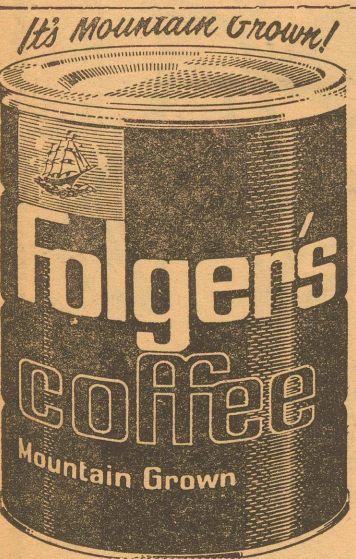

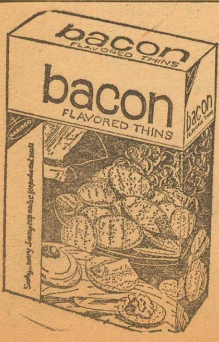

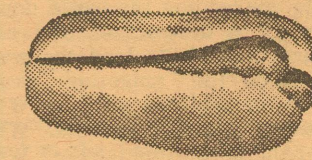
