Home Demonstration Agent's Column

Do you remember when a prized recipe was a closely guarded secret and for some over-zealous cooks was never, never told?

I remember two friends once, years ago, who were both excellent cooks and both rather vain over the fact. One friend asked, nagged and asked again for a particularly grand recipe and finally got it, with reluctance, from the other friend.

Somehow the dish, I have even forgotten what it was, did not turn out too well and to this day the recipient of the recipe declares that something terribly important was left out of the recipe—and on purpose!

I have wondered many times about it and still find myself asking, "Do you suppose it really happened?"

To every cook's great delight the attitude of not sharing a recipe is gone with the idea that the world is flat. All you need to do is ask today and sometimes a person knows the whole thing by memory and gives it to you on the spot.

That is not exactly the way it has come about that I am giving you this refrigerator roll recipe which came by way of Holly Brame. But when I asked for permission to share it with you Holly graciously and quickly consented.

Holly Brame's Refrigerator Rolls
3 eggs, beat slightly with a fork
1 large teaspoon salt
½ cup sugar
½ cup melted butter or oleo
1 cup warm water
1 package yeast
4½ cups flour.

Mix well all ingredients except flour. Add flour & stir thoroughly. Cover dough and let rise about 4 hours at room temperature. Punch down dough and place in refrigerator. As dough is needed remove from the refrigerator, shape, let the rolls double in size and bake in a 400 F. oven from 8 to 12 minutes.

Dough may be kept in refrigerator for several days.

How about making up two or three recipes of these "fool proof" (Holly's description) rolls on about Monday or Tuesday before Thanksgiving? This would be a nice bit of work to be free of on the holiday and following week end.

Do you mind if I repeat a recipe occasionally? I do hope not, since very often I am asked to because several people have lost a recipe or may be did not get a chance to clin and file it.

For the hunting camp chef the following repeated recipe is simply wonderful. Very easy to make and yet absolutely authentic in taste. Who can tell, an original sour dough cook may get his start by using this recipe for hungry hunters.

These pancakes taste great in just an ordinary kitchen. I can't imagine how good they would be at day break on a frosty morning in a hunting camp.

Eldorado Success

Salty hints lifted from other writers:

I've read of at least a dozen new ways our old friend salt can make cleaning chores a lot simpler. A wet cloth dipped in half-and-half solution of salt and water will revive carpet colors when rubbed briskly across the pile. Mix equal parts of salad oil and salt and rub on table rings left by wet or hot dishes . . . let stand an hour or two, then rub off. Add a little salt to the water in a vase and the flowers will stay fresh longer. When the flowers are thrown away, use a salt and vinegar solution to clean the vase . . . just let it stand a while then shake well and rinse with water. Cheese won't turn moldy if wrapped in a cloth dampened in salt water before refrigerating. Put salt in greasy pans, then wipe with a paper towel and the pans will clean more easily. Salt can also be used to sweeten thermos bottles, decanters, and other closed containers. Percolators can be filled with water and 4 tablespoons salt, perked as usual, then rinsed to chase away bitter coffee flavor and oil residue. It will also remove onion odor and fruit and vegetable stains from the hands. If clothes are soaked in a salt solution of 4 tablespoons to every quart of water, persimmon stains will come out of many fabrics when washed in a regular cycle. These are just some of the ways common table salt can be used to simplify cleaning chores.

Eldorado chalked up win number 7 without a loss by beating Menard 34 to 32 last Thursday.

Things took a turn for the best as far as Eldorado was concerned when Menard fumbled a punt on their own 12-yard line and Mike Manning recovered for Eldorado. Several plays later Manning took the ball into the end zone for six points and the first touchdown. Gene Nixon added the points after. Later in the first period Gene Nixon ran a punt back 65 yards and into the end zone but the run was called back for clipping. Menard then scored with Ashby running 91 yards on an end sweep. The first play from scrimmage after the Menard touchdown Ken Peters ran about 50 yards for a score. Manning added the points after. This ended the scoring in the first half with the score Eldorado 16 and Menard 6. Menard, however, threatened just before the half. They had first and goal to go from the Eldorado 10 when Mike Manning intercepted a Menard pass stopping the drive.

Nixon started the spark for Eldorado in the third period with just 3:25 left when he intercepted a Williamson pass on the Eldorado 40 yard line. Eldorado could not score this time, however. Menard scored next on a 65 yard run by quarterback Williamson and the point after attempt failed. Peters then scored for Eldorado on a 54-yard sweep play and the point after attempt here also failed. Score at the end of the third period was 22-12.

The fourth period saw Eldorado come alive. Gene Nixon intercepted a Menard pass and ran it 15 yards into the end zone for six points. On the kickoff after this touchdown Chris Gartman got the football after it traveled 10 yards and it was Eldorado's ball again. This next score came on a quarterback sneak by Benjie Jay from 2 yards out. The final high point came when Benjie Jay intercepted a pass with 34 seconds left to stop Menard once again.
