REPORT OF FINANCE COMMITTEE.
In the District Court, Schleicher County, Texas, April Term A. D. 1909.
The State of Texas County of Schleicher.
To Hon. J. W. Timmins, Judge of said county:—Comes now W. F. Ford, E. A. Nall and Joab Campbell, the financial Committee appointed by this Court at its November Term 1909, to examine all the books, reports, accounts, vouchers and orders of the Commissioner's Court of Schleicher County, Texas, relating to the finances of said County, (that have not been examined and reported upon by a previous committee,) beg leave to report that in obedience to the such appointment and instructions from your Honor, we have examined the various records of our county pertaining to County Finances, to the best of our ability in the short time allotted to us by the law and from said examination, we find the county in good financial condition and we are of the opinion that all the funds of the county have been accounted for by her officers; how ever we find numerous irregularities in the Finance Records and orders of the Commissioner's court.
We find that our commissioner's court has failed to comply with Article 867 of the Revised Civil statutes of the State of Texas

and has failed to show in the minutes of said court at each regular term thereof, as the law requires the separate amount received and paid out of each fund by the County Treasurer since the preceding Treasurer's Quarterly Report, and the balance of such funds remaining in the Treasurer's hands to the credit of each fund and have failed to publish said report as the law requires.
We further find that the Commissioner's Docket shows the allowance of claims that do not appear upon the minutes of said court as the laws requires.
We further find that the County Treasurer's Report filed at the February Term of said Commissioner's court and sworn statement of the Cashier of the Eldorado State Bank, the Depository of said county, show the following net credits to the various county funds, to wit:—
Jury fund.....\$192.30
Boat & Bridge fund 3194.30
General fund.....5739.43
Jail fund.....2845.30
Total net credit.....\$11,971.36
this we believe from our examination of the Records shows the true financial condition of our county.
We further find that, from the account kept on the Finance Ledger, that there appears to be registered outstanding indebtedness against the various funds of the county amounting to more than \$40,000, while the county Treasurer's Record show said amount to have been paid, hence we are opinion that the only outstanding indebtedness against the county is its jail bonds in the amount of \$9,000 which will be due and payable in forty years from their date.
We are of the further opinion that said above error grew out of the mistaken idea of the Commissioner's Court inquiring the

County Treasurer to register all scrip and report same to County clerk when in fact it had been paid off and credit given to the proper funds on the county Treasurer's cash Record.
We find the individual accounts of the various officers in good shape and shows all monies collected by them to have been paid over to the County Treasurer.
We further find from the Official Bond Records of the county officers that the purported bond of our County Judge, J. A. Whitten, although approved by the Commissioner's court and of record, has never been signed by said county Judge;
We also find that F. O. Bates Sr., exercising the powers and discharging the duties of Notary Public in and for Schleicher county, although the bond record shows that he has never given the bond and qualified as Justice of the Peace and Ex-officio Notary Public in and for said county;
In conclusion, will state that we have not undertaken to examine and check up the School Fund of our county, as we do not understand it to be any part of the county finance, but we find that that the interest on the school fund in the County Depository has been credited to the jury fund instead of the School Fund.
