NOTICE OF BOND ELECTION.

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held at Court house in the town of Eldorado, within the Eldorado Independent School Districts, on the 17th day of July, 1909, to determine whether the bonds of said district shall be issued to the amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) payable forty years from their date and bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, for the purpose of constructing and equipping a Public Free School Building of stone material and whether there shall be annually levied, assessed and collected on all the taxable property in said district, for the current year and annually thereafter while said bond, or any of them, are outstanding, a tax sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity.

C. C. Doty has been appointed manager of said election, which shall be held as nearly as may be possible in conformity with the general laws of the State.

No persons shall vote at said election unless he be a qualified voter under the Constitution of the laws of this State, and a taxpayer in said Eldorado Independent School District.

Those in favor of the issuance of the bonds and levying of the tax shall write or print on their ballots "For The Bond and Tax" and those against the issuance of the bonds and the levying of the tax shall write or print on their ballots "Against the Bonds and the Tax".

Said election was ordered by the board of trustees of said Eldorado Independent School District by order passed on the 16th day of June, 1909 and this notice is issued pursuant to said order. Dated this 16th day of June, 1909.

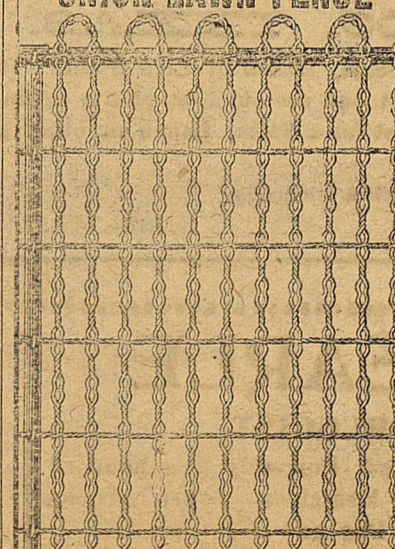

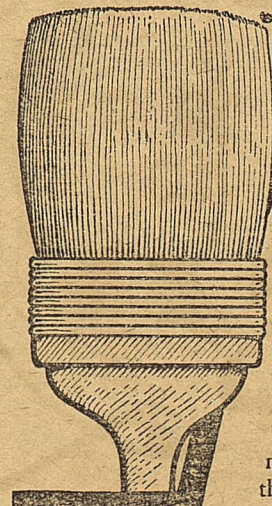

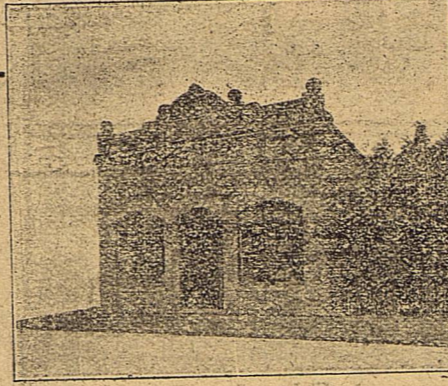

REVIVAL OF POLITENESS NECESSARY.

Politeness amongst juveniles is becoming so deplorably rare now-a-days that the cause should be sought, and there can be little doubt that the responsibility lies at the door of the parents in a multitude of cases. A ride in the street cars almost any day furnishes examples of children retaining their seats while their elders stand, absolutely ignoring those standards of courtesy and good breeding that young people are expected to observe not only towards ladies, but towards elderly men. Too often these instances of rudeness are encourage when parents accompanying their children permit them to remain seated, instead of instructing them to give place to those of maturer years.

Children used to be instructed to stand in the presence of their school teachers,—and to rise, or surrender their seats, whenever a lady or an elderly persons entered the room. They were expected to always say "Sir" to a gentle-

man, and "Madam" or "Ma'am" to a lady. But youngsters are now growing up with a sad lack of respect towards their elders, or those in authority,—and, in their teens, they act as "that woman."

Americans used to be marked for their unflinching courtesy, and in no part of the country was this more noticeable than in the South; but this distinction is fast passing away. The fault lies partly with the leveling tendencies of the public schools, and the influence of a mixed and foreign-born population; and partly with parental ignorance of neglect of home-training in those so-called little things of life, which really have such an important bearing upon the future refinement, consideration, and culture of the rising generation. A revival of old-fashioned politeness is desirable. —The Texas Banker.

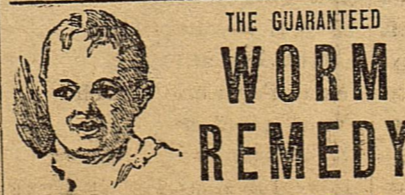
