## ORIENT EXCEPT ELDORADO'S PROPOSITION TO BUILD HERE

### Oorient Excepts Proposition Made by Eldorado Citizens.

A. M. Denney Is Ready to Sign Contract For Orient.

A. M. Denney town site agent for the Orient road came out from San Angelo Saturday, and informed our committee that the Orient people had accepted their proposition and that he was ready to sign up a contract for his people. The committee is busy now soliciting the balance of the \$100,000 and getting the right of way through the country. The exact amount of the one hundred that is liking is not known but there is still a little yet to be raised. We learn that the committee is not having any trouble in getting the right of way given and by the time this is printed the whole thing will probably be signed up. The people of Schleicher County are anxious for the Orient and will back the committee on their agreement with the Orient, actual work is to start at Eldorado January 1st. and should be completed, many think that the train will run into Eldorado within the next 12 months.
