ELDORADO LAND BANK

HOLDS ANNUAL MEETING.

At the annual meeting of the Stockholders of the Eldorado National Farm Loan Association, held Tuesday the 13th day of January, at 3 p. m. the following were elected as members of the new Board of Directors, for the year, 1920; W. T. Conner, T. W. Johnson, L. E. Ratliff, Geo. Williams, and O. K. Enochs, and the new Board having organized and held its annual meeting, elected the following officers: W. T. Conner, President; T. W. Johnson, Vice-President; M. E. Selberry, Secretary-Treasurer; W. A. Spencer, Ira McDonald and Henry Mund as the Loan

Committee, all to serve for the year 1920.

The report of the secretary-treasurer for 1919 disclosed that during that year loans amounting to \$31,175.00 were closed, upon eight applications; that prior to 1919 loans aggregating \$29,376 had been closed eleven applications; that the secretary-treasurer had collected in general funds for the expenses of the association the sum of \$311.50; and had paid out for necessary expenses, including the amount paid to the secretary-treasurer himself, for his services, the sum of \$207.65, starting the year 1920 with \$103.85 on hand. And there were pending eight applications aggregating \$38,500, all having

been passed upon by Mr. John P. Lee, the appraiser of the Federal Land Bank of Houston.

The secretary-treasurer also notified the meeting of the receipt from the Federal Land Bank of a check for \$54.15 being the amount of dividends due the Association for the six months period beginning April 1st and ending September 30th. This will be distributed by the Board of Directors according to law.

The Stockholders meeting passed two resolutions while in session; one being to urge the Senators and Congressmen from Texas to support a measure in Congress raising the maximum amount any one person may borrow from the Federal Land Bank from \$10,000 to \$25,000; the other being to urge the Coming Legislature to submit a constitutional amendment to the people of Texas providing that persons owning a homestead may mortgage the same to secure a loan it being the sense of those supporting that resolution that the home owners of Texas should have equal rights with the home owners of 39 other states in the Union to mortgage their homesteads for temporary relief when in financial difficulties, and relieve them of the frequent necessity of selling their homesteads to pay honest debts, because they cannot under the present law in many cases obtain relief in any other manner.

In the general discussion occurring in the meeting it was agreed that the Federal Land Bank is the greatest aid to farmers and those desiring to own their own homes existing at this time. The rate of interest being 5 1/2 per cent; the time given being 34 1/2 years; and payments being arranged that every year the principal of the loan is reduced, so that the debt grows less, and the uniform payment is applied in greater proportion to the payment of principal and less is required for the payment of interest each and every year. It is true that people of Schleicher County, and Sutton, which is also within the territory allowed this Association, have not been able to get as much per acre in loans as they should have; but this will gradually be righted, since it is the policy of the Federal Land Bank to loan 50 per cent of the appraised value of the land covered by the loan, and when it is once settled that the recent advance of land values is permanent, then the loan value will advance accordingly. Anyone who thinks of getting a loan will be accorded every courtesy by the President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, Loan Committee and others connected with the Association, when he seeks information, or wishes to apply for a loan through the Association. The expense of the loan to the borrower is as light as can be figured, and is always satisfactory. Everybody connected with the Association is interested in encouraging people, citizens who live here and others who may look with favor upon Schleicher and Sutton Counties, as places on which they would like to locate, become home-owners, tax payers, school and road builders, and help build up our richly endowed section of the State, and to the extent of encouraging all of these, feel themselves to be public servants ready and willing to work for the common good, in every way they may.

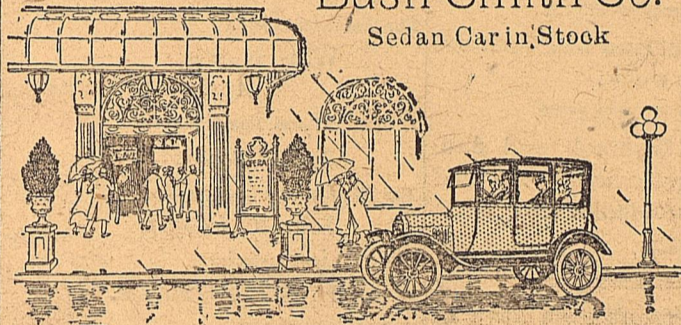

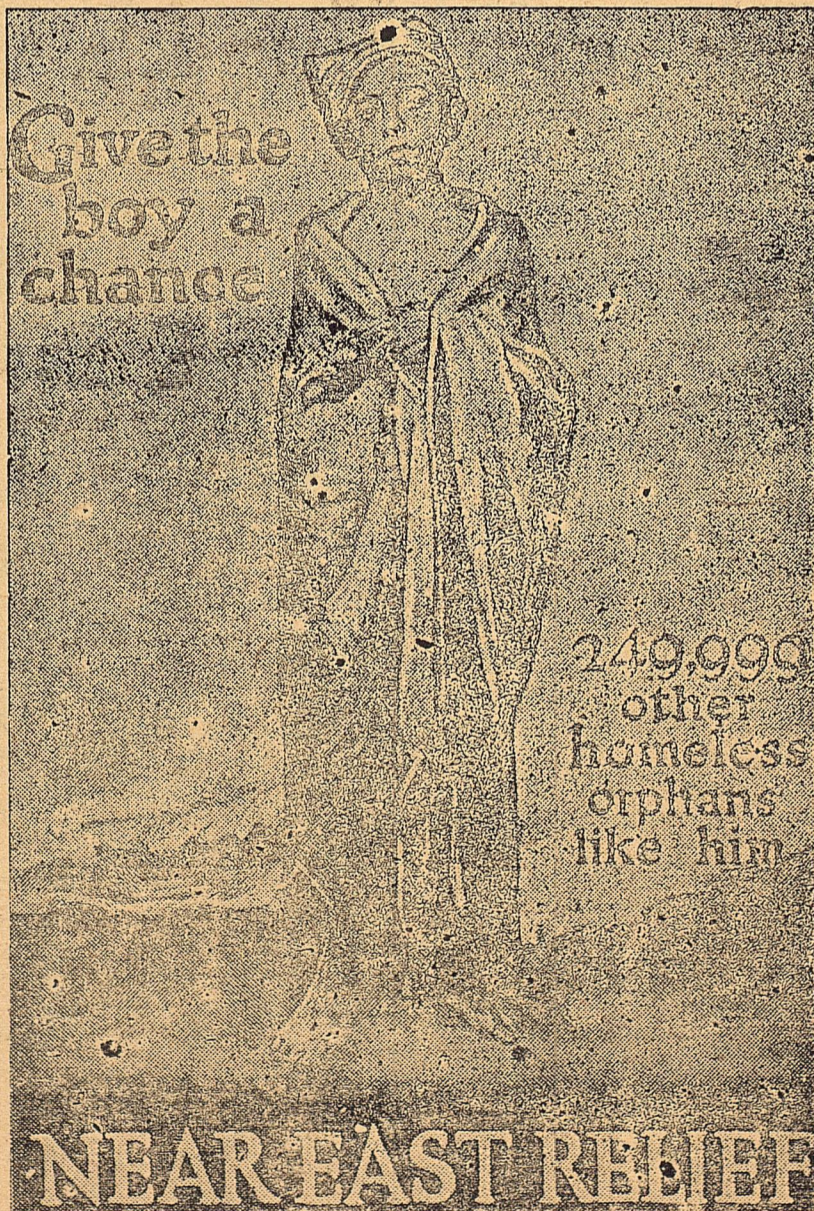

249,000 other homeless orphans like him

NEAR EAST RELIEF

POSTER BASED ON ACTUAL PHOTOGRAPH TAKEN AT ERIVAN, ARMENIA, BY DR. M. S. LITTLEFIELD.

He is only one of 250,000 helpless child victims of Turkish cruelty and oppression in Western Asia. Clad just as he stands in the picture this forlorn little fellow, with hunger-stricken cheeks, hopeless mouth and frail, starved body, was found wandering in the streets of Igdir, Armenia, by Dr. Milton S. Littlefield of the Near East Relief. He was taken to a Near-East Relief orphanage, where it was found that his only earthly possession was the single garment in which he stood—a worn, patched blanket made from a burlap sack.

"I saw this ragged little fellow on one of the busiest business streets of Erivan, not far from the orphanage," said Dr. Littlefield. "He was wandering aimlessly about and no one was paying the slightest attention to him. I did not pose him; the picture shows just the way he stood when I backed him up against a nearby wall."

The photograph is the basis of a striking poster now being distributed by Near East Relief.
