EARL BOOTH SHOT, DIES FROM WOUND.

On last Thursday afternoon Earl Booth was accidentally shot when entering the gate at his home 3 miles west of Eldorado, he had been to town got his friend Palmer West and borrowing a shot gun, they motored back to the farm, on going through the gate and stopping the car, gun slid out of the car door stock first, the hammer striking the running board, discharged the gun, which was loaded with number eight shot, the shot striking the leg just above the knee, cutting the main artery, he was rushed back to Dr. Patton's office where the flow of the blood was soon stopped, but he had lost too much to overcome the weakness, Dr. Hixson of San Angelo was called to assist in the fight, but effort was in vain, for at 10:54 Friday night the fight for life was over, Earl had heard and answered the roll call and appeared before the Great Commander of earth and heaven to do his will.

Earl was the second son of Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Booth, was born May 23, 1895, at Hollister, California, came to Texas with parents one year later. Came to Eldorado in 1906, and has been engaged in farming since.

Earl was called into the service of his country in April 1918, enlisting in Company E 360th Infantry, 90th Division, and was only in training a short while as he sailed for France in June 1918, he landed at Liverpool England, went from there to LeHarve, Paris, Bay and Toul France, and from there to the trenches on August first, making the trip to the firing lines in a few days less than 4 months, he was in the St. Mihiel drive which started August 12, 1918, which was the most strongly fortified parts of the Hindenburg line, he was on the firing lines 56 days, or until he was gassed September 12, only in hospital a few days, and was wounded on September 26th, in the thigh and foot, and was walking with a cane when he received his discharge on Feb. 12, 1919.

Douglas, where Earl was taken after his wound was dressed, by Rev. F. G. Clark, pastor of the Methodist church. The floral offering was beautiful and covered the grave, thus we left our comrade, friend and neighbor to sleep the sleep of peace.

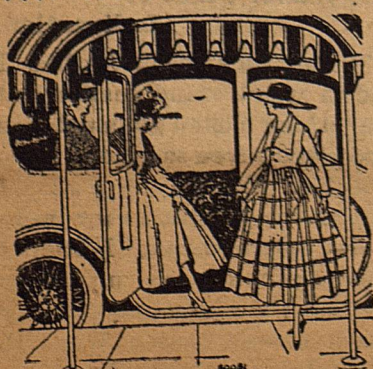

INVESTMENTS MUST BE ADVISED, SUPERVISOR OF HIGH SCHOOLS SAYS

"Texas schools where pupils are not taught the necessity of living within their incomes are failing to justify their existence, as they do not prepare pupils to be efficient citizens," said Peyton Irving, Jr., State Supervisor of High Schools of the Department of Education. State Superintendent Blanton has enthusiastically approved the teaching of thrift in all schools and most of the teachers are co-operating with the Savings Division of the U. S. Treasury in this work.

"But mere preaching is not teaching thrift," he points out.

"When pupils have been taught to save, the job is not complete; they must be shown how to invest. And it is here the moral question intrudes. For some safe and certain, guaranteed-not-to-lose securities, must be recommended, for one can no more learn wise investment without buying securities than one can master physics without a laboratory. Local investments abound; there is no dearth of persons to take a pupil's money and give a graven gilt certificate therefor. Yet no teacher could afford to characterize a local oil company as an unsafe investment.

"Under these circumstances patriotism and high ethical ideas join hands with common sense. The thing to do is to recommend the purchase of War Savings Stamps and Registered Treasury Savings Certificates. TWO AND A HALF MILLION COME TO HOLDERS OF THIRD LOAN BONDS NEXT MONTH

Dallas, Texas.—Owners of Liberty Bonds of the third issue, bearing 4½% interest, according to Dinsmore W. Hume, Federal Director of Savings, number 719,210 in this district. The total value of Liberty Bonds bought in the district was \$116,210,050. The interest thereon at 4½% will be due and payable at any bank on September 15; it will amount to \$2,469,462.50 for this, the eleventh reserve district, according to Mr. Hume. A like amount of interest on the same bonds will be paid in six months later, on March 15, 1921. Bankers are frequently finding bonds issued in 1917 and 1918 from which no interest coupons have been clipped.

BOOKER T. WASHINGTON'S DAUGHTER URGES NEGROES TO EARN, SAVE, INVEST

Dallas, Texas.—Portia Washington Pittman, daughter of the noted negro leader, Booker T. Washington, wife of W. Sidney Pittman, a negro architect in Dallas, insists that now is the time when negroes, above all others, should earn, save a part of their earnings, and invest in government securities. "Negroes are now earning more than ever before in their lives," she said. "They should save and invest it so it will comfort and give them the things they need so much when age or sickness or death overtakes them. 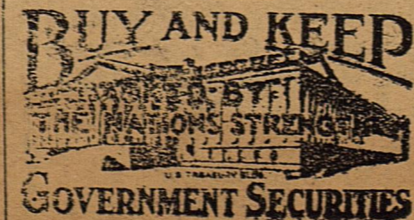

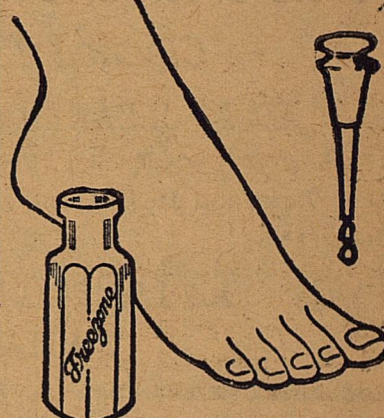

LOW-GRADE COTTON THREATENED MARKET.

Dallas, Texas, Aug. 21.—Col. W. B. Thomson, a well known cotton factor of New Orleans, and a life-long friend to the cotton industry, sounds a note of warning of the danger that threatens the marketing of the present crop, and points to a specific remedy within the hands of every grower.

"During the past three years low-grade cotton has been a grievous burden upon the cotton industry," says Col. Thompson. "During this period the supply of these damage grades has been abnormally large and the demand therefor abnormally small. The over-supply condition was caused by bad weather after the cotton had opened, and the lack of demand has been due to the fact that the normal low-grade markets have been closed and to the additional fact that during the war the United States government in formulat-

ing its contracts rankly discriminated against the lower grades. As the result of these conditions the grades below middling have declined to preposterous discounts. Low middling is quoted at 10 3-4 cents per pound less than middling, the next grade above, and good ordinary at 18 1-2 cents per pound less than middling, and even at these discounts all the grades in question have been and are still practically unsalable.

It costs more to produce the grades, and they are sold at a loss, and is no asset but an infectious liability.

"Therefore, the plan proposed is simply this: Do not harvest any grades lower than middling. Pick it as rapidly and as carefully as possible; have it ginned gradually; store it under a shelter, put skids under it and turn the bale over occasionally.

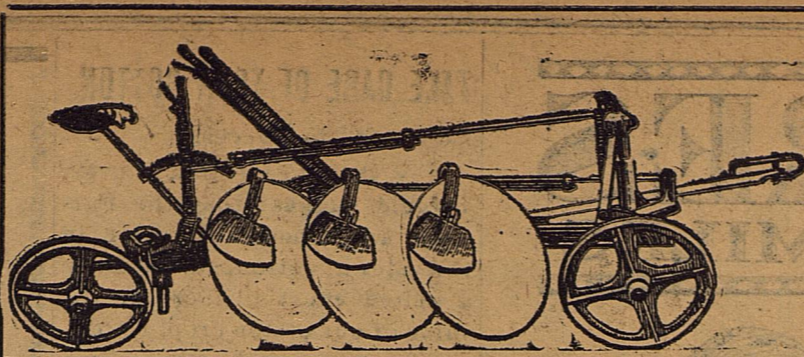

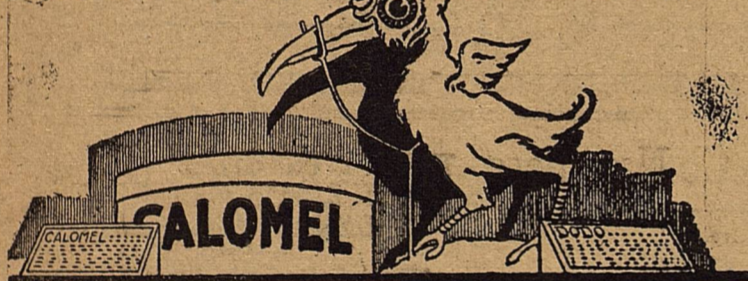

TAKE CARE OF YOUR COTTON.

Editor of The Success:

Now that the election is over, I would suggest that the Farmers and those interested in the value of cotton, should make a united effort to increase the value of our cotton crop, by demanding more care and economy by those handling it in the field and elsewhere.

So great has been the neglect and carelessness of the western portion of Texas, that our cotton is known on all markets as West Texas cotton and goes at a discount as a general rule. My predictions in The Success early in June, in regard to the gloomy outlook for low grade cotton is being proven at this time, quotations being as high as \$50 per bale off for full grades and as high as thirty-five dollars for half grades. And with prospects for much low grade cotton again this year, it would pay to use every means to better the grade.

We know that there are weather influences that we can't remedy, however, we must use such means as is in our power to secure a better class of cotton.

The Ginner cannot make a good sample out of wet cotton, and besides he violates the laws of Texas when he gins your cotton wet, and yet many farmers allow hands to pick cotton in big dews and too soon after rains, and often suffer as high as fifty dollars per bale less as a result. This is only one instance, let us not blame the cotton buyers, the speculator or the Government for what we are to blame.

It is high time the entire South, the merchants, bankers and all true southern people get together to save the present crop from sacrifice. Let me here suggest that before many years Texas will have a system of bonded warehouses and no one but certified cotton classers will be allowed to operate such warehouses, giving negotiable receipts, such receipt to specify weight, grade and condition. I favor these things, and believe it the only sensible thing to do. It will place our cotton in position to command loans much nearer its value than at present, making of it a real commercial commodity, which cannot be said of it at present although the annual value of crop is very great. More unity among those interested and a more sensible system of markets are our two greatest needs.
