

**HAS CHASE WITH MAN  
WANTED IN SAN ANGELO.**

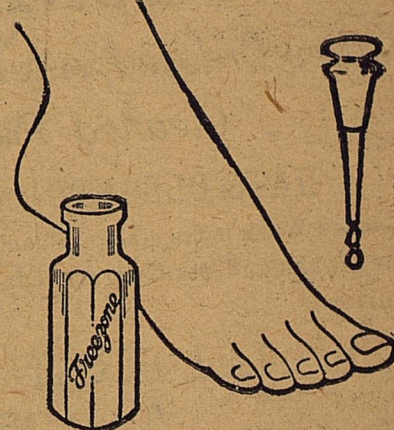

Our friendship is dead and this is a certificate of its demise. I am out one hundred bucks and a customer—total loss and no salvage. My loss too, is not on the house. Do you blame me for going into mourning?"

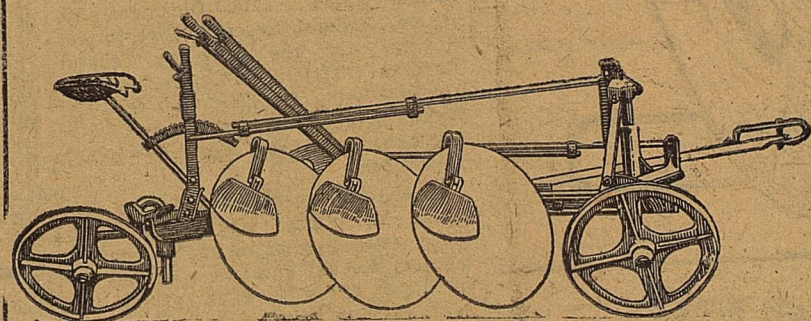

Dean Swift presented the Wright tribe with a nice lot of roasting ears Monday, for which he has our thanks.

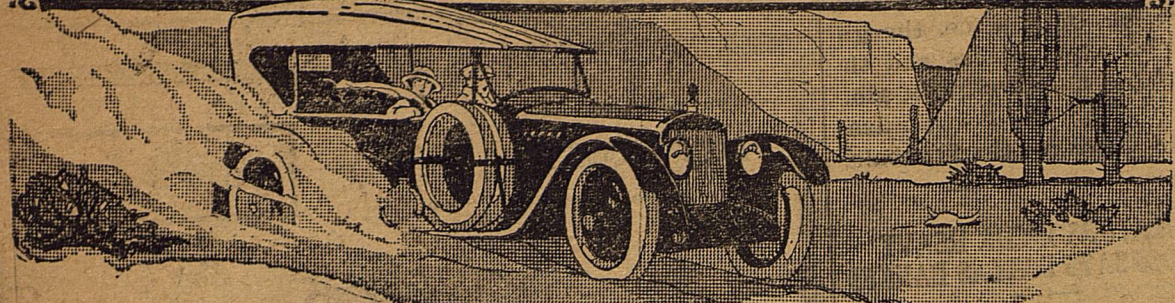

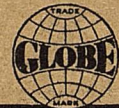

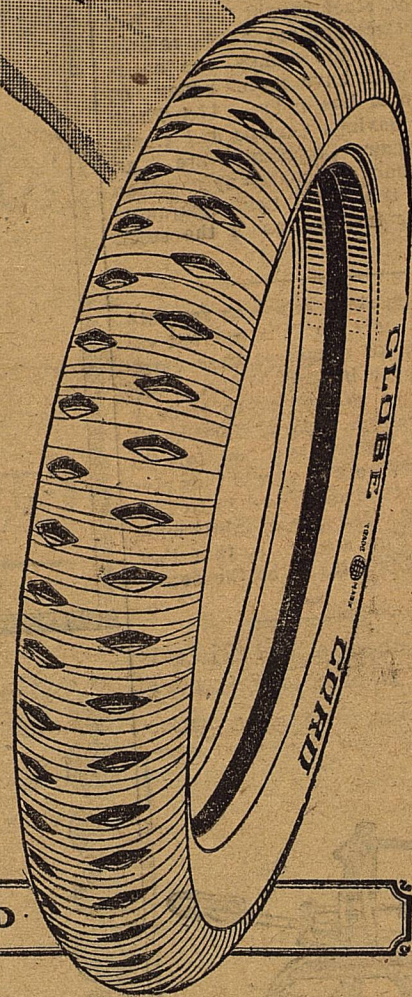

### FEDERAL RESERVE BANK SAYS 753,960 BOUGHT FOURTH LIBERTY BONDS

Dallas, Texas.—When the Fourth Liberty Loan Drive was on in the Eleventh Federal Reserve District, 753,960 persons bought bonds, according to Dinsmore W. Hume, Savings Director of Dallas. The entire amount, value, of 3 1/2% bonds they bought was \$145,988,525. Interest on these bonds is due semi-annually, the next payment coming October 15, 1920. At that time the interest to be paid will be \$3,102,231.15. A like sum will be payable on March 15, 1921. Regret has been expressed in banking circles that many bond owners have never presented their interest coupons for payment, as is contemplated by the government.
