MERTZON SELLS 225,000 POUNDS OF MOHAIR.

Two hundred thousand pounds of mohair and 25,000 pounds of kid hair, both of the 1919 and 1920 fall clips, have been sold at Mertzon by the West Texas Wool & Mohair Association, according to announcement made by Duwaine E. Hughes, secretary-treasurer and manager of the firm. The longer staple brought 27c a pound or \$54,000, while the hair from the young goats commanded 40c or \$10,000.

The buyers were Crimins & Pierce of Boston, who were represented by J. M. Lea of Del Rio. About seven cars were required to move the shipment over the Orient to San Angelo, thence over the Santa Fe to Galveston. From that port, the mohair went to Boston by boat.

The spring productions of mohair in 1919 and 1920 were consigned to Crimins & Pierce. Both crops amounting to around 150,000 pounds, Mr. Hughes stated. The company's 1920 spring accumulation of long wool, totaling about 2,000,000 pounds was also consigned to the Boston firm - San Angelo Standard.

WONDER OIL WELL STRUCK AT FORT STOCKTON

G. M. Brown, who owns considerable ranch interest and oil leases near Fort Stockton, received a phone message Sunday from his brother at Fort Stockton, telling him of the wonder oil well that had been brought in on the Turner ranch, and at first flowed 1000 barrels a day, the well was brought in last Thursday and was still flowing Sunday between 100 and 200 barrels per day. The well is 96 feet deep and is producing a fine grade of oil.

Mr. Brown will go to Fort Stockton this week to see the wonder well and look after his interest there.

Today we celebrate the first anniversary of the birth of the League of Nations. One year ago the dream of the ages became a living reality. Forty-one nations solemnly joined in covenant designed to bring about a better understanding among the peoples of the earth with the great ultimate objective of world peace.

At the first session of the assembly of the League, held at Geneva, seven more nations were admitted to membership, so that on the first anniversary there are 48 nations in the League.

It may or may not be significant but it is certainly interesting to note that the number 48 corresponds exactly with the number of states in the United States.

Looking back over the first year of the League's activities, the supposed critic can find much to complain of. There are still great areas and populations of the world which seem to be as far from peace as they were a year ago. It is true that the League has as yet failed to bring about among all the peoples a state of mind which makes for the stability and peace that are the only best foundations for the reconstruction and rehabilitation of a war-torn world.

But if one is disposed to take the larger view, to realize the tremendous size of the task which has been undertaken and the great difficulties to be overcome, there is much in the situation upon which to base an optimistic view of the future.

Every day of the 365 that has passed since the League came into being has proved anew the necessity of such an organization if our present civilization is to survive the assaults which have been and still are being made against it.

And if we may say so without any thought of politics, or the ambitions of politicians, it seems to us that every day also has proved that until America, the richest and most powerful of all the nations, joins with the other 48 in the great experiment, she will be unworthy of her traditions of liberty and justice.

With America a member of the League, occupying the position of leadership which will be hers if and when she joins, whatever doubts there may be as to the future of the great adventure for world peace will disappear.

It is greatly to be hoped that those men to whom the people of America recently committed the destinies of their country for the next four years, will find a way to take this position of world leadership.—San Angelo Standard

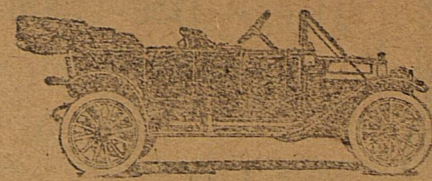

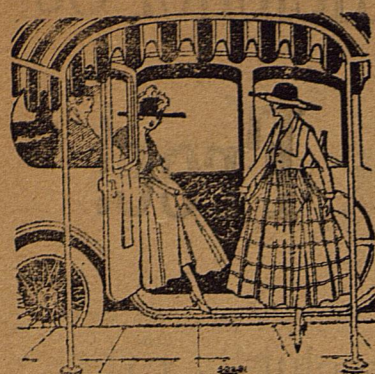

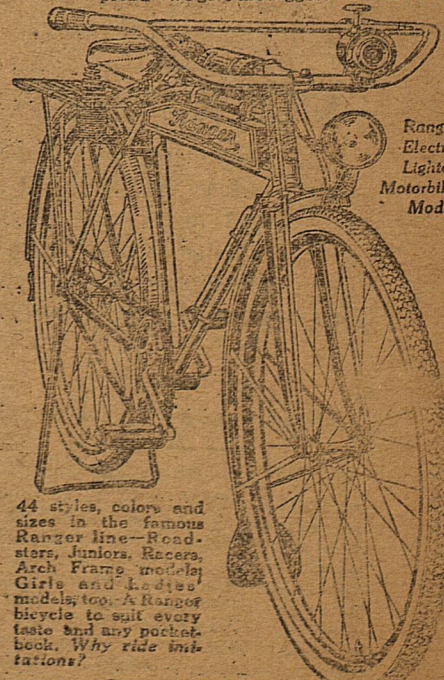
