**OUR SCHOOL GRADUATES
ALL MAKING GOOD.**

The Register of the University of Texas reports that the three members of the 1920 graduating class of Eldorado school who are now students in that institution all made a creditable showing in the fall term examinations which were given just before the Christmas holidays. The three are carrying fifteen courses, and only one failing grade was made out of fifteen. When we consider that this is the first year that the Eldorado school has had sufficient affiliation to secure admission for its graduates into the University and that about 350 students there from affiliated schools failed in fall term to such an extent that they were not allowed to re-enter the University for the winter term, we consider the showing made by the Eldorado pupils an excellent one. The University of Texas is one institution where the students must pass in their studies to remain.

Every member of the 1920 graduating class of the Eldorado school is now in college, every member of the 1919 class entered college after graduation and is now in college or is teaching, and of the seven members of the class of 1918, four attended college, two of whom are now teaching and two are still in college, two took courses to become trained nurses and one attended a commercial college.

All these graduates of the last three years have made good, and the Eldorado school is honored by their excellent records since graduation.

**WOOL AND MOHAIR SALES
NET 32 CENTS.**

The San Angelo Standard reports the sale of the spring clip of long wool, by Mr. Oscar Appelt for 38 cents per pound at Boston, or 32 cents net. Mr. Appelt also sold 10,000 pounds of mohair, receiving 50 cents for the clip from the grown goats and 60 cents a pound for the kid hair. The net returns on the mohair was 44c and 54c a pound. Crimins & Pierce of Boston bought the wool and mohair.

Tom Adams was advised last week that 6,000 pounds of his long spring wool had been sold at Boston for 36c a pound.

SCHOOL TERM REPORTS.

Next week the monthly report cards will be given out. The cards will show the average made for the half session, or first term of the school, in addition to monthly grades. The term average, and not the monthly grades, form the basis for promotion at the end of the session, Grades A, B and C are passing grades. D and E are failing grades.

Those students who failed in the first term will be given an opportunity to raise their grades. Special examinations will be provided for, particularly in the high school. If parents will co-operate with teachers, and are really interested in the educational progress of their children, most of the failing grades may be raised to passing grades. Do not criticise teachers for low grades made by children. The teacher did not prepare the examination papers which formed the basis of the term grade. My experience has been that teachers are inclined to grade too high, rather than too low.
