WARREN G. HARDING INAUGERATED IN SIMPLICITY.

Warren G. Harding was inaugurated as president on Friday March 4, the inaugural ceremony was the simplest and most dramatic of a generation. Immediately after the administration of the oath, Mr. Harding turned to the vast crowd and which stretched across the Capitol plaza and began his inaugural address.

Sound amplifiers carried his voice to the outskirts of the big assembly.

Pledging his faith anew to American institution, President Harding reiterated a plea for a return to "normalcy," for industrial peace, for friendship with the world, and spoke again a promise to work for an association of nations to bring about peace and "approximate" disarmament. But he coupled his renewed declarations with a fresh pronouncement against "entangling alliances."

"America," he said, "I can enter into no political commitments, nor assume any economic obligations which will subject our decisions to any other than our own authority."

After President Harding had made his address the Senate confirmed the cabinet appointments made by him.

"The final moments of the Cabinet on Tuesday," said the letter "found us quite unable to express the poignant feelings with which we realize that the hour of leave-taking and official dispersal had arrived.

"Will you permit us to say to you now, and as simply as we can, how great a place you occupy in our honor, love and esteem?"

"We have seen you in times of momentous crises. We have seen you uncomplaining toil under the heavy and unremitting burdens of the presidency. We have had the inestimable privilege of sharing some of your labors. At all times you have been to us our ideal of a courageous, high-minded, modest gentleman, a patriotic public servant, an intense and passionate lover of your country.

"You have displayed toward us a trust and confidence that has touched us all, supporting and defending us when under partisan attack with staunch and untiring loyalty, and placing at our command, always in the most considerate way, the wisdom of your counsel. History will acclaim your great qualities. We who have known you intimately bear witness to them now.

"We fervently wish you, dear Mr. President, long life and the happiness that you so richly deserve and have so abundantly earned."

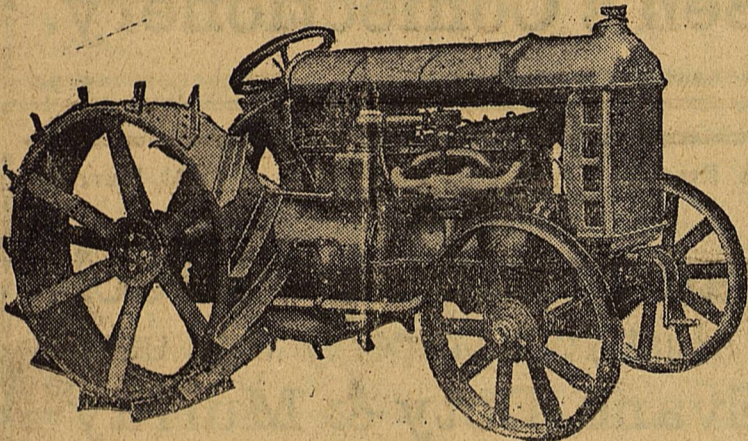

ALLIES TROOPS ADVANCE INTO GERMANY.

British, French and Belgian troops have entered the cities of Dusseldorf, Duisburg and Ruhort east of the Rhine, upon refusal of the Berlin Government to accept the repatriation. Nothing was put forth to prevent the advance of the Allied forces.

In the proclamation addressed to "my fellow citizens" President Ebert said. "Our opponents in the World War have imposed on us an unheard of demand, impossible of fulfillment, for money, and a contract, which even the work of a generation could not suffice to have accomplished. We must not and cannot comply with it. Our honor and self respect forbid. Our opponents are advancing to occupy more of German territory. This is an open breach of the treaty of Versailles. We, however, are not in a position to oppose force with force, because we are defenseless. Nevertheless, we can cry out so that all who still recognize the voice of righteousness may hear."

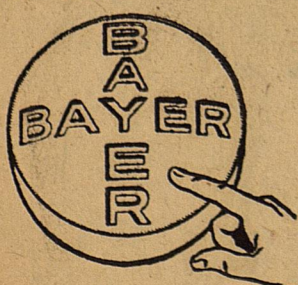

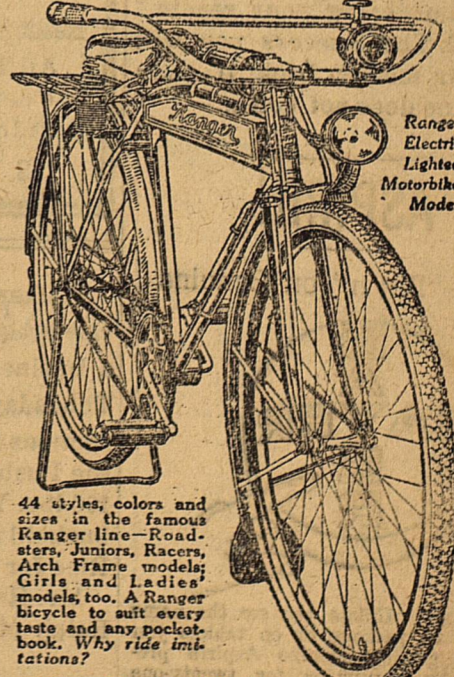
