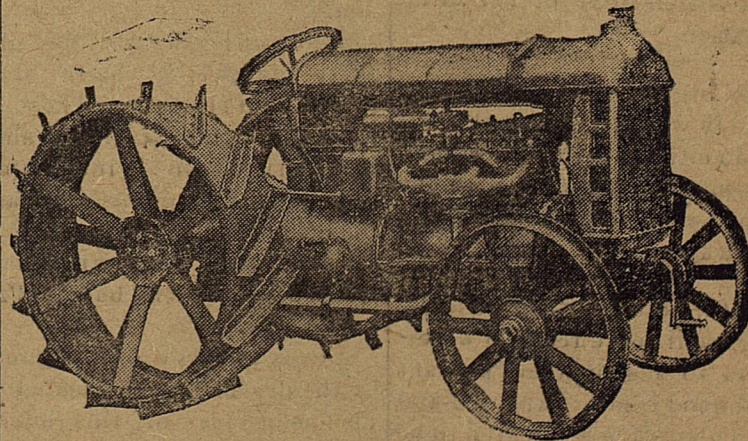

ORDER FOR SCHOOL TAX ELECTION.

Whereas, on this the 14th day of June 1921, at a regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Eldorado Independent School District of Schleicher County, Texas, came on to be considered the petition of W. O. Alexander and 25 other legally qualified property taxpaying voters residing in said school district, praying that an election be ordered to determine whether there shall be annually levied and collected upon all taxable property in said school district an ad valorem tax of fifty cents, (50c) on the one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation for the support and maintenance of the public free schools of said district and to pay the interest on the bonded indebtedness of said district and to provide a sinking fund to pay the principal at maturity.

Therefore, be it ordered by the Board of Trustees of the Eldorado Independent School District that an election be held at the Bearce Building in the town of Eldorado in said school district on the 16th day of July 1921, to determine whether the Board of Trustees of said school district shall have authority annually to levy and collect upon all taxable property in said district an ad valorem tax of fifty cents, (50c) on the one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation for the support and maintenance of the public free schools of said district and to pay the interest on the bonded indebtedness of said district and to provide a sinking fund to pay the principal at maturity.

C. I. Dabney, L. M. Hoover and J. P. Green are hereby appointed managers of said election.

None but legally qualified property tax-paying voters shall vote at said election. Those in favor of levying such tax shall have written or printed upon their ballots "For the Tax", and those opposed to the levying of such tax shall have written or printed upon their ballots "Against the tax".

A copy of this order, signed by the president and attested by the secretary of this board, shall serve as proper notice of this election, and the president shall cause notice of said election to be given as required by law.

The State of Texas, County of Schleicher, Notice is hereby given that an election will be held on the 23rd day of July, 1921, at Lofton School House in Common School District No. 4, of this county as established by order of the Commissioners Court of date the 24th day of August 1903, which is of record in Book designated "Commissioners Court Minutes" on pages 123-124 to determine whether a majority of the legally qualified property taxpaying voters of that district desire to tax themselves for the purpose of supplementing the State School Fund appropriated to said district and to determine whether the commissioners court of this county shall be authorized to levy, assess and collect annually a tax [of and at the rate of 25 cents on the \$100 valuation of taxable property in said district for said purposes.

Davis Sheen has been appointed presiding officer for said election and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same, and he shall within five days after said election has been held make due return thereof to the commissioners court of this county as is required by law for holding a general election.

All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and county and who are resident property taxpayers in said district shall be entitled to vote at said election and all voters who favor taxation for school purposes shall have written or printed on their ballots the words:

"For School Tax."

And Those opposed to such taxation shall have written or printed on their ballots the words:

"Against School Tax."

LOSS BY FIRE.

Tuesday afternoon a fire started from the Pierce Oil Company when a barrel being filled with Coal Oil, by W. M. Whitfield, exploded, setting fire to the Martin-Glover Wholesale Co., two refrigerator cars, completely destroying the Wholesale house, the estimated loss of Martin-Glover Co. is \$100,000, Pierce Oil Corporation's loss is about \$50,000, both losses being partially covered by insurance.

The Story of Our States

By JONATHAN BRACE
XXII.—ALABAMA



THE discovery of Alabama is credited to De Soto in 1540. The English also laid claim to this territory and included it in the grant to North Carolina. But it was the French who first settled here erecting in 1702 Fort St. Louis on Mobile Bay and founding the town of Mobile nine years later. Mobile was for many years the capital of Louisiana. France in 1763 ceded the territory east of the Mississippi to England and the northern part of the present State of Alabama was joined to the Illinois territory. The southern portion was known as West Florida. Serious conflict with the Indians was kept up for many years. In fact, even as late as 1812, there was an uprising of the Creeks which resulted in terrible atrocities and massacres.

During the Revolution West Florida remained loyal to England, but was seized by Spain only to be turned over to the United States in 1813. This Mobile section was then added to the northern district and the State of Alabama was formed and became the twenty-second state of the Union in 1819.

The meaning of the name Alabama is variously interpreted. It was the name of an Indian tribe which inhabited this territory at the time of De Soto's first visit. After this tribe the river was named and the state was called Alabama after the river. The Indian word was supposed to mean "Here we rest," and these words are used on the state's coat of arms, but this interpretation is doubtful and its real meaning is uncertain. Alabama is sometimes called the Plantation State. Its area is 51,983 square miles.

The Story of Our States

By JONATHAN BRACE
XXI.—ILLINOIS



KASKASKIA, the oldest town in Illinois, is on the site of an Indian village and it was here that

Father Marquette, after his first discovery of the Illinois river, established a Jesuit mission in 1675. Four years later La Salle, the French explorer, passed through the Great Lakes, landed at the Chicago river and pushed on to the Illinois river, which he named after the Indian tribes living in that region. Here he built a fort and sent his boat back to Montreal for further supplies. When his vessel did not return he started home on foot and succeeded in finding his way to Montreal through a thousand miles of tangled wilderness. He gathered together another expedition and returned to the fort, which he had left in charge of his companion Tony. The fort he found in ruins, but finally succeeded in locating and rescuing Tony, who had been driven out by the Iroquois Indians.

This riverway to the Mississippi became one of the leading avenues of communication between the French in the North and Louisiana. French settlers soon located here and established the most friendly relations with the Indians. In fact, though the Illinois country was ceded by France to England in 1763, the sentiment of the Indians and French together was so hostile that it was several years before the territory could be occupied.

During the Revolution it was George Rogers Clark and his expedition into the territory north of the Ohio which captured Kaskaskia and drove the English from this province. Various states claimed rights to parts of this territory, but these were finally ceded to the federal government and in 1787 it was formed into the Northwest Territory. This tract extended from Pennsylvania to the Mississippi and was eventually divided into Ohio, Indiana, Illinois and Michigan.

In 1818 Illinois was admitted as the twenty-first state with an area of 58,865 square miles. The state is one of the most level in the country and is often called the Prairie State. Politically Illinois is the most important state in the Union next to New York and Pennsylvania as it has twenty-nine electoral votes for president.
