BODY OF PRIVATE BEV MCCORMICK TO LAND OCT. 6.

The remains of Private Bev McCormick will arrive at Hoboken, N. J., October 6th, and will be shipped to the American Legion Post at San Angelo, and from there will be brought to Eldorado and buried by the American Legion.

Private Beve McCormick was a volunteer from Eldorado when Company H was organized at San Angelo and later was transferred to Company M 23rd Regiment, he was killed in action on November 2, 1918, just nine days before the Armistice was signed. The body should reach Eldorado about the last of next week, it was the request of his mother that the body was brought back, but did not live to see it, she passed way March 25th 1921.

MRS. J. F CRAIG DEAD.

Eldorado was shocked early Friday morning when the sad news of the death of Mrs. J. F. Craig, wife of Jim Craig of Eldorado, came over the phone from San Angelo, where Mrs. Craig had been carried on Monday for medical treatment, she was taken to the St. Johns Sanitarium and her 13 year old daughter Floyd remained with her, Mr. Craig had returned to the ranch on Wednesday. He was notified Thursday night that his wife was not doing well and to return to San Angelo, he and his two sons Jones and Pat came in from the ranch early Friday morning to go to San Angelo when he received a second message that Mrs. Craig was dead, they were driven to San Angelo by Ben Hext.

The body was brought out Saturday afternoon accompanied by eight cars of relatives and friends, and carried to the Christian Church, where a short service was held conducted by Prof. W. I. Wilkins.

Many friends attended the funeral services, to pay their last respect to this beloved wife and mother.

Mrs. Florence Craig was 40 years old and was a Miss Gaines before her marriage to Jamet F. Craig, October 27, 1904, to this union three children were born, and with the husband mourn her loss. She moved to Schleicher County from McCulloch in 1905, and made this her home since, here she built up a circle of friends who bow in submission to the will of him who doeth all things well, and extend sympathy to the bereft in this their sad hour.

NINE WOUNDED IN KU KLUCK PARADE AT LORENA

Sheriff Bob Buchanan of McLennan County, was seriously wounded, together with eight other men, when the sheriff went to Lorena Friday night to stop a Ku Kluck Parade. The parade was previously announced, and as it came down main street the Sheriff tried to take the American Flag away from the man in the lead who was unmasked, the fight followed, three men received bullet wounds and the others received knife wounds, many of the Ku Klucks unmasked and disrobed on main street.

Sheriff Buchanan was rushed to a sanitarium at Waco, he was shot under the arm and an operation was necessary.
