# The Story of Our States



A name implies, West Virginia was originally a portion of Virginia, the

Colony. While its history is naturally yoked up with that of the Mother State, there are many points in which the two sections of Virginia were divergent and it was for this reason that West Virginia finally became a separate state.

The first white man who probably penetrated the wilderness of this Western region was John Laderer, a German surgeon, who went on a tour of exploration in 1669. In the same year, La Salle sailed up the Ohio and landed at several points in the present state. There was little colonization until 1732, when Scotch and Irish adventurers began to fill Western Virginia. They were encouraged but little, and, in fact, the King in 1783 declared that this part of the colony was Indian country and could not rightfully be settled. Colonization continued, however, and bitter warfare was waged against the Indians and the French who had come down from the North. In 1774 the battle of Pt. Pleasant was fought, which was one of

the bloodiest of Indian conflicts. The backwoodsmen who settled in the Western part of Virginia were entirely different types of men from the wealthy slave owners along the coast. Jealousies between the two sections arose and the Western countries felt great dissatisfaction at the way Virginia was governing them. marked point of disagreement was over the slavery question, and it was because of this that. when Virginia seceded from the Union in 1861, West Virginia took matters in its own hands. Delegates met at Wheeling, drew up a separate constitution, and declared their independence. Their application for admission into the Union was accepted by Lincoln, and in 1863 West Virginia became the thirty-fifth

Consular reports compiled show that more than thirty thousand people recently crossed the Rio Grands into Mexico from the United States upon the occasion of the celebration of the Centennial Exposition of that country. Those who have been follewing closely the commercial and industrial situation in Mexico believe that this is the indication of a development along these lines unprecesented in Mexico's history. Business ponditions in Mexico have more or less reflected similar conditions in the United States but during the past few months Mexico has been visited by some of the most important financiers in the world with the result that possibilities for an early recognition of that country have been growing brighter each month.

Adjustment of matters pertaining to oil holdings, the extension of long lines of credit by some of the most powerful commercial organizations in the world, the possiblity of an early payment of interest on national debt have all contributed to the advance of Mexican interests.

The United States has been offered an opportunity of developing a strong commercial field in Mexico and many manufacturers and exporters nave been taking advantage of the opportrade between the two countries amounted to \$388,045,272, of which Mexico bought from the United States \$207,854,197 and sold to the United States \$180,191,075. This has been increased during 1921 so that the total business between the two countries for the twelve months ending June 30, 1921, was \$422,202,520, of which Mexipo bought \$267,200,366 and sold \$154,\$98,154.

Mexico bought during these twelve months \$7581,133 worth of automobiles and parts; \$4,474.978 worth of ecomotives; \$941,418 worth of sewing machines; \$6,997,735 worth of umber for building; \$8,514,576 worth of flour; \$5,410,544 worth of cern and \$,887,428 pounds of barbed wire.
