JAMES M. COX IN SPEECH AT JACKSON DAY DINNER.

Dayton, Ohio, Jan. 25.—James M. Cox, defeated Democratic candidate for President in the last election and former Governor of Ohio, is back in political harness.

Furthermore, a speech delivered by Cox at a belated Jackson Day banquet here Wednesday night in which he attacked the Republican administration, is taken to indicate that the era in which Democratic leaders have refrained from comment or criticism of the Republican program is ended.

The congressional campaign may be said to have now been launched, and with the Democrats again taking the field under the Wilsonian principles, including the League of Nations.

"There can no more be American isolation in thought than in commerce," Cox declared in his speech.

Our faith in the official pronouncements of 1920 is unaffected by the result of the election of that year. We have not retreated a step. We are ready for the next fight. We stand in our tracks, just where we were when the votes were counted that year.

Several hundred leading Democrats attended the banquet including Joseph P. Tumulty, former secretary to President Wilson; Senator Pomerene and Senator Harrison.

Cox compared business conditions as they existed under the Wilson administration and under the administration of President Harding, and directed other shafts of criticism at the present arms conference in Washington, and Senator Lodge.

Cox is to take the stump in some of the eastern states for the Democratic principles.

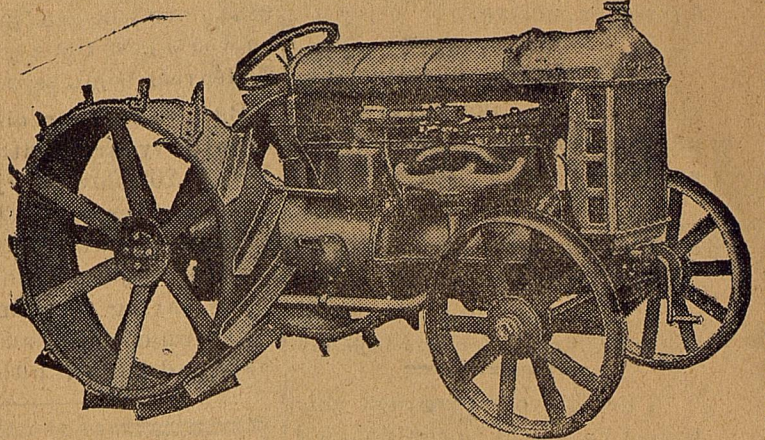

HIGH SCHOOL BALL GAME.

Last Saturday morning Ozona motored over to Eldorado for a basket ball game with our boys. Ozona has a team that last year held the championship of more than twenty west Texas counties and was checked only at Austin for a state championship. They have yet every man of the old team except one and have the additional reputation of another year of an undefeated record.

To put against them Eldorado has a young team full of vigor and aggressiveness, but with no record of victories won, and with only a part of a season of experience. With this tight team, except for one veteran player seventeen years old, outweighed many pounds to the man and outclassed in experience from three to four years, it looked like our boys had little chance to make even a creditable showing.

The game was called by Joe Williams of the First National Bank of Eldorado, and it was well-called, Mr. Williams being highly complimented by the visitors for his skill as an official. Unmarred by fouls and rough plays, but marked by stubborn fighting and displays of real skill, the game was hotly contested from start to finish.

In the first half, when Eldorado was expected to fight a defensive fight against a heavier veteran team, she surprised spectators and contestants by taking an aggressive and stubborn offense and keeping the ball well in Ozona's territory most of the time. The end of the half saw Ozona out-played, outclassed and beaten with her veteran team lost by the suddenness of the attack against them. With all her heavy men in line, beaten, with no reserve better than their line-up, the coach hurried to the breach by protesting against Eldorado's one-veteran player. Supt. Wilkins recognized the protest and took the player from the line-up. Score 6-4 in favor of Eldorado.

The second half showed a different line up for Eldorado, but inspired by their former winning, although with only a first year

The invaders went home carrying with them another well-learned victory, an added reputation for fairness and fighting spirit, but with the distinct knowledge that a team of first year men with the aid of one experienced player had out-classed them in every department of America's favorite high school game.

Ozona has a splendid team, worthy the support of an enthusiastic town. Her players are gentlemen, players who can reasonably hope to duplicate their last year's record in the state, and a team that it is a joy to meet in combat.

With the wonderful showing exhibited by our own boys last Saturday, Eldorado may well be content and may look forward next year to seeing a winning team developed at home.

Let us all pull for Eldorado all the time and in all places.

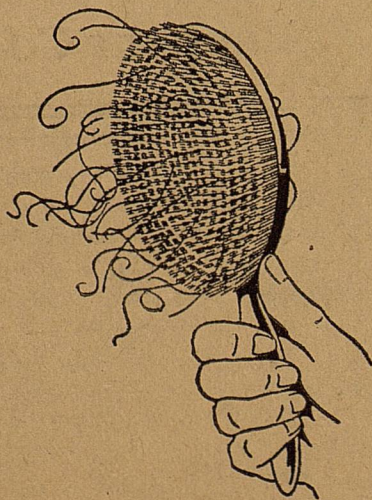

cord in the last election," he declared in his speech. "It would have thrilled civilization no less than our declaration of war against autocracy and militarism."

Discussing the present arms conference Cox declared that "no one will deny that if America were now in the League of Nations there would be no need of any agreement between the four powers in question."

He said the nation may drift into the League of Nations "under the existing regime, but our participation under such auspices would be half-hearted and our influence for good diminished in consequence."

He declared the administration has been swept by the currents of public opinion nearer each day to the seat of the League of Nations at Geneva.

Paying tribute to the former President, Cox said Wilsonian policies "were as unwavering as the stars that guide the pilgrims of the night" Those of the present administration as shifting as the wind tossed snow of the winter.

"The first essential thing to our prosperity is the formal recognition by our Government of the fundamental cause of depression. Since this would carry acceptance of the theories of Woodrow Wilson there is hope for the belated relief that will come from the pressure of public opinion."

"The ruins of war still mar the internal perspective. Indeed the wreckage grows with the days. Millions of lives are paying the toll of starvation overseas. Willing industry is without the aid of financial credits. Countries solvent if not rich in natural resources are in idleness and misery. The reaction, true to prophecy, is upon us and every community is affected. The echoing cry of 'America first' is a mockery of human intelligence as unhappy experience tells us that we are a part of the whole world. The savings of Democratic prosperity have been lost in the financial blight that fell upon the country.

"Farm products have diminished in price much below the labor cost of production; vast outputs of shop and mill have followed the downward trend until thousands of farmers and business concerns are hopelessly insolvent. Only the resiliency of our banking system has averted the most destructive panic in all history. But, notwithstanding the Federal Reserve structure has weathered the economic storm, the wreckage to individual and corporate enterprises will be recorded in the weekly reports of commercial agencies for months to come. They promise to surpass any aggregate of the past. Inventories have diminished in value, but debts remain the same. There can be but one final result to this situation.

"And how needless it all has been. When peace came Europe needed rebuilding. America had the supplies. Europe required credit America had a prosperity upon which credit could have been given. American gold advanced would scarcely have left our vaults because it would have been merely the base of financial transactions for the products of our farms and factories. Our vast surplus would have brought happiness to Europe and maintained prosperity at home. The distress in Russia is chargeable to the terrors of Sovietism; the distress in America to the treachery of Lodgeism."
