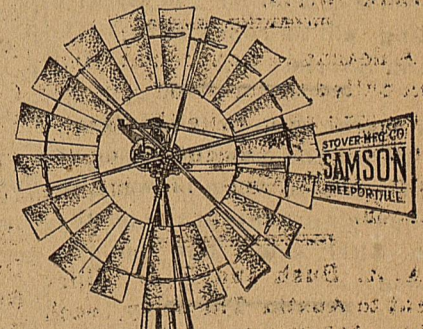

'We will stay forever.' This is the answer of the Dallas branch of the Ku Klux Klan to Mayor Sawnie Aldridge's suggestion that they disband, made at the conclusion of a meeting attended by 5,000 Klansmen in the coliseum of the Texas State Fair at Dallas Saturday night.

The Klansmen futher answered Mayer Aldredge's suggestion by initiating 1,125 candidates into the order Saturday night, and raising \$40,000 for Hope Cottage, a Dallas institution for poor babies which are now housed in a poorly constructed wooden building.

The Klan has invited representatives of the nonpartisan committee, the Catholic priest, along with other ministers of Dallas, to attend the next meeting of the Klan.

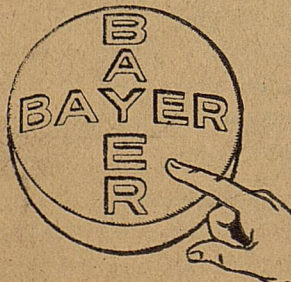
