Russell, Travis county humane officer, who has placed a ban on all goat roping contests or any other kind involving animals in which money prizes or championships are awarded for skill or in which the anti-cruelty phase of the state laws is violated. The officer has recently halted events where the contests were being held.

"I don't want to file any complaints against anybody," said officer Russell, "and I theretore issue the request that all those who have planned to stage goat roping contests call them off. It is against the state law, and I've got to stop any violations." — San Angelo Standard.

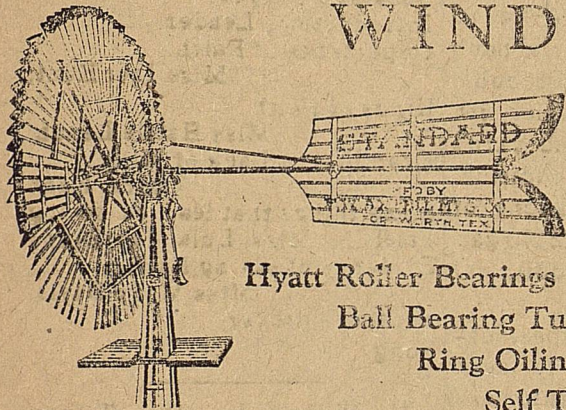

County Engineer, J. L. Neill, reports that Schleicher County has been granted around \$82,000.00 additional State and Federal Aid, and the Highway No 4 will be completed to the Tom Green County line, without any additional bond issue for Schleicher County.

LEE RIGHT DIES FROM

INJURIES.

Lee Right who got hurt while working at the Water Works Tuesday July 11, died Tuesday July 18, from blood poison, which set in in a small cut on the leg that physicians thought not to be serious, his hand that was almost ground off in the cog wheels of the machinery did well and gave no trouble.

Lee Right was born in Arkansas 28 years ago and moved to Schleicher County in 1904, where he has continually resided. When the call to arms came during the World War, Lee answered the call on October 8, 1917, offering no excuse to keep from going, although he was the support of his widowed mother. He served 28 months in the war being a member of Company 10 Field Artillery, was among those that saw actual service on the battle fields and entered Germany with the army of occupation, from which he was returned home at the close of the conflict and was given an honorable discharge.

After returning home he was married to Miss Maud Calcote, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. L. Calcote, and for the past few months has been working for J. A. Enochs. No one knew him but to honor him, he was honest and upright and when he met death face to face, he told those with him that his time had come and requested them to meet him in Heaven, he did not fear to die, but died with a prayer to God to spare him of his suffering.

The funeral services were held at the Baptist Church and conducted by Rev. Coleman the Pastor, Lee was not a member of any church but has lived a clean moral life.

The Pall Bearers, seven ex-service men, led by H. E. Marchison, followed by A. A. Bush, Wade Parks, H. W. Christman, Clyde Henderson, Jim Williams and Jim Hext.

After the church services the remains were followed by a large concourse of friends to the Silent City of the dead, there deposited in the earth to await the day when all the dead shall arise from the grave.

Three-Mill Tax for State Schools to be Proposed.

Austin.—Representative Roy C. Coffee of Wise County, one of the youngest members of the last Legislature, and who is a candidate for re-election without opposition, said he will advocate a constitutional amendment at the next session of the Legislature proposing a mill tax for the support of the public schools of the State. He believes that such a tax is the only solution of the school question and its adoption would forever remove the schools from politics.

Coffee said that a 3-mill tax would produce at least \$10,000,000 a year, which he believes would come very near supporting the schools. However, he is not committed to 3-mill and will support a higher tax should it be deemed expedient and necessary. He is now compiling a bulletin on this subject which will be ready shortly for distribution to members of the next Legislature, and which bulletin will also be used for debating purposes by the Interscholastic League.

New President of S. M. U.

Assumes His Duties.

Georgetown, June 29.—Dr. P. W. Horn, the newly elected president of the Southwestern University, arrived in Georgetown from Mexico City Tuesday and immediately assumed the duties of his new position. He is busily engaged in arranging the work of enlarging and repairs to be done on certain of the buildings of the institution in order to have same ready for use at the opening of the next regular term in September.

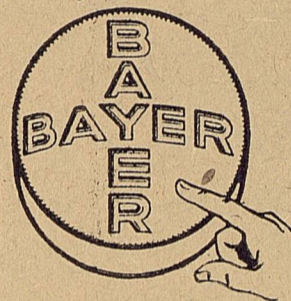
