

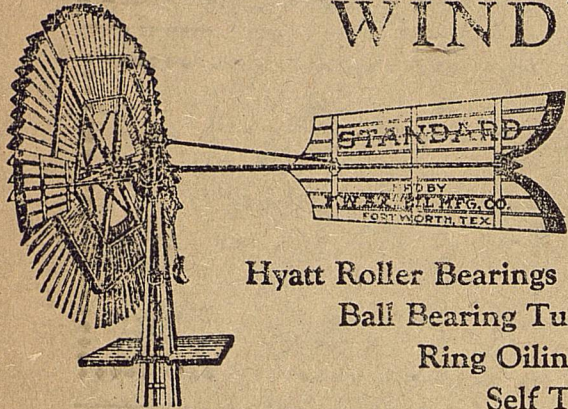

MISLNEANEOUS SHOWER.

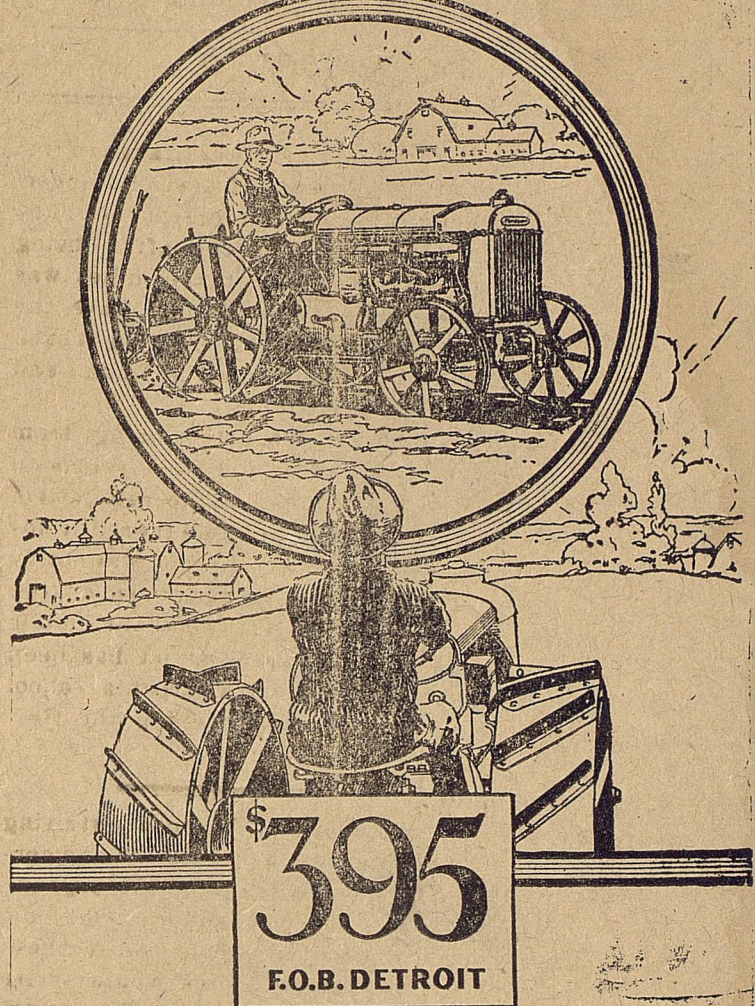

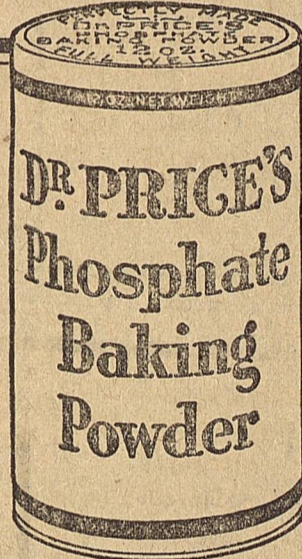

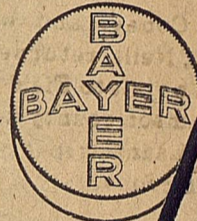
