

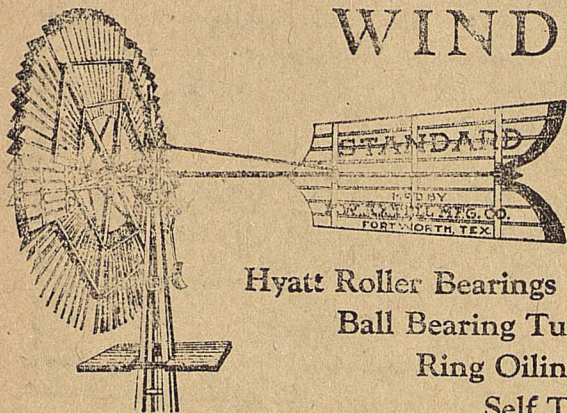

CONDITIONS JUSTIFY THIRTY CENT COTTON.

State Department of Agriculture. Sept. 8, 1922.

Geo. B. Terrell, Commissioner of Agriculture, reviews the cotton situation and urges bankers, merchants and farmers not force cotton upon the market, depressing the price and causing heavy losses to the producers.

He said: "I do not advise. I give facts and sensible men ought to reach sensible conclusions. The cotton crop this year, as estimated by the Government in the report of September 1st, indicates a yield of 10,575,000 bales.

The Texas crop is estimated at 3,644,000, I believe to be one million too high. The reports furnished my office from reliable men in all parts of the State indicate a crop of 2,462,400 as compared with a crop of 2,179,145 last year.

This crop is several million bales short of the world's needs, and every consideration justifies a price of thirty cents.

Nothing could not keep the price of cotton from going to 20 cents, if it were not dumped upon the market as fast as picked."

AGREEMENT.

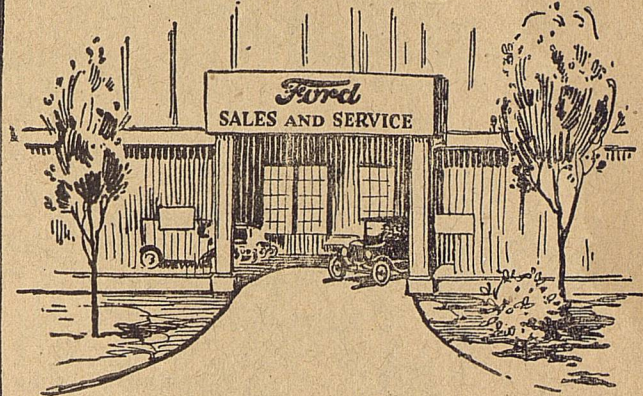

FARRINGTON-DOBBS.

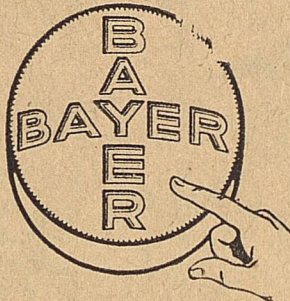

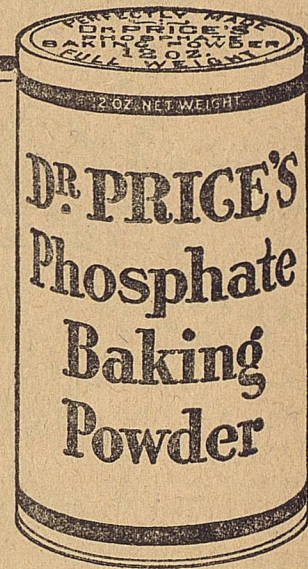
