





A. Whitten and to this union there were born four children of which two survives her, a daughter Mrs. M. A. Ray, N M. and Judge J. A. Whitten of our city, Her husband died in 1868, ten years after their marriage and left her with four childern to battle through life with, and with God assistance she reached the goal. In 1889 her son J. A. Whitten was married and with him she has lived every since. After a long, busy and useful life she died as he had lived-honored, trusted and loved. She rear ed her own monument while she lived in the hearts of all who begining to its close, and through all the vicissitude and sorrows that she met in the way, her faith in God never wavered, But she has left us and today the flowers grows around another grave that ludes from our sight all that is mortal if a true and noble, wonan. Funeral services were held at the Baptist church at 3 o'clock Saturday by Rev. J. M. Earls. Her remains were followed to the city cemetary by her many friends and was a large prossession. 


