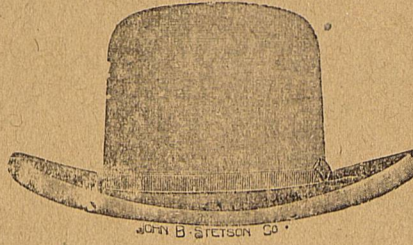

**Educate Your Children**

No argument is needed to impress upon every farmer the fact that the best and most valuable crop on any farm are the little boys and girls who make happy the firesides of every father and mother. The man who through indifference or unpardonable neglect failed to give his children the full advantage of all the school opportunities offered in his neighborhood last year, should resolve to do better by his little one in 1908. The proper education of the boys and girls on the farm is a sacred duty which all parents owe to their children. It is not a question to be argued nor one that any parent can defend. If any crop must suffer by neglect, let it be a field crop and not the crop of the fireside. The sordid selfishness which puts the value of a dollar above these priceless little jewels can only be actuated by an almost criminal disregard for the future of the child or the future of the community, county, state or country. Ignorance is the most damaging of all legacies that a parent could bequeath to a child, while a proper education is the most valuable. No child can now enter the domain of manhood or womanhood and meet the competition of life in the 20th century with any hope to carve success in material development unless he or she is fortified and equipped with a brain educated and trained to do things well. We stress this important feature of our home life on the farm because it is the most important of all else and because in many sections of the rural district it is most neglected.

The man who in 1907, gave his labor, and that of his wife and children to provide comforts and luxuries for those who sat in easy places and enjoyed the profits from the products of his labor, should resolve to bring about a change in those things in 1908. Endeavor to so manage the affairs of the farm that the home can be improved and beautified and made more attractive. Endeavor to furnish for the pleasure and enjoyment of the wife and children more of the comforts and luxuries of this life. The noble and self-sacrificing devotion of the farmer's wife to duty is entitled to more consideration and appreciation at the hands of her husband than she usually receives. She does more as a general rule and gets less than any other human being on earth. If the home is made more attractive to the boys and girls there will be a fewer number of them turning their backs on the farm and migrating each year to the town and cities. Attract the young people to the farms by broadening their opportunities for pleasure and profit rather than away from the farms. The only immigrants we need on southern farms are the boys and girls that are born to the present type of the Anglo Saxon race who now own and work the farms of the south. Remember that individual strength is necessary to collective strength in fighting the battles of the future. Cotton Journal.

**Schleicher Co.**

Sells School Land for \$115,128.00.

On Wednesday March 25, 1908, the commissioners met in call meeting, for the purpose of hearing the report of E. M. Barbee on the Schleicher county School Land, which lies in Gains county, the commissioner proceeded to sell the land, after some speeches made by out side men were heard the court went to receiving bids, the bids were put in open and with a privilege of raising same if wanted to by the bidder. W. L. Says of Commanche, put first bid at \$5 per acre at 05 per cent interest. J. B. Murrah of San Angelo put in second bid at \$5.65 per acre at 04 per cent, Bob Evans Sweatt and Beavers then bid \$5.75 at 05 per cent, the court then stopped the bidding until about 2 p. m. when they opened up for new bids, and none to be accepted unless it bore 05 per cent interest. W. L. Says then bid \$6.50 with \$2,500 down and the remaining \$3,256.40 to be paid in July. Evans, Sweatt and Beavers then bid \$6.60 per acre at 05 percent, \$1,900 down now and the remaining \$3,856.40 to be paid before the first of October but agreed to give bond for same. This closed the bidding and the court sold the land to W. L. Says of Commanche, considering his bid the best. This track of land contains 17,712 acres of land and sold for \$6.50 per acre which makes a permanent school fund for Schleicher of \$115,128.00

this land was sold on 40 years time at 05 per cent per annum and brings in annually to the school fund \$5,756.40, this will give Schleicher county plenty of school money to run its school for the next 15 years with out taxing the people, we believe this to be a very good sale but we are of the opinion that had this land been advertised for 60 days it probably would have brought a larger price. We can truthfully say that we think the proper way to sell anything is to advertise it well, but the land was sold with out advertising and brought a very good price.


