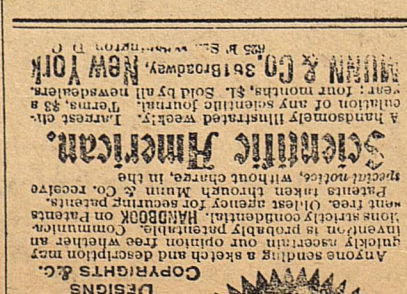

**VERMONT LOCALS.**

Hon. C. R. Metcalf's speech at Galveston before the Crushers Association was one of the most remarkable speeches I ever read. Mr. Metcalf was invited by the oil men to address them on what he thought would be the best method for farmers and oil men to get to a better understanding. Mr. Metcalf has the distinction of being the first real farmer to be asked by the big oil men to tell them how they should treat the farmers which he did in unmistakable words, he pointed out that they did not buy seed from the farmers but had their agents to buy and paid them one dollar per ton, he also pointed out that they could be of great benefit to farmers by exchanging the mill products for seed, as in feeding cotton seed the oil was a total loss, and farmers would be to willing to exchange their seed for the products of their mills. The actions of the oil men in making an effort to assist the farmers (who are the real life of their business) goes a long way to show what I have often thought—that the time was at hand when the farmers would no longer be relegated to the back ground, but would be brought forwards to take their place in all the prominent business enterprises in the United States. This also shows that the men who really manufacture products out of what we produce to end us a helping hand and in so doing it will destroy this "middle" mans business and as he is no better than we who labor on the farm, we will welcome him to come, to the County and become a producer, most any close observer has certainly noticed the difference in the last few years the old epithets such as grangers and hay seeds has seen its day and we are now looked upon as producers, we are anxiously awaiting the day when "stock gambling" and wall street" will be treated as a felony and that class of sharks will have been sent to the penitentiary, or driven out of the country, they have been a menace to all classes of producers, but especially hard on the farmers as they sold our cotton and grain before it was made. Such meetings as was held at Galveston was here—closed behind closed doors, they did not care for the farmers to know anything about their mode of business

Crops conditions continue good, there was two good rains last week cotton is very fine and maize and cane good—though the heavy rains have blasted some maize, Caffir Corn seems to stand the heavy rains better than maize, but the maize disounts it in dry weather, we should experient more in our county is new and we do not know what will do best yet Ben Hur will make an effort to get small packages of seed from the experiment stations, they are making quite an extended experiment with many new forage plants. (A side from cotton and maize.)

Ed Ratliff and Willie Whitten were gathering cattle this week in the Vermont, Mr. Ratliff sold to Raue of the San Saba draw 125 ewes at \$2.75 per head.

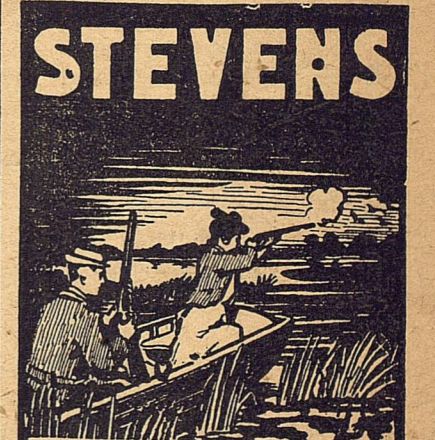
