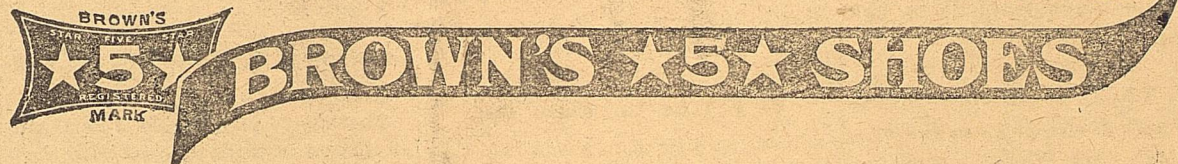

Dear Sir:

I was very sorry that I was not in the office the day that you called and could not confer with you in person about the record for the issuance of bonds by this district.

As I construe the opinion of the Supreme Court in the Baird case, until that opinion has been set aside, or some other means devised by which independent school districts should levy a tax rate, I am of the opinion that independent school districts have no power to levy any tax rate for any purpose.

However, there is a motion for rehearing pending in the Supreme Court in the Baird case and we have advised all independent school districts to take no further action until the motion for rehearing has been passed upon by the court in that case.

You will understand that there are only two acts of the Legislature authorizing tax rates in independent school districts. One Act authorizes a 25 cent tax rate for bonds purposes. The other authorizes a 50 cent tax rate for maintenance purposes. The effect of the Supreme Court's decision is to hold both of these legislative acts unconstitutional. If these acts are each unconstitutional, and they are the only acts authorizing tax rates in independent school districts, then there is no act of the Legislature authorizing a 20 cent tax rate, and until the Legislature authorizes such tax rate independent school districts have no taxing power whatever.

I am therefore compelled to reject your bond record, but will retain same in the office until the Supreme Court has passed upon the motion for rehearing and I will advise you of the action of the court on that motion.

COTTON GIN FOR SONORA.

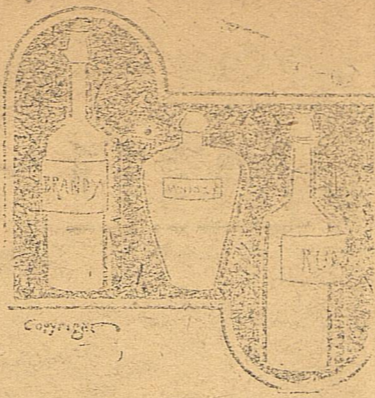
