**ENDORSEMENTS OF THE PENDING CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.**

"The Democratic party believes that ignorance is a misfortune and that education is a blessing, and we, therefore, favor a wise and liberal financial support of our public schools and all our State educational institutions.

We favor the adoption of the pending amendment to Section 3, Article VII, State Constitution, relating to public free schools and commend the support of said amendment to the voters of Texas.

"We favor the adoption by the people of the amendment to Section 3, Article 7, of the State Constitution relating to free schools.

This amendment, if adopted, will give the people of the country districts the right by law to provide for the erection and equipment of good schoolhouses, for the lengthening of the school term where practicable, and for the employment of better qualified and more capable teachers.

The Texas Farmers' Congress urge every patriotic farmer in Texas and all other citizens to work for and vote for this amendment."

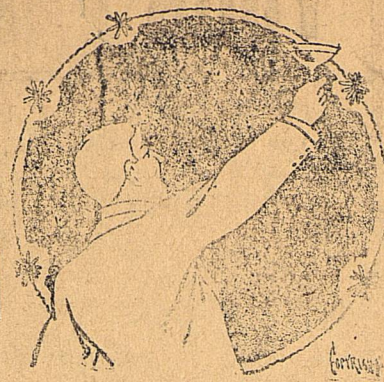

Dear Sir: Ten years ago, there was one pure paint and 200 adulterated; there are now eight pure, 200 adulterated, about half of the latter short-measure besides.

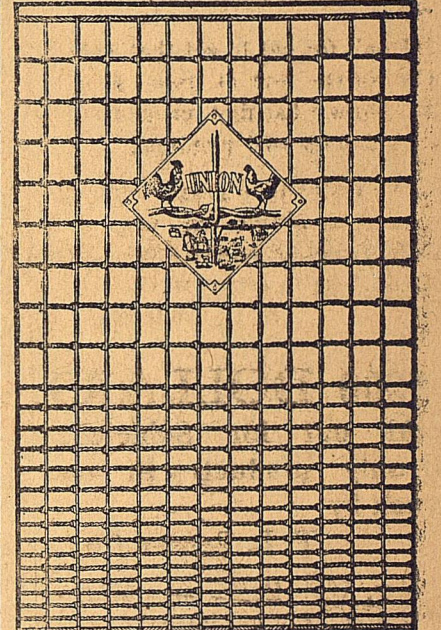
